Important Notes:

1. There will be six (6) events at each Continental Qualification Regatta:

Olympic events: W1x, LW2x, M1x, LM2x

Paralympic events: PR1 W1x, PR1 M1x

2. Olympic events:

2.1 Only rowers eligible under the eligibility rules of the International Olympic Committee may represent their country in the Olympic events at the Continental Qualification Regatta for the Olympic Games. Every competitor must be able to prove this eligibility and the entries should be accompanied by a letter from the NOC confirming that the athletes entered are eligible according to section C. Athlete Eligibility, QUALIFICATION SYSTEM – GAMES OF THE XXXII OLYMPIAD – TOKYO 2020. (See also FISA Rule 19 and Olympic Charter Rule 41 and Bye-law)

2.2 The Olympic events at the Continental Qualification Regattas are open only to those NOCs that have qualified in only one event or have not qualified in any events at the 2019 World Rowing Championships.

2.3 An eligible NOC may only enter one (1) boat per event at the relevant Continental Qualification Regatta.

2.4 **Except as provided below**, at the Continental Qualification Regattas, an NOC may qualify a maximum of one (1) boat. If two (2) or more boats from an NOC meet the qualification criteria at a Continental Qualification Regatta, then it is the highest-ranking boat that qualifies. In the case that two or more boats have an equal ranking other than first place (which is dealt with separately below), the NOC shall select one of these boats to qualify for the Games.

2.5 For NOCs not having qualified any boats at the 2019 World Rowing Championships and having two boats placed first in two events at the Continental Qualification Regatta, both first placed boats shall qualify. Where an NOC as described in the first sentence above has more than two boats placing first at the Continental Qualification Regatta, the NOC shall select two of these boats to qualify for the Games.

2.6 For NOCs having qualified one boat at the 2019 World Rowing Championships and having two or more boats placed first in events at the Continental Qualification Regatta, the NOC shall select one of these boats to qualify for the Games.

2.7 For quota places obtained at the Continental Qualification regattas, the athletes that qualified the boat(s) at these events must compete in the same event if they compete in any events at the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020. Quota places are allocated to the NOCs.

3. Paralympic events:

3.1 To be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must:

- have competed in at least one (1) official FISA competition between 1 January 2018 and 7 June 2020;
- be internationally classified either with a 'Confirmed' sport class status or a 'Review' sport class status with a review date after 31 December 2020.

3.1.1. Classification and medical documentation for athletes needing classification at this qualification regatta must be uploaded to the FISA portal no later than 25 August 2019.

<p>3.2 Only NPCs in good standing with the IPC may enter duly qualified and eligible athletes in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games. NPCs are reminded that NFs must ensure that their membership with their sport's respective IF is in good standing during the qualification period and upon close of sport entries to the Paralympic Games so their athletes may participate.</p> <p>Any athlete in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games must be a national of the country/territory of the NPC entering him/her and in compliance with the provisions of the IPC Athlete Nationality Policy published in the IPC Handbook.</p>
<p>3.3 Only those NPCs that have not qualified any boats at the 2019 World Rowing Championships shall be eligible to participate in the Continental Qualification Regattas.</p>
<p>3.4 An eligible NPC may only enter one (1) boat per event at the relevant Continental Qualification Regatta.</p>
<p>3.5 An NPC will be allowed to qualify a maximum of one (1) boat through the Continental Qualification Regatta. If an NPC achieves more than one qualifying place at a Continental Qualification Regatta, it is the highest-ranking boat from the NPC that qualifies for the Paralympic Games. If two boats have equal rank in qualifying places, then the NPC must select the boat that will qualify for the Paralympic Games</p>
<p>3.6 In the case where two boats from an NPC achieve a qualifying place at the Continental Qualification Regatta, the qualification place of the boat that is not selected by the NPC to qualify for the Paralympic Games passes to the next highest ranked boat in that event.</p>
<p>4. The Continental Qualification Regattas will be held according to the FISA Rules of Racing and have the same status as World Rowing Championships (Rule 5, page 47).</p>
<p>5. In all cases mentioned above, the NOC and/or NPC shall have two weeks from notification to confirm the use of the allocated qualification places and, where relevant, to decide which boat or boats shall qualify for the Games, with the exception of the Paralympic qualifications at the Asia & Oceania Qualification Regatta and the European Qualification Regatta, where the NPC will have only one week to confirm.</p>
<p>6. Only entries that are received by the deadline will be accepted.</p>
