Welcome to the 2011 World Rowing Under 23 Championships

In 2004 FISA adopted the popular Nations cup and renamed it the World Rowing Under 23 championships. The first World Rowing Under 23 Championships was held in 2005 at 'de Bosbaan' in Amsterdam. Having adopted all FISA World Championship standards the event has grown into an important event on the World Rowing calendar and fulfilled its promise to provide a stepping stone for young athletes on the path to the Olympics.

On the 21st of July 2011, Amsterdam will host the World Rowing U23 Championships for the second time. This time we will undertake actions to recreate the warm Dutch atmosphere whilst testing venue setups for the World Rowing Championships in Amsterdam in 2014.

We are proud of the opportunities provided by the city of Amsterdam and the international rowing community, to enable you to experience this unique rowing course 'de Bosbaan' at a top location.

The organising committee (OC) will do its utmost to organise a prestigious event, deserving of the international rowing contestants. A warm welcome to Amsterdam!

The City of Amsterdam is honoured that FISA has awarded the organization of the 2011 World Rowing Under 23 Championship to the Royal Dutch Rowing Federation (KNRB) and the city of Amsterdam – and has done so for the second time. We are also very pleased that Amsterdam will host the FISA World Rowing Championships in 2014 at the city's Bosbaan, which is the world's oldest rowing course.

and young sport talents can follow full-time training programmes in an environment that has optimal training conditions, and where they can also participate in tailor-made school programmes. The Royal Dutch Rowing Federation participates in this institute. Moreover VU University is very close to the Bosbaan rowing course, where you can see many top athletes and rowing talents in action every day

On behalf of the City of Amsterdam, I should like to extend a warm welcome to all the participants and their coaches, as well as officials, members of FISA, sponsors, media and spectators from all over the world. I hope that you all enjoy not only the sports event, but also our wonderful city and its historic and cultural atmosphere.

The venue

The Bosbaan rowing course is a man-made course. In the 1930's it was constructed through a social welfare project. Queen Wilhelmina officially opened the Bosbaan on June 12th 1937. It was the venue of several European Rowing Championships in the fifties and sixties. The facilities and course were upgraded in the early seventies to a 6 lane race course plus 1 spare lane. Amsterdam successfully organised the European Rowing Championships in 1964 (the first European Championship including female competitors) and 1967 and the World Rowing Championships in 1977.

Up until 2000, the Bosbaan hosted many national and international regattas, tournaments and championships, such as National Championships, the Nations Cup, the Coupe de la Jeunesse, the FISU World University Championships, the FISA World Cup in 1990 and 1991 and the annual international Koninklijke – Hollandbeker Regatta.

In 2001, the city of Amsterdam, together with the Royal Dutch Rowing Federation, broadened, deepened and renewed the regatta course to upgrade the Bosbaan to meet the 21st century standards. The new 8 lane course was completed in 2002, together with an enlarged boathouse and new sanitary facilities. In addition, new facilities along the race course were built.



With a broadened course, a new timing system, a new boat house, an upgrade of the start area with a traffic light starting system, a new finish tower and aligner's hut, an Olympic training centre and several other new facilities, the upgraded Bosbaan has been the venue for many national and international regattas and championships.

In 2005, Amsterdam successfully hosted the FISA World Rowing Under 23 Championships and in 2006 the FISA

World Rowing Junior Championships. In 2003, the international Royal Holland Beker Regatta started again, and in 2007 was combined with the second Rowing World Cup.

Athletes very much like the conditions for the crews on the water, the facilities for the athletes and the friendliness of the organisation. The 'Dutch' enthusiasm on the bikes and in the rolling grand stand along the course is famous and inspires rowers to great performances.






The course

The Bosbaan is now completely in tune with the current FISA requirements. The course, with a total length of 2300 metres, runs from southwest to northeast. On the north side you'll find a natural footpath, the main event location and the Olympic Training Centre (OTC). On the south side there are cameras, a cycling path for coaches and, unique to the world, a rolling grand stand. Rolling grand stands consist of large trucks on which stands have been built. From these rolling grand stands spectators have a magnificent view on the rowing competition, being able to follow their favourite athletes. The 2.2 meter deep race course is equipped with the Albano buoy system. The banks have been rebuilt with extra wave absorbing blocks and an ecological reed border.

The start area

The start area still has the original start tower of the 1977 World Championships. In the spacious building, starters and other officials have an open view on the course. The public address systems in the start area and at 100 metre mark ensure that crews receive clear communications from the officials. On the roof there is a large and safe place for television and video cameras to capture live images of the start. The start-fingers have been completely integrated into the start-island. In this way these installations perfectly blend into the natural surroundings.



The finish area

The finish area is a site of many activities. The finish tower is the centre of the timing and results system. Here the umpires, photo-finish-cameras and the FISA timing and results service provider Swiss Timing, track all the races and determine the finishing order. On the second floor of the finish tower, the commentators have an excellent view of the race course and provide live coverage of the races in several languages. Behind the finish tower, on top of the embankment, is the Olympic Training Centre. This is where the FISA staff and Commissions have their offices.

The embankment between the finish tower and the OTC will house temporary grandstands to accommodate the spectators, FISA family and the international press and media. An enormous video screen will be visible from the public grand stand. It will show live coverage of all the races from start to finish and, immediately after the finish, the results of each race. During the finals, the victory ceremonies will take place directly in front of the grandstand, enabling spectators to take a close look at the winners.





Venue opening


The venue opens on 17 July 2011. The course will be open for training from 7am until 8pm. The venue will be open from 6.30am until 8.30pm.

Medical arrangements

The nearest hospital is 1,5 km from the rowing course. During official practice times and on racing day medical support will be provided at the course for both athletes and spectators.

Accessibility

Amsterdam is easily accessible by air, by rail and road.

Amsterdam Airport Schiphol is a very modern, efficient and user-friendly airport. Scheduled services fly into Schiphol from at least 129 destinations within Europe and from 108 non-European destinations. Some 110 airlines fly from Amsterdam Airport Schiphol to more than 260 destinations worldwide.

In 2007, Amsterdam Airport Schiphol served 47.8 million passengers. Schiphol train station is located directly below the airport and by train you arrive at Amsterdam Central Station within 15 minutes. Via Schiphol Plaza, you can walk straight to the departure or arrival hall. There are also 15 to 20 trains a day to destinations such as Brussels, Paris and Frankfurt.

Food Services

A professional catering company will provide meals on the course. There will be four catering facilities for the different groups:

- Athletes and coaches
- OC, Jury, FISA members, media and volunteers provided free
- Public
- VIPs

At the Athletes accommodations, breakfast, (optional) lunch and dinner will be served in buffet style. Lunch (buffet) will be served on the venue site as well and teams may change lunch plans between the venue and the hotels upon a 24 hour prior notification. The menu will be consulted with the FISA.

For NF Delegates and VIP/Sponsors the hotel accommodation will provide breakfast. Lunch will be available for purchase at the venue. For media the hotel accommodation will provide breakfast and lunch will be available in the press centre for free.

Transport and Parking Services

There is a shuttle service from all the hotels to the venue and back. In order to provide this service there will be a schedule form for each team to complete on a daily basis during the event for the development of the daily bus schedule. Buses will be departing half an hour before opening time of the course, until half an hour after closing time of the course. The transport service to/from the venue will be provided from 17 July 2011 and will cease on the evening of 24 July 2011.

For overseas boat transport the options are either air transport to Schiphol Airport or shipment to Rotterdam or Amsterdam Seaport. We can facilitate transport to the regatta venue by a local boat transporter at your own cost.

From nearby European countries transport by road is possible. The Bosbaan is close to the A10 (ring Amsterdam). Boat trailers can be parked close to the venue.

Directions to the Venue

By bike from Amsterdam

Follow Amstelveenseweg from Stadionplein (direction to Amstelveen). Pass by VU medical centre. Keep following the bicycle path at Amstelveenseweg until you see restaurant 'De Veranda' at your right hand side. Turn right immediately after the restaurant. You're now approaching the Bosbaan. At the Olympic training centre (grey long building) turn left towards the boathouse.

Public transport

From Schiphol Airport

- Catch a train to station Amsterdam Zuid WTC. From there you can walk to the course in 10 minutes, follow a part of the bike route or you can catch the bus (see below).

From Amsterdam Central Station:

- Subway 51, get off at station Amsterdam Zuid WTC and walk 10 minutes to the course or catch the bus (see below).
- Buses 170 and 172. Get off at Koenenkade and follow bikeroute from 'De Veranda'.

From Station Amsterdam Zuid WTC (South):


- Buses 171 and 166, get off at Van Nijenrodeweg, walk back app. 100 m and turn left.
- Or walk in 10 minutes to the course. Pass the Free University (VU) and de VU medical centre, then turn left and turn right when you see restaurant 'De Veranda'.

From Amsterdam Amstel and RAI:

- Subway 51, get off at station Amsterdam Zuid WTC and walk 10 minutes to the course or catch the bus.
- Bus 62. Get off at Van Nijenrodeweg/ Amstelveenseweg. Walk on for app. 100 m, cross the road and go left. You're now approaching the Bosbaan.

By car

From the A10, the Amsterdam ring, take exit VU (S108). Turn left at the traffic lights. You will pass the VU medical centre, keep following the Amstelveenseweg. After 700 m at the next traffic lights turn right. Follow the parking signs.





The weather


Climate

Amsterdam is situated in a moderate climate zone, with mild summers and cool winters. Rainfall is spread evenly throughout the year. The spring is crisp and rejuvenating. Hot and humid weather can occur between the months of June and September and the most precipitation occurs in October and November. From December to February the weather is often cold, but sunny and dry.



Humidity profile Amsterdam




Temperature and humidity profile Amsterdam







Temperature profile Amsterdam




Wind profile Amsterdam

Media

Media facilities

We plan to have the best possible media services during the World Rowing Under 23 Championships Amsterdam 2011. A covered media grandstand will be located next to the course and the finish area. There will be approximately forty workplaces available for the media and press officers of the national rowing federations.

Every workplace will be equipped with wireless as well as wired internet and power outlets. During the races live results will be broadcasted on dedicated monitors. An enormous video screen will be visible from the public grand stand. It will show live coverage of all the races from start to finish and, immediately after the finish, the results of each race.

To reduce the amount of paper that is going to waste, we will provide printed versions of the results 'on demand' at a printing kiosk. In case of a lineup results will be provided by our volunteers to minimise waiting times.

Close to the course – just a 1-minute walk away – will be a separate press centre where members of the press will have the opportunity to write their articles or edit their photos. Internet access (both wired and wireless) will be available as well as telephone-, print-, copy- and fax equipment.

Journalists who would like to see the races themselves can ride on the moving grandstand.

Photographers will have the opportunity to shoot pictures from the start area. Shelter will be provided in case of bad weather.

Power outlets and internet access are available at the start area as well. During racetime light snacks and drinks will be available.

Accreditation

As usual, FISA will coordinate the international media accreditation process. Media accreditation requests should be submitted online at **www.worldrowing.com**. Spectators will be able to enjoy not only a great rowing event but many other forms of entertainment as well. These can vary from local theatre to a wellness centre or music near the waterfront. Tickets and information about these facilities will be available at the regatta where possible.

A VIP tent in the public area near the grandstand offers a private space for VIPS and Sponsors. Meals, drinks and snacks will be provided by a professional catering company. VIP hostesses will accompany the guests. The races can be watched from the VIP tent. Entertainment (music, guest speakers) will be provided.

Official Ceremonies and Social Events

Part of our event will be an opening ceremony on Wednesday 20 July, 19.00 hrs, near the regatta course, the closing ceremony and a party for all athletes on Sunday after the last races. The party will be organized at one of the athlete hotels. More information will be provided at the event.
