Overall Purpose of Job: (Narrative)

Responsible for the coaching and development of players in the Aberdeen Women's squad, reflecting the coaching philosophy of Aberdeen Football Club.

Main Responsibilities/Description of Duties: (Bullet Points)

- Provide a high standard of coaching to the playing squad, educating them in the Aberdeen FC playing style through the coaching curriculum.
- To plan, prepare and deliver 2 training sessions per week.
- To prepare and deliver individual training programmes.
- To coach at a weekly weekend SWPL 2 fixture
- To ensure that all players adhere the Players Code of Conduct and show a high level of respect and discipline.
- To adhere to the Coaches Code of Conduct.
- To complete two progress reports on Sports Office at the mid stage and end of the season.
- Attend at least one player review session per season for each individual player in the squad.
- To be available to provide feedback to players throughout the season regarding their performance.
- To be aware of and comply with the Aberdeen Football Club Social Media Policy.
- To complete coaching content and match statistics on to Sports Office on a weekly basis throughout the season.
- To develop and maintain a professional relationship with the parents of minor players in the squad.
- To lead an assistant coach and GK coach in the delivery of a structured training programme to develop players within the Women's Squad.
- Complete CPD (Continuous Professional Development) to maintain coaching qualifications.
- To attend coach in service days as instructed by Head of Academy Coaching.
- To develop the players in a healthy lifestyle, diet, drug awareness, education.
- To take the necessary action if they have reasonable cause to suspect or believe a young
 person is being abused and to follow the guidelines in the Child Protection Policy to ensure
 all reasonable steps have been taken to minimise risk.
- To attend Sports First Aid or Child Protection courses as required.
- To assist with sport science input where required at training sessions.
- To attend tournaments and trips when requested by the club.
- To represent Aberdeen FC on the Aberdeen FC Ladies committee and act as a liaison between Aberdeen FC and Aberdeen FC Ladies.
