1.3. 2011 World Rowing Season – Highlights

2011 Samsung World Rowing Cup series: Munich (GER), Hamburg (GER), Lucerne (SUI)

The 2011 Samsung World Rowing Cup series opened in Munich (GER), on the final weekend of May. Great Britain has won every World Cup series since 2007 and in Munich, where they boated the largest team and took 11 medals in 14 Olympic events, it seemed they would perpetuate their winning streak throughout the season.

Despite Great Britain's dominance on finals day, Germany also put on a good performance, much to the crowd's pleasure, and won the men's double sculls, the lightweight men's double sculls and the men's quadruple sculls. Germany also delighted local spectators with three silver medals: Annekatri Thiele in her international debut in the women's single, Marcel Hacker who returned triumphantly to international racing by finishing right behind Ondrej Synek of the Czech Republic, and the women's quadruple sculls of Julia Richter, Carina Baer, Stephanie Schiller and Britta Oppelt.

Coming out of retirement and back on top of his game was Denmark's three-time Olympic Champion, Eskild Ebbesen, 39, who stroked the lightweight men's four to victory.

Adaptive racing also took place at this first stage of the 2011 World Rowing Cup series. The British won two of the four adaptive events (the adaptive men's single and the adaptive mixed coxed four) while Ukraine won the other two adaptive events (the adaptive women's single and the adaptive mixed double).

By the end of the Munich regatta, Great Britain was leading Germany by 20 points: 79 to 59. The second stage of the World Rowing Cup series was also staged by Germany, this time in Hamburg, in the northern part of the country. Hamburg did everything it could to make it a successful regatta. However, an E. coli outbreak in Germany prior to the start of racing deterred several nations, including Great Britain and France, from taking part. New Zealand, who was not present in Munich, did show up, participating at its first stage of the 2011 World Rowing Cup, while Germany brought a large team representing a mix of their under-23 and top senior athletes.

The ensuing mix of nations had the effect of producing a greater mix of nationalities in the medals table. Both Argentina and Latvia made an appearance on the podium in the men's double sculls, finishing second and third respectively behind New Zealand World Champions, Joseph Sullivan and Nathan Cohen. South Africa walked away with two medals: bronze in the men's pair and silver in the women's pair.

Belarus also came through, taking bronze in both the men's four and women's double sculls. Their country's top performer, Ekaterina Karsten, again took gold in the women's single sculls.

New Zealand showed that they had lost no speed during the off-season, taking five gold medals, three silvers and one bronze, making it the most successful World Cup ever for the country. Mahe Drysdale showed that he was recovering well from recent back problems by putting on a gold medal performance in the men's single sculls.

Poland put on a solid performance to earn silver in the men's eight and in the women's double sculls, former World Champions Magdalena Fularczyk and Julia Michalska looked well back on form following injury when they took gold.

China took three medals, all of them silver, in the lightweight men's double sculls, the lightweight men's four and the women's eight.

In the end it was Germany who came away with the biggest medal haul - a haul that added 79 points to their tally and led them to the top of the overall World Rowing Cup points table. The Germans picked up gold in both the men's and women's eights. And that was just the beginning, as they picked up a medal in nearly all of the Olympic events, finishing with a total of four golds, five silvers and four bronzes.

After Hamburg, Great Britain had fallen behind Germany to take second position, and was followed by New Zealand in third with 57 points and Poland in fourth with 50 points.

The Samsung World Rowing Cup series then moved on to Lucerne, Switzerland, for its third and final stage. A huge 903 athletes entered from 51 nations with the men's single alone attracting athletes from 27 countries and the men's pair 28 countries.

Notable newcomers at this regatta were Australia and Canada, who had not yet raced internationally in 2011. Australia had come to show off some of their best athletes, including triple Olympic Champion Drew Ginn, back from a post-Beijing break to prepare for the 2012 London Olympic Games. Canada showcased their Olympic silver medallists in the men's pair, Dave Calder and Scott Frandsen, racing together internationally for the first time since the Beijing Games, and their top lightweight women's double sculls of Lindsay Jennerich and Tracy Cameron.

The British were back in force, led by Katherine Grainger who was joined by a recovered Watkins in the women's double sculls. The Australian duo of Hore and Crow, however, gave Grainger and Watkins a good run for their money but finished second. The British men's four proved to be the flagship crew on the men's side with Matthew Langridge, Richard Egington, Tom James and Alex Gregory leading from start to finish. The men's pair of Andrew Triggs Hodge and Peter Reed, however, still could not break the winning streak of New Zealand's Hamish Bond and Eric Murray - established in 2009 - and the Kiwis again won over the British, this time by a massive six seconds.

New Zealand's Drysdale and 2010 World Champion Synek met for the first time this season with Synek re-establishing his leading position and Drysdale finishing second.

The real bombshell came in the women's single sculls when uber-sculler Karsten finished out of the medals for the first time since 1999. Instead it was Emma Twigg of New Zealand who stood at the centre of the medals podium.

This regatta saw the blossoming of Germany's men's quadruple sculls. The crew of Karl Schulze, Philipp Wende, Lauritz Schoof and Tim Grohmann had been making progress all season and they put it together at Lucerne to win ahead of Australia and Great Britain. Germany also won the women's quad.

Denmark's lightweight men's four got pushed out of gold for the first time in 2011. The Danes finished in third with 2010 World Champions, Great Britain, in first, and Italy in second. Denmark also won bronze in the lightweight men's double sculls with Mads Rasmussen and Rasmus Quist.

As Lucerne drew to a close, Germany had earned the top spot on the overall medals table, a position that the Germans had not seen since 2006, with a total of 177 points. Great Britain was second (149 points) with New Zealand took third overall (113 points).

2011 World Rowing Championships (Bled, SLO)

The buzz at Bled centred on more than World Championship titles - it was all about Olympic qualification. The World Rowing Championships, held at the end of August 2011 on Slovenia's beautiful Lake Bled, doubled as the main Olympic Qualification Regatta for the London 2012 Olympic Rowing Regatta.

Olympic qualification amplified the excitement scale across the board to a level that meant some of the most dramatic races took place in the b-Finals, while races in previous rounds played out like Shakespearean tragedies.

The b-Final of the women's pair was all drama when four boats charged to the line knowing that only the top two would qualify for London. It came down to a nail-biting photo finish between perennial rivals United States and Canada with the USA just squeaking through and Canada missing out on qualification by the tiniest of margins – just 6/100th of a second. Italy, in first, must have felt great relief. They would be Italy's only female boat to grab a qualification spot.

The men's quadruple sculls has been dominated in recent years by reigning Olympic Champions and four-time World Champions Poland. Since 2009, however, a confident and youthful Croatian line-up has proven that Poland can be beaten. But Germany began to step up early in 2011 in such a way that by Bled, they had become the crew to beat. Tragedy, however, struck the Germans in the final. Only two strokes before the line, a boat-stopping crab halted the Germans' progress. This allowed the close-following Australians to not only win gold, but make history by becoming the first Australian boat ever to win this event at a world championship. Germany finished with silver, Croatia with bronze and Poland further behind in fourth. A level of redemption came for the Germans when they then became World Champions in the women's quadruple sculls ahead of the United States.

History was also made in the lightweight women's single sculls when Fabiana Beltrame became the first Brazilian ever to win a World Championship title.

The rivalry between New Zealand and Great Britain continued in the men's pair. Great Britain's top two sweep rowers, Andy Triggs Hodge and Peter Reed, have been trying since 2009 to beat Kiwis Eric Murray and Hamish Bond. Bled turned into a two-boat race with New Zealand and Great Britain far out ahead of the rest of the field. Murray and Bond, however, prevailed once again.

After 10 years of perseverance, Mirka Knapkova of the Czech Republic finally made it to the top of the medals podium in the Blue Riband women's single sculls, grabbing her first senior World Championship title. To achieve this, Knapkova had to beat the formidable Ekaterina Karsten of Belarus. As in 2010, the six-time World Champion Karsten took silver.

The Czech Republic was not so lucky in the Blue Riband men's single sculls. Ondrej Synek's winning streak, which began at the first stage of the 2010 World Rowing Cup, came to a halt when New Zealand's Mahe Drysdale overcame the Czech in the a-Final. Drysdale's win earned him a fifth World Championship title - a number that has only ever been achieved in rowing history by one other single sculler, Peter-Michael Kolbe of Germany.

In the Blue Riband men's and women's eights, the status quo remained with Germany again taking out the men's title for the third consecutive year and the United States women's eight proving once again that they were unstoppable. Under Coach Tom Terhaar and coxswain Mary Whipple, the US women have not been beaten since 2006 – an impressive run previously unheard of in this boat class. Their male counterparts however, who were Olympic Champions in 2004 and Olympic bronze medallists in 2008, shocked the rowing world when they not only failed to make the men's eight a-Final, but finished eighth overall, thereby missing out on Olympic qualification by one spot.

The women's four exited the World Rowing Championships programme following a win by the United States. This boat class has received less than the required number of entries for the past three years and will no longer be seen racing at world championship level.

Following eight days of racing, which included the new schedule of four days of finals, Great Britain won the overall team trophy as the most successful nation. The British qualified for the London 2012 Olympic Games in 13 of 14 Olympic events. This secured them a very impressive medal haul which included gold medals in three Olympic events – the women's double sculls (Katherine Grainger and Anna Watkins), the lightweight men's double sculls (Zac Purchase and Mark Hunter) and the men's four (Matthew Langridge, Richard Egington, Tom James and Alex Gregory).

In addition to Olympic class medals, Great Britain also prevailed in the international and adaptive events. This included gold in the lightweight men's pair and lightweight women's quadruples sculls. Of the five adaptive events, Great Britain took gold in two.

Second on the medals table was the comparatively small New Zealand team. The Kiwis focused on Olympic events and prevailed in smaller boats, earning a total of eleven qualification spots for London - four more than the number qualified in 2007 for Beijing. Their nine-medal haul included four golds in the men's single sculls, men's double sculls and in the men's and women's pair.

Second in the team trophy was Australia who qualified 10 boats for London, then in third was Germany with 11 qualifying boats.

Australia, aided by a couple of surprises, finished third overall on the medals table. As well as striking gold in the final strokes of the men's quadruple sculls a-Final, the lightweight men's four ousted reigning World Champions Great Britain, gaining Anthony Edwards, at the age of 38, his first World Championship title. A bronze medal in the men's four added to Australia's tally and indicated that three-time Olympic Champion Drew Ginn was undeniably on his way back to the top. Australia qualified a total of 10 boats for London 2012.

The 2011 World Rowing Championships will be remembered for the great spectator viewing of races at the start line right in Bled's township. It will be remembered for reunions of those who raced in Bled at the 1978 World Rowing Championships. It will be remembered for the spectacular landscape. And, of course, it will be remembered for the athletes that gave their all in the racing to qualify for the Olympic Games.

2011 World Rowing Championships (Bled, SLO) – Adaptive Events

The 2011 World Rowing Championships marked adaptive rowing's 10th anniversary at the world championship level and this regatta boasted the largest number of adaptive rowers ever to participate. A record 25 countries entered, six more than in 2010, with the AS men's single sculls alone attracting 17 countries.

In Bled there was the added incentive of qualifying for the Paralympic Games - 32 boats in total consisting of eight boats in each of the four Paralympic boat classes had a chance at qualifying: the AS men's single sculls (ASM1x), the AS women's single sculls (ASW1x), the TA mixed double sculls (LTAMix2x) and the LTA mixed coxed four (LTAMix4+).

The AS women's single sculls saw the return of Ukraine's Alla Lysenko who never lost a race internationally and became a World Champion in 2009. Lysenko, however, missed the 2010 World Rowing Championships, leaving room for France's Nathalie Benoit to come through as World Champion. In Bled these two champions went head-to-head, but Lysenko proved too powerful for Benoit who took second. Third place went to Israel's Moran Samuel who was competing at her first ever adaptive World Championships.

As in previous years, the AS men's single sculls was dominated by one single name - Tom Aggar of Great Britain. Undefeated since he began competing internationally in 2007, Aggar holds four World Championship titles and is the current Paralympic Champion and World Best Time holder. Aggar won again handily in Bled, although Russia's Alexey Chuvashov kept the Brit honest. The Russian held on to second while newcomer to adaptive rowing, Australia's Erik Horrie, finished an impressive third.

First-time international competitors, Xiaoxian Lou and Tianming Fei of China, caused a major upset when they won the TA mixed double sculls. Lou and Fei overcame stiff competition including last year's gold and silver medallists (Ukraine and France) and 2008 Paralympic medallists (Australia). The 2010 World Champions, Ukraine, were pushed out of the medals and into fourth while France again took silver with Australia coming back after a post-Beijing break to finish third.

The LTA mixed coxed four has turned into a clash between Canada and Great Britain. In 2009 Great Britain won but were pushed into second by Canada at the 2010 World Rowing Championships. Great Britain came back with a vengeance in Bled and despite a strong fight by the Canadians, the British secured gold.

In its third year of championship competition, the ID mixed coxed four attracted four participating crews. This boat, which is not on the Paralympic programme, is a mixed gender event and includes athletes who are intellectually disabled. Hong Kong made it a back-to-back win by defending their 2009 and 2010 titles.

At the end of the regatta, 19 nations had qualified for the London 2012 Paralympic Games, with China, France, Great Britain and Ukraine qualifying the most number of boats, each earning spots in three of the four events. Five nations - Spain, Ireland, South Korea, New Zealand and Portugal - gained Paralympic qualification spots for the first time, and five additional nations qualified in 2011 for the London 2012 Paralympic Games compared to the number of nations who qualified in 2007 for the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games.

A Final Paralympic Qualification Regatta (held in Belgrade, Serbia, from 4 to 6 May 2012), will allow two additional boats in each of the four Paralympic boat classes to have a last chance at qualifying for the 2012 Paralympic Games.

2011 World Rowing Under 23 Championships (Amsterdam, NED)

The World Rowing Under 23 Championships are a gauge for what future senior rowing will look like on the international stage in a few years' time. They are an indication of the athletes that are about to break through into the top tier of rowers.

At Amsterdam, a record 63 nations entered the under-23 championships and made a clear statement that things would only become more intense at the senior level through strength of numbers. New standards were set during the four-day regatta, with under-23 World Best Times established in all but two events.

Amsterdam's Bosbaan regatta venue is a regular host of international events. The World Rowing Under 23 Championships have been held there once already, in 2005, when the under-23 regatta first became a World Rowing Championship event. Two years later, one stage of the World Cup series was held on the Bosbaan. This year, athletes endured unseasonably cool temperatures and rain, but tail wind conditions encouraged fast times.

Of the new World Best Times that were set, perhaps the most impressive was France's Jeremie Azou, 22, who smashed the former under-23 World Best Time by nearly nine seconds in the lightweight men's single sculls, thereby also beating the senior best time in this boat class. Azou managed to build up a massive lead over Panagiotis Magdanis of Greece and Andrew Campbell, the new United States lightweight phenomenon, who finished third. Campbell, 19, went on to race to fourth at the senior World Rowing Championships later in the year.

The Latvian men's double sculls had met with success earlier in the season at the senior level. Lauris Sire and Dairis Adamaitis of Latvia were bronze medallists at the second stage of the 2011 Samsung World Rowing Cup series. Their first place on the Bosbaan meant that they successfully defended their 2010 title and also became the new under-23 World Best Time holders in this event.

Greece made it three-in-a-row when Triantafyllia Kalampoka and Christina Giazitzidou successfully defended their title in the lightweight women's double sculls. This, however, will be the last chance for the 22-year-olds to race at the under-23 level. Already, though, the duo has stepped onto the senior stage, with Giazitzidou becoming a senior World Champion in the lightweight double with another partner.

The United States women's pair of Grace Luczak and Felice Mueller clocked a World Best Time that was nine seconds faster than the previous time and, more impressively, they were not pushed. Mueller had helped set the former under-23 World Best Time in 2010 and teaming up with Luczak in 2011 gave Mueller her second under-23 World Championship title. Luczak and Mueller went on to win a second medal, bronze, in the under-23 women's eight.

There was excitement when Donata Vistartaite of Lithuania defended her 2010 title by overtaking the very talented Carina Baer of Germany to win the women's single sculls. Germany was more successful in the men's single sculls with the 203cm tall Hubert Trzybinski sprinting home to a nearly six-second margin over Bulgaria and setting a new World Best Time with his win.

Surprisingly, Germany did not make it on to the podium in the men's eight. Instead, the race went the way of the United States who set a new under-23 World Best Time at 5:24.31. In the women's eight, Canada had the best boat speed with New Zealand also getting the better of the USA who finished third. Canada earned the World Best Time resetting the benchmark at 6:03.23.

The Italians held their own in one of the most exciting finishes of the regatta, the lightweight men's four. Three boats charged for the line with less than one and a half seconds separating first, second and third. Italy scored gold, France silver and Spain bronze.

At the end of four days of racing which had finals in the 21 events spread over two days, the Germans had finished on top of the medals table with a medal tally of 13, including six golds, four silvers and three bronzes. Great Britain was next with a total of three golds won in the lightweight women's single sculls, the lightweight men's pair and the openweight men's pair. The United States followed in third with its two golds.

In 2012, the World Rowing Under 23 Championships will take place in Trakai, Lithuania, from 12 to 15 July.

2011 World Rowing Junior Championships (Eton Dorney, GBR)

Acting as a test event for the London 2012 Olympic Games, athletes at the 2011 World Rowing Junior Championships knew there was an extra degree of significance in their participation at this regatta: they got to savour the knowledge that they would be rowing on the same waters than those the best in the world would be battling on the following year to win Olympic gold.

A unique feature of the junior championships is that the majority of competitors are racing for the first time on the international stage. This means the anticipation and excitement is higher than for seasoned national team members who race at the senior level. It also means that gold, silver and bronze medal winners often share the same positive enthusiasm for their achievement.

The majority of athletes are 18 years old, the upper age for a junior rower, and this means athletes usually only have one shot at winning a junior medal. This fact is not lost on the junior athletes, again adding to the value of the medal.

The regatta attracted entries from 48 nations with Germany and the United States fielding the biggest teams including a boat in each of the 13 events.

Lucy Grinalds of the United States is unique in the fact that she, along with a small number of other competitors, did get a chance to race at the junior championships more than once. At Eton she raced at her fourth junior world championships and finally struck gold, becoming a Junior World Champion in the women's four. Grinalds' four was unique in another way: the boat included the young, 182cm tall, Mia Croonquist who, at 14, became a Junior World Champion in just her second year of rowing and first year of international competition. The United States finished fourth on the medals table with a total of two medals.

The wins at the championships covered many nations, including Italy, with sisters Serena and Giorgia Lo Bue, who were the fastest in the women's pair. Apart from the women's pair, Italy also scored gold in one of the Blue Riband events, the men's eight. This moved Italy from third place in the eight in 2009 and 2010 to World Champion position. No one felt the joy of gold more than Enrico D'Aniello, the coxswain, who had already collected two bronzes in the eight, making the gold that much sweeter. D'Aniello first coxed at the junior champs as a 12-year-old. Becoming a Junior World Champion at 15, D'Aniello sees a long rowing career ahead of him. By the end of the regatta, Italy had finished third overall on the medals table, with a tally of four medals, two of them gold.

Romania showed a renaissance in junior rowing at Eton, finishing the regatta second overall in terms of medal count, with five medals, two of them gold. The men's pair of Vlad-Dragos Aicoboae and Toader-Andrei Gontaru were one of the crews to win gold – this was their second Junior World Championship title after striking gold the previous year in the junior men's four. Romania scored its second gold medal in the men's quadruple sculls. Coach Elisabeta Lipa, who is a five-time Olympic Champion, said after the race: "I am very happy for these young boys. This is very good for us. They will be treated like little heroes."

The biggest haul of medals went to Germany who appeared on the podium in 10 out of 13 medal ceremonies. In amongst this haul were an impressive six gold medals evenly distributed between the male and female crews.

The German women's quadruple sculls, made up of first and second time national team members, comfortably defended their Junior World Championship title, although the crew boated four new members compared to the year before.

Germany made it a gold double header in the men's and women's single sculls. The men's single went to Stephan Riemekasten who earned his second Junior World Championship title after winning gold in the double last year. The women's single title went to Anne Beenken. Beenken's win, however, was overshadowed by silver medallist, Holly Nixon. Nixon's silver medal earned her the status of being the first ever Irish rower to win a medal for her country at the World Rowing junior level. An excited Nixon, 17, stated after her race: "Maybe I will get gold at the under-23s. These rowers will be around with me and as a group we will be growing up together." Overall, Germany finished first on the medals table.

To compete at the World Rowing Junior Championships, rowers must be 18 years of age or under. An athlete can compete as a junior until 31 December of the year in which she reaches the age of 18. After that date s/he shall be classified as an under-23 rower.

The World Rowing Junior Championships is partly subsidised by the rowers who take part in the World Rowing Masters Regatta - 1 Euro of every Masters Regatta entry fee is donated to support youth rowing.

2. TOP ROWERS

To be eligible to appear as a 2011 Top 10 Male or Female rower, athletes had to have been active at elite international level in 2011 by taking part at the Olympic Games, Final Olympic Qualification Regatta, World Rowing Championships or at a Rowing World Cup. All-Time Olympic and World Championship results have been taken into account with a weighting to favour Olympic medals three times higher than World Championship medals. World Championship medals in international boat classes are attributed half the value of a World Championship medal in an Olympic boat class. Ranking is then sorted according to gold medal points, then silver, then bronze. Athletes are listed in order of ranking.

World Championship medals in international boat classes are attributed half the value of a World Championship medal in an Olympic boat class. This results in a number of Gold Medal Points that decide the sort order in the table.

Where athletes have the same number of Gold Medal Points, the ranking has been tie-broken based on Silver Medal Points and Bronze Medal Points. Also for Silver and Bronze medals the same weighing factor has been applied between Olympic Games and World Championships medals.

Points system:

Olympic medal = 3 points

World Championship medal in Olympic boat class = 1 point

World Championship medal in International boat class = 0.5 point.

He may be a bit on the smaller and leaner side than most elite rowers and may appear rather innocent under his shock of blonde hair. He may have a New Zealand accent and tend to sound understated. But when it comes to rowing Hamish Bond is fast, really fast -and competitive, very competitive.

Bond worked his way through the junior and under-23 national team ranks to hit the senior level by the age of 20. A year later he became a World Champion in the men's four with the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games on his radar. Bond made the Olympic team and headed to Beijing as the stroke of the four. But their results on the Shunyi Olympic Regatta Course would change Bond's future direction in rowing.

Finishing seventh was not what the four had wanted or expected. The crew dispersed less than satisfied. Bond, aged just 22, never considered retiring but his older teammates were more affected and distanced themselves from rowing. Bond, thus, tried out the single.

The single, Bond says, really improved his fitness: "At every training session there was Mahe (Drysdale) and other guys all trying to beat each other. So every row was a challenge." Bond, however, knew that the single was not the boat for him and he contacted his teammate from the Beijing four, Eric Murray. Bond wanted to persuade him to come back and row in the pair. Murray agreed and under the guidance of New Zealand's head coach, Dick Tonks, the duo were soon recording very fast times.

Arriving in Europe for the 2009 World Rowing Cup series, Bond and Murray won the first race they entered against the formidable duo of Great Britain's top two sweep rowers, Andrew Triggs Hodge and Peter Reed. Since then Bond and Murray have not lost a single race and have come within one second of setting a new World Best Time.

In 2011 Bond, along with Murray, was voted the World Rowing Male Crew of the Year.

Eric Murray is one of the more colourful characters on the New Zealand national team. Known for his ever-changing facial hair and lively Twitter comments, Murray is one of the more senior members on the team.

Veteran of nine senior national teams, 30-year-old Murray is now up there with the most successful members of the Kiwi team. Murray first made the team as a junior back in 2000 when he says he took up the sport to overcome being the 'little fat kid' at his school. Since then he's very much grown up, has a wife, a son born last year and is a four-time World Champion.

Murray's rowing career, however, started off rather slowly. It took him six years on the national team to get onto the medals podium. It was also Murray's first season rowing with his current partner in the pair, Hamish Bond. The year was 2006 and Murray and Bond finished third at the World Rowing Cup in Poznan as part of the men's four.

Things then began to happen. The following year Murray became a World Champion in the four and, along with the crew, prepared to go after gold at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games. A seventh-place finish was not what Murray wanted and he moved away from rowing completely.

When former crewmate Bond asked Murray if he would be willing to try a pair together Murray said he would give the boat one year only. Three years later they are still together in an unbeaten combination that is now preparing to go after the top prize at the 2012 London Olympic Games. Murray and Bond have clicked in a way some of the best pair partnerships have clicked – Australia's Ginn and Tomkins, Great Britain's Redgrave and Pinsent. Murray and Bond appear unbeatable.

Murray and Bond head for the Olympics with a three-year winning streak behind them and the title of 2011 World Rowing Male Crew of the Year.

Christina Giazitzidou is a rising star in the rowing world. At age 22, she is already a two-time World Champion and three-time European Champion in the lightweight women's double sculls.

Born and living in Kastoria, Giazitzidou started her international career at the age of 16. She finished sixth at the World Rowing Under 23 Championships in the lightweight women's double sculls, and fourth at the World Rowing Junior Championships that same year in the junior women's quadruple sculls. In 2007, Giazitzidou won her first international medal at the World Rowing Junior Championships in the quad.

Giazitzidou made her first Greek senior team in 2008, and by 2009, was World and European Champion, forming a golden partnership with Tsiavou. She was also crowned World Under 23 Champion in 2009 with Triantafyllia Kalampoka, a result they repeated in both 2010 and 2011.

In 2011, whilst Tsiavou's efforts were focused on the lightweight single, Giazitzidou's were solely focused on her under-23 partnership leading up to the World Rowing Championships. She rowed the lightweight double at senior level, coming sixth in Munich at the first stage of the 2012 Samsung World Rowing Cup series and fourth at the World Rowing Cup in Lucerne. Following the World Rowing Under 23 Championships, Giazitzidou got back in the boat with Tsiavou to claim World Rowing Championship gold.

Giazitzidou believes victory on Lake Bled, in Slovenia, at the 2011 World Rowing Championships is the highlight of her rowing career, and, as the 2012 season gets under way, these two athletes are hot favourites for Olympic glory in London this summer.

Away from the rowing boat, Giazitzidou enjoys watching films and reading books by the fire at home, downhill skiing and spending time with friends and family, something she very much misses when training at the National Schinias Rowing Centre in Athens.

Greece is fast becoming a nation to be reckoned with on the international stage. At the forefront of this assault is two-time World Rowing Champion Alexandra Tsiavou, who has won a wealth of international medals and looks to add Olympic gold to her collection this summer in the lightweight women's double sculls.

Last year, Tsiavou, alongside Under 23 World Champion and partner Christina Giazitzidou, won the World Rowing Female Crew of the Year award, the first lightweight crew to do so since the World Rowing Awards were established in 2002.

Tsiavou, born in Ioannina, first started rowing in 1998 and quickly rose through the ranks. By age 15, Tsiavou competed on the international stage for the first time at the 2001 World Rowing Junior Championships in Duisburg, Germany. She medalled for the first time in 2006, winning gold in the lightweight single at under-23 level and bronze at senior level in the lightweight women's double sculls at the World Rowing Championships. Tsiavou successfully defended her under-23 title the following year. Coming sixth in the lightweight double at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China, with partner Chrysi Biskitzi was a "career highlight" for the 22-year-old.

Now, Tsiavou is a five-time European Champion, two-time World Champion and is bidding for Olympic gold. Whilst she and rowing partner since 2009 Giazitzidou are stellar together, Tsiavou is no less impressive alone. In 2011, the Greek lightweight won the lightweight single sculls at each stage of the Samsung World Rowing Cup contested, while Giazitzidou won world under-23 gold in the lightweight women's double sculls for the third time.

The World Champion trains with Giazitzidou at the Olympic Rowing Centre in Schinias, Athens for the majority of the season and resides in Igoumenitsa the rest of the time.

Off the water, Tsiavou enjoys spending time with her family, friends and boyfriend, as well as cooking, knitting and cross-training. Once a teacher by profession, she now works as a fire-fighter.

The World Rowing Adaptive Crew of the Year Award was created in 2009 and, in the first two years of the award's existence, was won by Great Britain's amazing standard-setter in adaptive rowing, Tom Aggar. As Aggar continued on his winning streak it looked to be questionable as to whether anyone would be able to top him on the awards front. In 2011, Alla Lysenko of Ukraine managed to do just that.

Lysenko's competitive rowing record is impressive. Like Aggar, she is a single sculler and, like Aggar, Lysenko remains unbeaten internationally.

Competing in the AS women's single sculls, which means competitors row with their arms and shoulders only, Lysenko has made an art of racing. In her first year of international racing, in 2009, Lysenko not only became a World Champion but also set a new World Best Time in her category. Racing over 1,000m in a time of 5:25.17 her time was a full 32 seconds faster than the previous one. It has not been broken since.

Formerly able-bodied, Lysenko, 42, suffered a spinal cord injury in a car accident in 1996. The injury also meant that both of her legs had to be amputated.

Lysenko had already tried rowing when she was a college student. After college, Lysenko says that she stopped rowing but when she went through rehabilitation from her accident, rowing became her main sport.

Lysenko's skill in the boat soon made her a member of the Ukraine's Paralympic team and she is now a full-time athlete with a schedule comparable to that of an able-bodied athlete.

Lysenko's sights are firmly set on her first Paralympic Games, London 2012, and a "goal of victory."

11. WORLD ROWING AWARDS

11.1. Thomas Keller Award

The Thomas Keller Medal is the highest distinction in the sport of rowing. It is awarded to recognise an exceptional international rowing career as well as exemplary sportsmanship and legendary aspect.

Thomas Keller (Thomi) born 1924, was elected President of FISA in 1958, at the age of 34 and was then the youngest president of an international sports federation ever. At that time he was still an active athlete himself, and he made it his principle always to give priority to the competitors' interests, an axiom which has been a guiding principle for his beloved sport ever since.

Following the 1988 Olympics, Thomi Keller spontaneously awarded the FISA Medal of Honour to Peter-Michael Kolbe and Pertti Karpinnen to commemorate one of the greatest rivalries in the history of the sport and recognising their exceptional talent and sportsmanship. This shaped the idea of the Thomas Keller Medal which was initiated by the Keller family following Thomi's passing in 1989 and first awarded to the great Norwegian oarsman Alf Hansen in 1990.

Each year, the winner is carefully selected by the Thomas Keller Medal committee, after a broad international nomination process, to ensure that the true values which Thomi so strongly believed in are represented in this award.

11.2. FISA Awards

The World Rowing Awards are a series of four distinctions which each year honour the most deserving male and female crews, as well as the coach of the year and a special medal for distinguished services to rowing which rewards an outstanding contribution to the development of international rowing.

Nominations are submitted by FISA's Council, Commissions and Staff. The shortlist is selected by FISA's Council and then put to the Executive Committee and the relevant Commission Chair person for the final decision. The awards are usually presented to the winner during the annual Gala dinner which takes place during the Coaches Conference or the World Rowing Forum.
