

1 General

1.1 Introduction

The European Rowing Championships was the first international regatta organised by the World Rowing Federation, FISA, after its foundation in 1892. The championships are one of the oldest pan-continental sporting events. First staged in Orta, Italy in 1893, the continental championships were then organised almost annually until 1973.

In 2007, the European regatta was reintroduced into the international rowing calendar. The growing interest in the event was clear and in 2013, it was moved to the beginning of the rowing calendar, between the second and third World Rowing Cups. It has experienced ongoing popularity and increased participation in this new time-slot.

In 2018, rowing participated in the inaugural multi-sport European Championships in Glasgow, Great Britain. This event is planned to be held every four years. For 2018 the event attracted 32 nations with more than 500 athletes. Romania topped the medals table with three gold, two silver and two bronze medals. The Romanians earned gold in the women's pair, women's eight and men's four. In second place was France with two gold, two silver and one bronze. Italy followed closely behind in third.

This year, the European Rowing Championships is at the popular Rotsee rowing venue in Lucerne, Switzerland. Lucerne regularly hosts the third World Rowing Cup, but decided to exceptionally bid for this championship event.

Lake Rotsee, also known as the 'Lake of the Gods' is regularly cited as athletes' favourite venue. The pristine natural lake is the perfect size for a 2000m, eight-lane course. The venue is open for rowing only a couple weeks per year in order to protect the natural habitat of the flora and fauna.

The European Rowing Championships are open to the 46 European national rowing federations, including Israel. The programme consists of the 14 Olympic boat classes and three International boat classes (lightweight men's and women's single sculls and lightweight men's quadruple sculls).

The European Rowing Championships are monitored and managed by the European Rowing Management Board (ERMB). Their responsibilities have grown to include the European Rowing Junior Championships (18-19 May 2019 in Essen, Germany), the European Rowing Under 23 Championships (7-8 September 2018 in Ioannina, Greece) and the European Rowing Indoor Championships (held 26 January 2019 in Copenhagen, Denmark)

Next year, the European Championships will head to Poznan, Poland. Poznan has become a regular on the international rowing circuit. The regatta will take place from 5-7 June, 2020.



About Lucerne

Lucerne is a city of exquisite beauty in central Switzerland. It is famous for its architectural monuments such as the restored Chapel Bridge, its historical town squares and churches, as well as its world-renowned festivals of classical music. Above all it is famous for its breathtaking scenery and, among rowers, the regatta course, the Rotsee is considered to be the 'Mecca' of rowing. Regattas have been organised in Lucerne for over 150 years and the Rotsee has been a World Rowing Cup venue since its beginning in 1997. The venue has hosted four World Rowing Championships (1962, 1974, 1982, 2001) and many World Best Times have been set in this beautiful natural arena.

A media accreditation confirmation email will be sent to media having requested accreditation for this event. Accreditation can be collected on site upon arrival at the venue.

Photographers & TV camera operators

There will be a photographer shuttle service running from the media centre to the start area. Information on the schedule and the booking process will be available at the media centre. Bibs must be worn to distinguish accredited photographers from private/non-professional photographers or TV camera operators. These bibs must be worn throughout the event. They are handed out upon a deposit of 50 CHF. Filming equipment needs to be approved by World Rowing and be identified with an event logo sticker that must remain clearly visible. Accredited camera teams must contact World Rowing in the media centre upon arrival and sign a Filming Request Form in order to receive an accreditation sticker for their equipment.

3 Who to watch

3.1 Who to watch

Women's pair (W2-)

Sixteen crews are entered to compete and this race is a tough one to call. The new Dutch combination of Aletta Jorritsma and Jose van Veen came out strong this season by winning at the first World Rowing Cup. Spain holds the bronze medal from the 2018 World Rowing Championships, but has one new crew member. Virginia Diaz Rivas has teamed up with Aina Cid. The new pair finished sixth at the first World Cup and now with more time rowing together it is likely they'll step up at this regatta.

Denmark has also entered a new combination. Olympic bronze medallist Hedvig Rasmussen has teamed up with 2017 European silver medallist Christina Johansen. Denmark has a number of women's sweep medals in the last few years and this duo might be able to pick up another one. Watch out too for Ukraine. Oksana Golub finished fourth at last year's European Championships in the women's pair and has teamed up with the fastest woman on the rowing machine, Olena Buryak.

Men's pair (M2-)

As in the women's pair, the field has 16 entries and is wide open. The first World Rowing Cup earlier this month saw a shake-up when the young Serbian crew of Milos Vasic and Martin Mackovic beat the World Champion Sinkovic brothers in the final. Both crews are entered and both have nothing to lose.

Also challenging for a top spots will be Romania and France. Romania has entered their silver-medal crew from last year's World Rowing Championships, Ciprian Tudosa and Marius-Vasile Cozmiuc. The French brothers Theophile and Valentin Onfroy are world bronze medallists and European silver medallists. Watch out too for Spain. They finished just behind Croatia at the first World Rowing Cup and look to be on form this season.

Women's double sculls (W2x)

This field includes the reigning World Champions, Lithuania, and the reigning European Champions, France. The Lithuanian crew of Ieva Adomaviciute and Milda Valciukaite have been racing together for several seasons. They finally found top speed to win at last year's World Rowing Championships.

The French crew of Helene Lefebvre and Elodie Ravera-Scaramozzino have had mixed results. They won gold at last year's European Championships, but finished last in the b-final at the World Championships. It is anyone's guess how they perform in this early-season race.

Watch out too for Belarus. Their new line-up finished second at the World Rowing Cup I a few weeks ago. And don't be surprised if Great Britain and Germany end up in the final. They have new line-ups, but often finish strong in this category.

Men's double sculls (M2x)

The French are the crew to beat in this 19-boat race. Hugo Bucheron and Matthieu Androdias are reigning World and European Champions and look to be unstoppable. The duo went from a handful of a-final finishes to the top of the podium in 2018 and this is their first international event of the 2019 season. Looking to challenge them will be the home favourites, Switzerland. The Swiss double had several line-up changes in 2018, but they seem to have settled on Barnabe Delarze and Roman Roeoesli. This combination finished just behind the French at the 2018 World Rowing Championships.

Watch out too for Germany's Stephan Krueger and Tim Ole Naske. Naske famously fought for the top spot in the German men's single sculls last year, but lost out to the newcomer Oliver Zeidler. Naske is now paired up with three-time Olympian Krueger. Keep an eye out too for Great Britain and Poland. They both have new line-ups, but typically put together quick crews in this boat class.

Women's Four (W4-)

Most of the crews are new line-ups. The Russians are the reigning European Champions in this boat class, but they have entered a completely new crew. Romania holds the silver from last year's European Championships and is also regularly strong in women's sweep rowing, but they have also entered a new line-up. This line-up includes the formidable force of Madalina Beres, the 2018 European Champion in the women's pair.

Watch out too for Poland and Denmark. Poland finished third at last year's European Championships and they have kept the same combination. Denmark has seen recent success in this category, but also seem to be switching rowers between the women's pair and women's four. The Netherlands may also post a result, they recently won gold at the first World Cup of the season.

Men's four (M4-)

The Romanians will be looking to retain their 2018 European title. They have made one switch to their line-up, bringing in Mugurel Vasile Semciuc for Cosmin Pescari. The crew recently finished second at World Rowing Cup I, behind the Polish. Poland has entered the same line-up for Lucerne and will be looking to repeat their gold medal win.

Romania and Poland will face a strong Italian crew. Italy has seen mixed results over the last few years, but finished with silver at last year's World Rowing Championships. They have made one change to their line-up, replacing Matteo Lodo with Cesare Gabbia. Keep an eye out too for Great Britain and Germany. Their men's sweep rowing programmes are robust and they are likely to boat fast crews.

Women's single sculls (W1x)

Jeannine Gmelin won everything in 2017 and 2018, until Sanita Puspure from Ireland raced a fantastic final at the World Rowing Championships to take home gold. Gmelin is making her 2019 season debut and without an entry from Puspure, she is the one to beat.

Gmelin's biggest competitors are likely to be Magdalena Lobnig of Austria and Lisa Scheenaard of the Netherlands. Lobnig has been a regular on the podium and in 2018, she finished second at the European Championships and third at the World Championships. Scheenaard was most recently part of the Dutch women's double that finished second at last year's European Championships. She won gold in the women's single at World Rowing Cup I earlier this month and is definitely a medal contender in Lucerne. Watch out too for 2012 Olympic Champion Mirka Knapkova. Knapkova took time off to have a baby and is back at it for the 2020 Olympic cycle.

4 Current season summary 2019

4.1 Current season summary

The 2019 international rowing season got underway with World Rowing Cup I at the start of May. It took place at the venue of the 2018 World Rowing Championships in Plovdiv, Bulgaria. Crews descended from 24 countries around the world, with more than 300 athletes competing.

China sent a full team of 24 entries and dominated the regatta securing 61 world cup points. China has based its national team in Europe for the rowing season and will be expected at upcoming events, although they can not compete at the European Championships.

Finishing second on the points table at World Rowing Cup I was Poland with a total of 45 points. Poland picked up points by winning the men's four, men's quadruple sculls and men's eight. They will be racing again at the European Championships.

The Dutch finished just one point behind Poland landing in third on the points table. The Dutch only sent women's crews to the regatta and earned gold in the women's pair, women's four, women's single and women's eight. For the European Championships they are sending a full team of 15 crews.

At World Rowing Cup I the women's single sculls saw the return of two Olympic Champions, Mirka Knapkova from the Czech Republic and Ekaterina Karsten from Belarus. Both veterans raced in the final, with Knapkova finishing in third. China's Yan Jiang took second and the Netherlands' Lisa Scheenaard was in first. Scheenaard remains in the single at Lucerne.

The men's single sculls saw veterans racing against young guns with Olympic silver medallist Damir Martin of Croatia finding his way back to the top of the podium. Martin suffered from illness and injury in the 2018 season, but looks to be back on form this year. Belarus' young Pilip Pavukou raced an excellent final to take second and Robert Ven of Finland finished in third. It was the first World Cup medal for Pavukou and Ven.

Belgium had a good start to the season in the lightweight men's double sculls. Tim Brys and Niels van Zandweghe proved their form going into this Olympic qualification year by finishing ahead of Jerzy Kowalksi and Artur Mikolajczewski of Poland. Portugal finished in third.

The United States entered four women's pairs and four women's fours, however their early-season testing was not enough to beat the Dutch. The USA2 boat of Felice Mueller and Emily Regan finished with a bronze in the women's pair, with China in silver medal position and the Netherlands crew of Jose van Veen and Aletta Jorritsma taking gold. The Dutch also dominated in the women's four, finishing ahead of the USA2 crew.

There was an upset in the men's pair when Martin Mackovic and Milos Vasic of Serbia beat the reigning World Champions Valent and Martin Sinkovic to the line. They will meet again in Lucerne.

The boat recognises the winner's involvement in the club and is designed to help the club develop young rowers.

A call for nominations for the 2019 Filippi Spirit Award will open in September 2019. To qualify, the applicants must have attended university full-time in the 2019 year and row regularly for a university club.
