'INDICATIVE' RACE SCHEDULE

SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL ROWING REGATTA, 18-24 March 2013

The following pages outline the **indicative** race schedule for the inaugural Sydney International Rowing Regatta. The 'Festival of Rowing' will be held at the Sydney International Regatta Centre, Penrith NSW, from 18th to 24th March, 2013.

The seven day event will involve five days of the Australian Open Rowing Championships (Monday 18th to Friday 22nd March) with the Kings & Queens Cups Interstate Regatta and other National Championship events on Saturday, 23rd March.

The 14 Olympic events of the Samsung World Rowing Cup 1 will begin with heats on Friday morning, 22nd March. World Rowing Cup Repechages will be on Saturday morning and Finals for both the World Rowing Cup and the Australian Open Schools Championships will be on Sunday, 24th March.

Overseas athletes are welcome to compete in the Australian Open Rowing Championships as a lead up event to their Samsung World Rowing Cup campaign. High profile international schools have also been invited to compete in the Australian Open Schools [Rowing](#) Championships.

The event's presenting partner Singapore Airlines, supported by the NSW Government through Destination NSW, and FISA's major sponsor Samsung will provide assistance to bring the 2012 London Olympic Games medal winning crews from each event to Australia.

Several new 'conditions of entry' will apply to this ~~new~~ event. These ~~entry~~ conditions are listed below and may be added to from time to time, prior to the opening of entries in early January 2013.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Restrictions will be placed on the number of races able to be entered for those athletes selected to race for Australia in the Samsung World Rowing Cup 1. These restrictions will be outlined within the National Team Nomination process.
- International crews may enter in the Australian Open Rowing Championships & the Australian Schools Open Rowing Championships events.
- Late entries by international World Rowing Cup crews will be permitted where an Australian Open Rowing Championships event has less than 8 entries.
- Athletes may not enter both Schoolboy/Schoolgirl Single Scull *and* U17 Single Scull races.
- All Australian Open, Interstate and Open Schools events will be raced over 8 lanes.
- The progression system will be published when entries open for the regatta.
- Australian Open Schools Rowing Championships events will be limited to 2 crews per school.
- Composite crews will be required to race in a 'common' racing suit of the crew's choice.
- There may be other conditions notified at a later date or when entries open.
