

# FISA 125th Anniversary

**This year marks the 125th anniversary of FISA, the World Rowing Federation.**

Jean-Christophe Rolland, FISA President, Olympic Champion rower, avid indoor rower and one of the youngest sports federation presidents.

Originally known as Federation Internationale des Societies d’Aviron, FISA was the first international sports federation. It was created in 1892, inspired by the growth of rowing that was occurring in the second half of the 19th century.

Led by the Belgian rowing federation, there was the conviction that a uniform set of rules were needed for the sport. At that stage the rules of racing varied from club to club, race distances and the type of racing varied, rowers could use any type of boat and betting was rife.

The first European Rowing Championships were staged in 1893 and rules regulating the sport of rowing began to be established. Now, 125 years later, rowing remains one of the most important Olympic sports with wide appeal. Rowing has transformed the lives of countless individuals from all five continents far transcending the sport itself. The words are true, ‘Rowing is for life.’

What has FISA done?

- Worldwide growth of member nations from five to 151.
- Made 2000m the standard distance.
- A straight buoyed course is now the norm.
- Rowing equipment and boats follow a standard for all.
- International rowing events are held every year including the World Rowing Cup series and World Championships for seniors, under-23s and juniors. There is also the World Rowing Masters Regatta, World Rowing Coastal Championships and World Rowing Tour.
- Led the way in anti-doping measures with out-of-competition testing, no needles policy and Athlete commitment form.
- Put the athlete first and at the centre of every decision. This has included pre-competition health screening.
- Established a powerful set of values in the world of sport – teamwork, fairness, enduring, inclusive and natural.
- Integrated with para-rowing, masters, indoor, coastal and age-group rowing.
- Actively joined the movement for Clean Water and partnered with WWF.

# 1 General

## 1.1 Introduction

Welcome to the 2017 World Rowing Championships. World Rowing is delighted to return to the United States for this, the climax of the international rowing season. These championships have been highly anticipated as it has been 23 years since the World Championships were last held in the United States and the ongoing growth of the sport in the nation will benefit from these championships.

The newly developed venue at Sarasota-Bradenton is purpose-designed for water sports with the rowing regatta course built to meet FISA racing standards. Nathan Benderson Park began hosting regattas in 2009 and recently finished the construction of a state-of-the-art finish tower. In addition to its world-class facilities, the site features multiple warm-up and cool-down lanes as well as an exclusive cycling path for coaches. It is also equipped with a floating wave attenuator platform that doubles up as a dedicated TV lane for broadcast requirements.

Great Britain come to these championships as the overall winners of the 2017 World Rowing Cup series. The British rowing team competed at all three stages, earning the highest number of points overall (134) as well as in two individual events – the men's four (22 points) and the men's quadruple sculls (19 points).

New Zealand raced at two World Rowing Cup regattas out of three and finished in second position in the overall 2017 World Rowing Cup standings, behind Great Britain, with a total of 108 points. The Kiwi rowing team excelled in four events, accumulating the highest number of points in the women's pair (16), women's double sculls (16), men's double sculls (16) and women's eight (14). Additionally their new single sculler, Robert Manson won two World Cup gold medals this season.

Poland has also had a successful season, leading two events in terms of number of World Cup points won – 20 points in the lightweight women's double sculls and 24 points in the women's quadruple sculls – while France tops the individual event standings in the men's pair with 13 points and in the lightweight men's double sculls with 16 points.

Three new World Best Times have been set so far this season; two of them by New Zealand - one in the women's pair and the other in the men's single sculls. Germany also set the new standard in the men's eight. All three times were established at World Rowing Cup II in Poznan, Poland.

This media guide has been designed to bring as much of the essential information as possible together in one useful place. It includes background information to help you find your way around our sport including diagrams to explain how rowing works. You will also find detailed statistical information on the current season, past results, a 'Who to watch' preview of each boat class as well as short bios on a selection of our top athletes.

## 1.2 What is FISA?

The World Rowing Federation, FISA (from the French, Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d’Aviron), is the governing body of the sport of rowing. It is empowered by its 151 member National Rowing Federations, the National Olympic Committees and the International Olympic Committee to govern the sport of rowing.

FISA sets the rules and regulations for the practice of the sport in all its forms (elite, para-rowing, coastal, masters and some aspects of indoor). It organises sanctioned World Rowing events including those for junior and under-23s. It provides advice and expertise for the organisation of rowing regattas, coaching education, rowing development and other matters relating to the sport and its development.

This year marks the 125th anniversary of FISA. It was founded by representatives from Belgium, France, Italy, Switzerland and Adriatica (now a part of Italy) in Turin, Italy on 25 June 1892. It is the oldest international sports federation in the Olympic movement. FISA established its first headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1922 and, after moving away, it returned to its roots in February 1996.

### FISA’s goals and objectives

The goals and objectives of FISA are to efficiently develop, promote, present, govern and protect the environment through the sport of rowing.

### FISA’s vision

To encourage the development of the sport of rowing and strengthen the bonds that unite those who practice it.

### FISA’s mission

To make rowing a universally practiced and globally relevant sport. To spread the sport in all its forms.

### Core values

#### Core Values of the sport of rowing

Teamwork:	Rowers work together towards a common goal
Fairness:	In a spirit of fair play rowers learn self-discipline, the need for commitment and respect for their opponents.
Enduring:	Rowers pass on time-honoured values and shared experiences from past to future generations.
Inclusive:	Rowers combine into a single and cooperative community, irrespective of race, gender, creed, age or ability.
Natural:	Rowers respect and safeguard the water and its surroundings.

#### Core values of FISA

Oldest:	FISA is the oldest international sport federation, created in 1892. Rowing has been on the Olympic programme from the beginning in 1896.
Global:	FISA has 151 member federations in all five continents.
Influential:	FISA has key representatives in leadership positions in many international sports organisations and governing bodies.
Ethical:	FISA is a leading federation in the fight against doping, was the first to conduct out-of-competition testing and leads in protecting the health of athletes.
Environmental:	Rowers respect and safeguard the water and its surroundings

## FISA's environmental policy

Care of the environment is an integral part of rowing's core values, and shapes FISA's strategy in all areas of its activities.

FISA is committed to practices that respect and safeguard the environment in which the sport of rowing is conducted. FISA endorses responsible and sustainable environmental practices in the planning and staging of events, the design and construction of new rowing facilities and the refurbishment of existing rowing facilities. FISA promotes awareness and community consultation on rowing-related environmental issues.

FISA's Environmental Policy is based on seven principles. These cover:

- 1 Habitat protection
- 2 Resource conservation
- 3 Waste and pollution reduction
- 4 Heritage and indigenous culture recognition
- 5 Healthy conditions for all associated with rowing
- 6 Environmental awareness and education
- 7 Consultation with wider community

FISA is actively developing new strategies to fully engage itself in the promotion of clean water and the protection of the environment.

## FISA at events

Below is a summary of FISA activities during international events:

- The Umpiring Commission, chaired by Patrick Rombaut (Belgium), supervises and advises the Jury.
- The Events Commission, chaired by Mike Tanner (Hong Kong China), oversees the preparation, technical aspects and running of the regatta.
- The Competitive Commission, chaired by Rosie Mayglothling (Great Britain), is in charge of competition regulation such as the fairness committee and coach support.
- The Sports Medicine Commission, chaired by Juergen Steinacker (Germany), oversees all medical aspects of the competition, including anti-doping.
- FISA's Executive Director Matt Smith (USA/Switzerland) represents the Executive Committee in overseeing the operation of the event.



# 2 Rowing

## 2.1 About rowing

### The origin of rowing

The boat was mankind's most significant mode of transport for centuries and the oar is considered to be the most important invention before the wheel. The first representation of a rowing boat was discovered in Finland and dates back to 5800 BC. The earliest regatta was held on 16 September 1274 in Venice, Italy, where regattas developed as challenges between gondoliers and boatmen in a variety of rowing boats. Rowing has evolved all over the world wherever people and water mix. The origin of the sport of rowing as we know it today comes from England, where the world-renowned Oxford versus Cambridge University Boat Race was first held in 1829 on the River Thames.

### Rowing at the World Rowing Championships

The first World Rowing Championships was staged in Lucerne, Switzerland in 1962. Initially held every four years, the championships soon became an annual event. At the 2015 World Rowing Championships, 77 nations raced with a total of 1300 athletes. In 2016, being an Olympic year, the World Rowing Championships included only non-Olympic boat classes and was combined with the junior and under-23 championships with 1800 athletes competing.

Female boat classes were included on the World Championship programme in 1974, with lightweight categories for both men and women featuring annually from 1985. Para-rowing was integrated into the World Rowing Championships programme in 2002. Originally raced over 1000m, in 2017 the length of racing changed to 2000m.

In non-Olympic years, both Olympic and international boat classes compete at the World Rowing Championships, while in Olympic years only international (non-Olympic) boat classes take part.

### Rowing at the Olympic & Paralympic rowing regattas

Rowing became an Olympic sport in 1896, at the first Olympic Games of the modern era held in Athens, Greece. Rough seas in the Piraeus harbour, however, forced the event to be cancelled which is why rowing won its first Olympic medals four years later in Paris. Women's events were added to the Olympic programme in 1976 and lightweight events in 1996. Para-rowing first appeared at the Paralympic Games in 2008.

### The boats

Boats, or shells, were traditionally made from wood. Top level boats are now fabricated from composite materials such as carbon fibre and kevlar. The width of boats varies from approximately 30cm for a single scull and up to 65cm for an eight. Lengths of the different boat types are shown in the diagrams on p13. A small fin is fitted beneath the boat for directional stability. A rudder is attached to the fin or the stern for steering (except on most sculling boats). A white ball (bow ball) is attached to the bow for safety as well as for judging precision of the start and finish of races. A splashboard prevents waves from splashing water aboard. Seats are fitted with wheels which roll on runners or tracks.

### The oars

Oars are hollow to reduce weight, attached to the boat by adjustable outriggers. The size and shape of oars is unrestricted, the average length of a sweep oar is 3.70m and of a scull 2.85m.

## 2.2 Glossary of rowing terms

Blade	Flattened or spoon-shaped end of oar or scull; sometimes used as term for oar
Bow	1 Forward end of boat, in terms of the direction the boat is moving in. 2 The rower in the seat nearest the bow
Bow ball	Safety ball fitted to the bow end of racing boat
Boat class	The rowing event pertaining to the type of boat and gender eg men's single scull
Bow side/starboard side	The right hand side of the boat when viewed from the stern
Catch	The part of the stroke when the blade is put in the water
Coxswain/Cox	Person who steers the boat usually from a seat in the stern
Crab	Occurs when rower fails to get the oar out of the water at the end of the stroke, causing the oar to get caught in the water: "catching a crab"
Drive	The part of the stroke between the catch and the finish, when the oar is in the water
Feather	To turn the blade parallel with the water surface at the start of the recovery to reduce wind resistance
Finish/Release	The part of the stroke when the blade is taken out of the water
Layback	The amount of backward lean of the rower's upper body towards the bow at the finish of the stroke
Length	The length of a boat ("They won by one length")
Recovery	The part of the stroke cycle between the finish and the catch in which the blade is feathered and out of the water
Regatta	A competitive event raced in boats
Sculling	Rowing when each person rows with two oars

Slide	1 The parallel rails on which the boat seats move 2 The action of the boat seat with wheels on parallel rails
Square	When the blade is perpendicular to the water
Stern	The back end of the boat in terms of the direction in which the boat is moving
Stroke	1 The complete cycle of the oar going from the catch back to the catch. 2 The rower seated nearest to the stern of the boat
Stroke rate	The number of strokes per minute that a crew is rowing, as in the number of times a blade goes in the water each minute
Stroke side/Port side	The left-hand side of the boat when viewed from the stern
Sweep rowing	Rowing when each person rows with one oar

## 2.3 Boat classes

Rowing boat classes are either sculling or sweep events. In sculling (denoted by an 'x'), each rower has two oars whereas in sweep rowing (denoted by a '-' for boats without coxswains and '+' for coxed boats) each person in the boat has one oar.



## 2.4 How to row

### 1 Entry/Catch

- Raise only the hands
- Do not “open” the body




### 6 Finish/Release

- Work is done exclusively by the legs





### 7 Recovery No.1

- The body starts to “uncoil” in a natural way




### 8 Recovery No.2

- The arms begin their work




### 9 Recovery No.3

### About Sarasota-Bradenton

Situated on Florida's West Coast, just one hour south of Tampa in Sarasota, Florida, Nathan Benderson Park is a community park providing public access to a picturesque lake.

Nathan Benderson Park was built to FISA racing standards and has 8m x 13.5m lanes. The race course specifications include 2,180m in length, 630m in width and an average 6m in depth. In addition to the race course the lake has multiple 1,500m warm-up and cool down lanes.

Nathan Benderson Park lake was created from a man-made borrow pit. The 161.8 hectares lake was previously used for mining sand and shell. Since then, the open pit was filled by the Cooper Creek drainage basin and the underground aquifer system.

The completed venue consists of a state-of-the-art floating wave attenuator platform that doubles as a dedicated TV lane for broadcast requirements and a 3m wide paved coaches cycle path.

### Currency

The official currency is the United States Dollar (USD).

Activities in the United States while on a media (I) visa must be for a media organisation having its home office in a foreign country. Activities in the United States must be informational in nature and generally associated with the news gathering process and reporting on current events.

## 3.4 World Rowing Championships competition description

### The regatta

Races in Olympic, International and para-rowing boat classes are contested over 2000m. Depending on the number of entries in each boat class, there will be heats, repechages, quarterfinals, semifinals and finals. A and B finals will be contested in all events with eight or more entries. Where 14 or more crews are entered, C, D, E etc. finals will be contested. Each boat is drawn into a first-round race (the heat) with progression to further rounds depending on placings and the number of entries in accordance with the FISA progression system.

Rowing follows a unique format in that crews have the benefit of a second chance if they are not successful in their first round heat. The repechage is the name for the second round of competition which ensures that every crew has a second chance to advance from the preliminary races to the next round.

Round 1:	Heats – after the initial round of heats, every unsuccessful crew has a second chance to advance in the repechages round.
Round 2:	Repechages – second chance to advance.
Round 3:	Quarterfinals (only if an event has 25 or more boats competing).
Round 4:	Semifinals (only for events with 13 or more boats competing).
Round 5:	Finals – A, B, C, D... Finals (In principle, there are no more than six boats per final. The top six boats in the qualification rounds compete in the A-final, the following six in the B-final, etc. Only the rowers who finish in the top three places of the A-final win a medal.)

**Note:** The rounds to which crews advance after each race and the number of crews advancing depends on the number of boats entered in each event as defined in the FISA progression system and is shown on the start lists and result lists. A full description of the progression system can be found in Appendix 6 of the FISA Rules of Racing.

### Lanes

There are normally eight buoyed lanes, of which six are used at one time for racing. Each lane is 13.5m wide. A draw is conducted before the beginning of racing to determine the allocation of crews to heats and to lane positions within each heat. A seeding panel determines in advance which crews will be seeded. The purpose of seeding is to avoid having all the faster boats in a boat class being drawn into the same heat in the first round.

### Competition schedule contingency plan

As for any outdoor sporting event, it is possible that the competition schedule may be disrupted due to adverse weather conditions. The FISA Rules allow for the implementation of certain contingency plans in order to ensure that the competition can be completed within the available days.

FISA has identified a number of contingency plans or options that can be implemented, depending on the severity of the conditions and the threatened disruption to the competition schedule. These include:

- Changing the start times of the races and/or the intervals between races.
- Combining different groups on the same day.
- Combining two rounds in the same day.
- Combining finals on three days, two days or all on one day.
- Time trials.

### Dead-heat rules and procedures

If there is a dead-heat between crews, there are several options to resolve it depending on the round of the competition. In many cases, the tie is resolved by having the relevant crews row a 2000m race again in order to find a winner. If, in a final, there is a dead-heat both crews will be given equal placing and the next placing left vacant with no re-row. If the tied placing is for a medal position, additional medals will be awarded.

### **Crew changes**

Up to half of the rowers in all crews entered may be substituted at least one hour before the first heat of the boat class. A crew which has already raced in the heat of its boat class may not make changes in the crew, except in the case of a serious illness or injury. A single sculler who entered and falls ill or is injured may be replaced before their heat. No substitution may be made for a single sculler after their first heat.

### **Penalties / disqualification rules / exclusion**

The Board of the Jury may impose the following penalties: reprimand, yellow card (applying to the next round in which the crew competes), exclusion (from all the rounds of the event in question), relegation where this is specifically provided in the Rules (to last place in its race of that round), disqualification (from all boat classes in the regatta), or any other appropriate measure in order to assure the fairness of the competition. A crew arriving at the start after the start time or causing two false starts will be excluded. A yellow card is equivalent to one false start. Crews interfering with opponents during the race may be excluded by the umpire.

### 3.5 Rowing in the United States

There is little doubt that the United States women's eight has become the symbol of rowing in the US. Undefeated at the Olympic and World Championship level from 2006, their winning streak includes eight World Rowing Championship gold medals and three Olympic gold medals. Eleanor Logan, one of its star athletes, was in the boat for all three Olympics, becoming the only female US rower to win three consecutive Olympic titles.

The strength of the United States female rowing team in recent history can largely be traced back to the inclusion of women's rowing into the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in 1997. At that time, there were 98 female collegiate teams across the country, involving 5,000 female athletes. As of 2016, those numbers had nearly doubled.

Thanks to NCAA funding, the amount of participation as well as the quality of female rowing has increased nationwide, providing a consistent source of high-performing female athletes for the national rowing team.

Men's university rowing in the US is marked by its long history. The first inter-collegiate rowing race was held in 1852 when Yale University challenged Harvard University to a rowing race, making rowing the oldest inter-collegiate sport in the United States. The strength of male university rowing is at the club level and has expanded considerably over the past years.

While 20 per cent of rowers in the United States are active at the collegiate level, 75 per cent of the US rowing community belong to the masters rowing community (aged from 21 to 80 years and older). The largest regatta ever hosted by US Rowing was the 2016 Masters National Championships which included over 2,150 participants from 166 clubs.

In addition to the Masters National Championships, US Rowing hosts three Regional Championships annually: Northwest, Southwest and Northeast/Mid-Atlantic.

Historically, the United States has earned the second-highest number of Olympic medals overall in the sport of rowing, behind Germany – a total of 87. In terms of Olympic gold medals won, the United States is also listed in second position, with 32 gold medals.

Up until the Rio 2016 Olympics, the United States' most successful Olympic rowers were John Kelly Sr and Paul Costello who both claimed three Olympic gold medals in the 1920s. Two of those Olympic titles were won together as a combination in the men's double sculls at the 1920 Games and at the 1924 Games. John Kelly, father of the late Princess Grace of Monaco, raced in two events at the 1920 Olympics, adding a third Olympic title in the men's single sculls to his collection.

Paul Costello, on the other hand, became the first rower to win the Olympic title in the same event at three consecutive Olympic Games when he raced to another gold medal in the men's double sculls at the 1928 Games, this time with Charles McIlvaine Sr.

The United States Rowing Federation was founded in 1982, when the National Association of Amateur Oarsmen, established in 1872, merged with the National Women's Rowing Association. Its corporate headquarters are based in Princeton, New Jersey, where the USRowing National Team Training Center is also located. In addition to selecting and training the US Rowing Team, the federation also educates referees and coaches.

US Rowing can look forward to its future thanks to an upcoming generation of elite rowers. In 2016, about 40,000 of its members were junior rowers aged 18 and under. "The rowing community continues to expand as juniors, the largest contingent of US Rowing members, lead the way," states the federation.

# 4 Athletes

## 4.1 Who to watch at the 2017 World Rowing Championships

### Women's pair (W2-)

New Zealand (Grace Prendergast and Kerri Gowler) won the two World Rowing Cups they entered this season and dominated at the Henley Royal Regatta. They also set a new World Best Time of 6:49.08. They will be the crew to beat.

The United States' Megan Kalmoe and Tracy Eisser, however, will have the home advantage. They won silver at both regattas that they competed at this season, in Poznan at World Rowing Cup II and in Lucerne at World Rowing Cup III. Romania also medalled this season. Madalina Beres and Laura Oprea won the European Rowing Championships where they doubled up to also win European gold in the women's eight. They will aim to repeat this double-header in Sarasota-Bradenton.

The Danish crew of Hedvig Rasmussen and Christina Johansen will also be one of the top combinations to look out for. Rasmussen is the 2016 Olympic bronze medallist in this event and this year, teamed up with new partner Johansen, they won World Cup bronze and European silver.

Great Britain has a new crew after the retirement of Olympic Champions, Stanning and Glover. They will be fielding two athletes who have not yet raced this season in the pair – Holly Hill and Melissa Wilson both finished sixth in the women's four at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne.

### Men's pair (M2-)

Following the retirement of the Kiwi Pair, New Zealand's Bond and Murray, this boat class has opened its doors to new champions and many countries have stepped up to the challenge including the Olympic Champions from the men's double sculls, the Croatian Sinkovic brothers. In their debut race in the pair Martin and Valent Sinkovic took silver.

But despite being four major regattas so far this season, the pair is way too hard to call. This boat class saw four different gold medal winners: Great Britain, Italy, France and New Zealand.

The French achieved the most number of World Rowing Cup points with 13, ahead of Serbia, with 12. Both nations reached the podium three times this season. French brothers Valentin and Theophile Onfroy won gold at World Rowing Cup II, a European Championship silver and a bronze from Lucerne. Serbia's Nenad Bedik and Milos Vasic won silver at World Rowing Cup I and II and bronze at the European Rowing Championships.

Matteo Lodo and Giuseppe Vincino were part of the men's four that won Olympic bronze in Rio. They became European Champions together. In Lucerne, they were forced to withdraw for medical reasons and so will come to Sarasota-Bradenton potentially with an element of surprise.

New Zealanders James Hunter and Thomas Murray raced once this season, at World Rowing Cup III, and won gold less than one second ahead of Croatia. The British duo for the World Champs have not yet raced internationally this season. Tom Jeffery and Thomas George both come from their nation's eight.

### Lightweight men's double sculls (LM2x)

France's Pierre Houin and Jeremie Azou became Olympic Champions last year in Rio after remaining undefeated throughout the Olympic season. Jeremie Azou has been dominating in this boat since 2015, when he rowed with another partner. The winning streak of the French lightweight men's double sculls seems to be on a roll. The Houin-Azou duo raced at three regattas this season, at two stages of the World Rowing Cup and at the European Rowing Championships - they did not lose once.

The French will be up against Italy and Poland who have recorded consistent results this season. Pietro Ruta and Stefano Oppo from Italy finished fourth at the 2016 Olympic Games in the lightweight men's four. Now in the double, a boat class in which Ruta already has several years of experience, Ruta and Oppo have won silver at World Rowing Cup III and at the European Rowing Championships they took bronze.

Poland's Jerzy Kowalski and Milosz Jankowski won two bronze medals this season – at World Rowing Cup I and at World Rowing Cup III.

### Lightweight women's double sculls (LW2x)

New Zealand's new line-up raced once this season together. Made up of two very accomplished athletes, Zoe McBride is a two-time senior World Champion and World Best Time holder in the lightweight women's single sculls while Jackie Kiddle is an under-23 World Champion in this boat class. Together they won gold with clear water. They look to be tough to beat.

Poland raced at all three stages of the World Rowing Cup season and the European Rowing Championships and did not miss a single podium. Weronika Deresz and Martyna Mikolajczak won the European Rowing Championships and gold at World Rowing Cup I, as well as two World Rowing Cup silver medals.

But at World Rowing Cup II, it was China who won the gold ahead of Poland. Fang Chen and Dandan Pan only raced once this season, but did so with medal results. Look out too for Great Britain. Two British crews raced at World Rowing Cup I and both medalled, one in silver and one in bronze. One athlete from each of those two boats was selected to create the combination of Katherine Copeland and Emily Craig who went on to win bronze at the European Rowing Championships. Katherine Copeland is the 2012 Olympic Champion in this boat class.

And don't discount the young Romanians. The newly crowned under-23 World Champions, Ionela-Livia Lehaci and Bianina-Elena Belega, will aim to prove their worth at the senior level.

### Women's quadruple sculls (W4x)

Poland won all three World Rowing Cup Regattas, but a fourth-place finish at the European Rowing Championships prevented a perfect season. Poland's line-up remained consistent throughout the season (Agniesyka Kobus, Marta Wieliczco, Maria Springwald and Katarzyna Zillmann) including two members of the Olympic bronze medal crew (Kobus and Springwald).

The Polish crew may be the season favourites, but they will not have an easy ride at the World Rowing Championships. The Germans, the Dutch and British took European honours early in the season, shutting out the Polish crew from the podium. The Poles came back strong, but a tight finish at World Cup III reveals just how precarious their position is.

The Netherlands had a consistent season with three silver medals – two at World Cup level and one at the European Rowing Championships. Look out too for Australia. They took World Cup silver and bronze this season and will be looking to make the podium once again.

### Men's quadruple sculls (M4x)

Lithuania is undefeated this season, winning World Rowing Cup I and III as well as the European Rowing Championships.

At World Rowing Cup II, with Lithuania absent, Great Britain claimed gold with a time of 5:36.42, posting the season's fastest final so far.

The experienced Poles could also be podium contenders, having made the podium three times this season.

### Men's double sculls (M2x)

Poland did not miss a single podium this season in the men's double sculls, albeit with a variety of athletes as they worked out their best combination. The Poles won four medals at four regattas: two silvers, including at the European Rowing Championships, and two World Cup bronze medals. The final combination they have selected is Miroslaw Zietarski and Mateusz Biskup.

Although having competed at only two World Rowing Cup regattas, New Zealand accumulated an equal number of World Cup points as Poland – a total of 16. John Storey and Christopher Harris of New Zealand won gold in Poznan and in Lucerne. In Lucerne, their winning margin over Poland was a mere 0.68 of a second.

Italy's Luca Rambaldi and Filippo Mondelli are this year's European Champions and won bronze in Lucerne. Expect the Italians to be in the fight for medals along with Switzerland. Swiss athletes Barnabe Delarze and Roman Roeoesli medalled twice this season and finished fourth in Lucerne. Watch out too for Norway. Olaf Tufte and Kjetil Borch could also make the podium.

### Women's double sculls (W2x)

Brooke Donoghue and Olivia Loe of New Zealand won two World Rowing Cup regattas this season – their first season together as a combination. At World Rowing Cup II, they won gold in 6:39.13, thereby setting a new World Cup Best Time. The Kiwi duo will be top favourites in Sarasota-Bradenton.

The French crew of Helen Lefebvre and Elodie Ravera-Scaramozzino won silver in Lucerne and finished fifth at last year's Olympic Rowing Regatta. They are also expected to be among the best in the field.

The Czech Republic medalled twice in 2017 and will be ones to watch. Athletes Kristyna Fleissnerova and Lenka Antosova claimed the European Championship title and won bronze at World Rowing Cup I. Look out too for Australia's Olympia Aldersey and Madeleine Edmunds who won bronze at World Rowing Cup II.

As for China, at World Rowing Cup II, China won silver, but in Sarasota-Bradenton they will line up a new combination. Lyu Yang raced in the B-final of the women's double sculls at last year's Olympic Games, while Fei Wang has had very few appearances on the world rowing stage to date.

### Men's single sculls (M1x)

Topping the overall 2017 World Rowing Cup standings with 17 points is Switzerland's Nico Stahlberg who raced at each of the three World Cup stages. He won gold in Belgrade, then bronze in Poznan and finally finishing fourth in Lucerne.

But New Zealand's new sculling star Robert Manson looks hard to beat. Manson raced at two World Rowing Cup regattas and won gold at each one. He finished the World Rowing Cup series only one point behind the Swiss, with 16 points. At World Rowing Cup II in Poznan, Manson set a new World Best Time in the single, breaking the time that had been set by his Kiwi predecessor eight years prior by nearly three seconds.

Watch out too for Cuba's Angel Fournier Rodriguez, who claimed two World Cup silver medals this season, both times behind New Zealand's Manson. The World Champion medallist will aim to add yet another championship medal to his collection.

Then there is the tried and true multi-Olympic and World Championship medallist Ondrej Synek from the Czech Republic. He claimed another European Championship title this year, but was not so successful on the World Cup circuit.

Do not discount Damir Martin from Croatia. The Olympic silver medallist from Rio did not have his best season so far but will aim to prove his worth once again at the Worlds.

### Women's single sculls (W1x)

Austria's Magdalena Lobnig and Switzerland's Jeannine Gmelin have been the top athletes to look out for in this boat class this season. Gmelin earned two World Cup gold medals, while Lobnig earned two World Cup bronzes and one gold in Poznan.

Look out too for Great Britain's Victoria Thornley. She is this year's European Champion and also won a World Cup gold in Belgrade and silver in Poznan. Carling Zeeman from Canada raced only once during the pre-Championship season, winning World Cup silver in Lucerne – proving that she will also be in the race for medals. Then there is China. Jingli Duan raced only once this season, but the 2016 Olympic bronze medallist did so in podium fashion at World Rowing Cup II, taking bronze.

### Women's Four (W4-)

Australia won two World Rowing Cup regattas with Lucy Stephan, Katrina Werry, Sarah Hawe and Molly Goodman, placing them at the top of the field.

But on home territory, the United States could well shine, especially as they have a strong women's sweep programme to select a crew from. At World Rowing Cup II the United States pushed Australia to the line and in Sarasota-Bradenton, two of the athletes entered were part of the crew that won silver at last year's World Rowing Championships.

Canada too could do well. At the Poznan World Rowing Cup they took bronze and in Sarasota-Bradenton the crew will include three athletes who finished fifth in the women's eight at the Rio Olympics.

Romania has made one appearance this season. At the European Rowing Championships they claimed the gold medal ahead of Poland and the Netherlands.

### Men's four (M4-)

Historically this is Great Britain's boat class. They have it won at the last five Olympic Games. This year their 2017 line up made the podium at all three World Rowing Cups, winning gold at stage one in Belgrade and at stage three in Lucerne. However, the European Rowing Championships did not go well where they finished fifth. At World Rowing Cup II they lost to the Australians by less than one second.

Australia's crew that beat the British, finished in the fastest time this season – 5:44.34. Their stroke, Alexander Hill, was part of the boat that won Olympic silver last year in Rio in the four.

Look out too for the Italians. Two athletes in the boat raced to Olympic bronze last year in Rio. This year, they claimed the European Championship title and also took silver in Lucerne.

Then there is the Netherlands., Germany and Spain who all claimed World Cup bronze medals this season.

### Women's eight (W8+)

All eyes will be on the United States boat. The US women's eight has remained unbeaten at every major regatta for a decade, creating an unprecedented winning streak and bringing them to this regatta as the reigning World and Olympic Champions. Along the way the line up has changed but the coach has remained the same – Tom Terhaar. This regatta season the crew raced once and at World Rowing Cup II, they finished in bronze medal position behind New Zealand and Great Britain. Could this be the end of their winning streak?

New Zealand and Great Britain will be doing their best to better the United States along with Romania. The Romanians dominated the Olympic podium before the US took over in the top position and at the Rio Olympics they were back in the medals. This season Romania has won gold twice – once at the European Rowing Championships and then again at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne.

### Men's eight (M8+)

Germany has been undefeated this season, having won two stages of the World Rowing Cup series as well as the European Rowing Championships. They also set a new World Best Time in the process and kept the World and Olympic Champions, Great Britain at bay. The British has had mixed results this season with a new line up from their 2016 boat.

Watch out for the Netherlands who have medalled at each regatta that they entered. Also put on the list to watch Australia and New Zealand. Both countries have made the podium this season.

The wild card must be the United States. They have not raced internationally this season but with former Olympian and national team coach Mike Teti back as coach and with the crowd behind them, they may surprise.

## 4.2 Who to watch – International boat classes

In the **lightweight men's single sculls** the reigning World Champion Paul O'Donovan of Ireland is a late entry due to him not being able to race the lightweight double. This will put the pressure on Poland's Artur Mikola Jczewski who has won two World Rowing Cup gold medals this season. And there is more. In this competitive boat class that has attracted entries from 30 countries, watch out for consistently high-performing Peter Galambos from Hungary as well as the newly-crowned European Champion from Switzerland, Michael Schmid. Regular medallist Lukas Babac of Slovakia could also surprise.

Ireland looks to be on track to collect its fifth gold medal of the season in the **lightweight men's pair**, after winning each of the three World Rowing Cup regattas as well as the European Rowing Championships.

The **lightweight men's four** featured this season at the European Rowing Championships and at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne. Italy and Russia were the top finishers at both regattas, with Russia winning at the Europeans and Italy at the World Cup. These are the countries to watch out for.

Look out for Italy, France and the Czech Republic in the **lightweight men's quadruple sculls**. They all made the podium in Lucerne and with Italy's historical dominance in this event, they will be the favourites.

In the **lightweight women's single sculls**, the winner is hard to determine. At all four regattas so far this season (World Rowing Cup I, II and III as well as the European Rowing Championships), the gold medallist was a different athlete. Switzerland, Sweden and South Africa could all cross the line first. In the absence of New Zealand's Jackie Kiddle who will be competing in the lightweight women's double sculls, the door could also be open for Poland, Ireland and the Netherlands to make the podium.

So far the **lightweight women's quadruple sculls** only featured at one regatta, at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne, with three entries including Australia, Great Britain and Japan. They crossed the line in that order. At the World Rowing Championships they will race again, along with six additional entries.

The **men's coxed pair** also raced in Lucerne only so far this season, and also featured three entries only. Germany, Australia and Spain were first, second and third respectively. Five additional crews will join them in Sarasota-Bradenton.

### 4.3 Who to watch – para-rowing boat classes

The 2016 Paralympic Champion in the **para PR1 men's single sculls**, Roman Polianskyi from Ukraine, raced to gold at the Poznan World Rowing Cup this season. In Poznan, Russia's Alexey Chuvashhev earned silver and Poland's Jaroslaw Kailing won bronze – neither of whom competed in Rio. Look out especially for Australia's Erik Horrie who is the 2012 and 2016 Paralympic silver medallist and a three-time World Champion.

The 2016 Paralympic silver and bronze medallists in the **para PR1 women's single sculls** will line up in Sarasota-Bradenton – China's Lili Wang and Israel's Moran Samuel. Neither of these athletes have competed this season, so they will be new to racing at the 2000m distance. Birgit Skarstein from Norway, a multi-world medallist in this boat class and Paralympian, led the field in Poznan to take a World Cup gold.

Look out for the 2016 Paralympic silver medallists from China in the **para PR2 mixed double sculls**. Shuang Liu and Tianming Fei have not yet raced at World Rowing level this season so could be a surprise. At the World Rowing Cup in Poznan, it was the Netherlands finishing ahead of the field this season with Annika Van der Meer and Corne De Koning. They finished fourth in Rio. Look out too for the experienced Ukrainians, Iryna Kyrychenko and Iaroslav Koiuda.

In the **para PR3 mixed coxed four** the British 2016 Paralympic boat is back with half of their Paralympic Champion crew. They have not yet raced at World Cup level this season and will be eager to show their ongoing form. The 2016 Paralympic silver medallists from the United States have only one change to their boat and will be aiming to please their home crowd. Look out too for Ukraine who won gold at World Rowing Cup II this season.

The **para PR3 mixed coxed double sculls** saw Austria race at the Poznan World Rowing Cup earlier this season where they finished second. There is varying degrees of experience in the other crews including the Chinese duo coming from the 2016 Paralympic four and France racing in the four at Poznan.

## 4.4 Rowers in the spotlight

### Robert Manson (New Zealand)

Men's single sculls

His eight-year international career has truly ignited in 2017 with Robbie Manson getting into the single sculls. Mason has had time in the double and quadruple sculls and seen two Olympic Games, but it looks as though he has found his niche. This season Manson has not only won two World Rowing Cup gold medals, but he has also set a new World Best Time. Is this New Zealand's next Mahe Drysdale?

"I like that in the single it is all on me, you always know whether you are rowing well or not and there is no one else to blame."

### Marieke Keijser (Netherlands)

Lightweight women's singles sculls

At only 20 years of age, lightweight sculler Marieke Keijser has already become a recognised name in the field of rowing. Keijser won the World Rowing Junior Championship title in the women's single sculls, and the under-23 World Championship title in the lightweight women's single sculls twice. She has also claimed several World Rowing Cup medals at the senior level in both the lightweight single and double.

"Before I discovered rowing I was a ballerina. I started ballet when I was little and was accepted for a year at the Royal Dutch Conservatorium. My brother was rowing, he told me about it and I decided to try and see if it would be as nice as he said it was... it was!"

### Elodie Ravera-Scramozzino (France)

Women's double sculls

The rowing career of Elodie Ravera-Scramozzino began with a bronze at the 2011 World Rowing Junior Championships in the women's double sculls. She has also shown her athletic skills in the single, in which she won junior world bronze in 2013. Now one of France's most successful female rowers, Ravera-Scramozzino finished fifth at the Rio Olympic Games. This year, Ravera-Scramozzino has raced in her country's quadruple sculls, the under-23 single and also picked up a World Rowing Cup medal in the double.

"The rowing mindset is what makes the difference. We all fight for the same values: a clean sport, a rigorous sport for which sacrifices are sometimes needed."

**Martin & Valent Sinkovic (Croatia)**

Men's pair

Before becoming the crew to beat in the men's double sculls, the Sinkovic brothers were part of their nation's quadruple sculls in which they won multiple international medals, including Olympic silver in 2012. Successfully moving to the double, they set a World Best Time, becoming the first double to break six minutes for 2000m. They are the reigning Olympic Champions in the double. This season, the brothers have switched to the pair and raced once internationally – at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne - where they claimed silver behind New Zealand.

"It's a typical brotherly relationship. We hang out a lot and spend a lot of time together outside of the boat and we are a big support to each other. We have some kind of a special synergy, sometimes all it takes is one look to know what the other one has on his mind."

**Mohamed Sbihi (Great Britain)**

Men's four

Rowing may not have been on Moe Sbihi's mind when he was discovered through British Rowing's talent ID programme at age 15. It is now two Olympic Games and two Olympic medals later including gold in the men's four from the Rio Olympics. Sbihi is considered one of the best in his country's powerful men's sweep squad which has seen him dominate pairs racing at national selection trials. This season, Sbihi has been the linchpin of Great Britain's priority men's four with success already through the World Rowing Cup series.

"Rowing is the sport that rewards perseverance the most and therefore, do not stop trying. Keep pushing yourself to be better."

**Jeannine Gmelin (Switzerland)**

Women's single sculls

Jeannine Gmelin is Switzerland's most accomplished female sculler. She first competed internationally in the women's single sculls in 2014, then won her first medal in this boat class at the 2015 European Rowing Championships – a silver. Since then Gmelin has since become a regular finalist, finishing a credible fifth at the 2016 Olympic Games and this year winning two World Rowing Cup gold medals.

"The will to succeed is important, but what is more important is the will to prepare."

**Saulius Ritter (Lithuania)**

Men's quadruple sculls

One of Lithuania's top scullers, Saulius Ritter won his first international medal in the men's double sculls at the 2010 World Rowing Under 23 Championships. In the years following, he rowed exclusively in the men's double accumulating a collection of medals: four European Championship medals, two World Championship silvers and Olympic silver. But this year, after initially rowing in the double, Ritter joined the quadruple sculls. So far the boat has remained unbeaten.

"I really enjoy racing in the quad, we are a strong team. Everyone gives 100 per cent strength at every training."

**Richard Schmidt (Germany)**

Men's eight

He's been on the international scene for over a decade beginning in 2004 as a junior with a bronze in the men's four. Richard Schmidt then went on to gather another junior medal before becoming an under-23 World Champion. Aged 21, Schmidt finished sixth in the men's four at his first Olympic Games (2008). Since then, he has joined the famed German men's eight, adding victory after victory at the European Championship, World Rowing Cup and World Championship levels. At the London 2012 Olympics Schmidt became an Olympic Champion. In Rio 2016, he won silver. This season, Schmidt and his crewmates in the eight have not lost a single race.

"The unique feature of rowing is its connection with nature. Especially the connection to water makes rowing a natural sport."

**Emily Regan (United States)**

Women's eight, women's four

One of the United States' top female rowing athletes, Emily Regan first competed internationally for her country in the women's eight in 2013. Leading up to the Rio 2016 Olympics Regan was part of the unbeaten US eight. This added several World Championship medals as well as another Olympic Champion title to Regan's collection. Regan has demonstrated her exceptional strength as an athlete by regularly doubling up in the women's four.

**Angel Fournier Rodriguez (Cuba)**

Men's single sculls

Cuba's most successful rower, Angel Fournier Rodriguez has been moving up the ranks since he first competed at the senior level a decade ago. In 2012 Fournier claimed his first international senior medal – World Rowing Cup bronze. Fournier now has many World Cup medals. In 2013, Fournier took World Championship silver, followed by world bronze in 2014. This season he has won two World Rowing Cup silver medals.

“What I like most about the single is that I totally depend on myself and therefore the results, good or bad, are my entire responsibility. What I admire most about my competitors is the communication we are able to have between each other and also the friendship that exists.”
