

## **STAGE ONE – GLASGOW TO KIRKCUDBRIGHT**

SATURDAY 7 SEPTEMBER

Coming to Kirkcudbright for the OVO Energy Tour of Britain stage finish on Saturday 7 September?

Please consider the following information when planning your journey ahead of race day.

### **ACCESSIBILITY**

**FREE PARK AND RIDE SERVICE:** An extensive car park will be in operation at the entrance of the town on the A711. Car parking will be free; shuttle buses will take spectators the one mile into town. The park and ride scheme will run from 09:30 to 17:30; we ask that race fans seeking to watch the stage from along the route before heading to the finish to arrive as early as possible.

**RAIL:** Buses are Kirkcudbright's only available form of public transport. The nearest railway stations are at Dumfries, Lockerbie and Carlisle.

**BUS:** Stagecoach services 431, 501, 502, 505 and 517 serve Kirkcudbright – routes will be diverted on race day owing to the finish location.

**BIKE:** Kirkcudbright Tennis Club (St. Mary Street Kirkcudbright, DG6 4AA) will be transformed into a secure bike park from 10am to 5pm on the day.

**ROAD:** Kirkcudbright is a short drive from the A75, which links to the M6 near Gretna. However, extensive road closures will be in place on Saturday 7 September – please use the park and ride operation that will be running from the outskirts of Kirkcudbright.

### **TOUR VILLAGE**

Don't forget to visit the Tour Village in St Cuthbert Street, offering fans a big screen showing full live coverage of the stage, plus exhibits from race partners.
