1. Opening of the session

FISA President Denis Oswald declared the Congress open and greeted the delegates. President Oswald thanked the Organising Committee for their excellent organisation of the Championships and preparation of the Congress. He introduced the mayor of Poznan Mr. Ryszard Grobelny who welcomed the delegates to the Poznan Congress Center.

In the memory of recently deceased rowing friends and colleagues, the President then asked the delegates to observe a moment of silence, among them:

The President provided the general information about the programme and organisation of the Congress. He reminded the delegates that they should feel free to speak but asked that they be as concise as possible. There were no questions regarding the course of the Congress or the Agenda for the Congress.

2. Identification of the delegates and confirmation of their authority

The Executive Director Matt Smith made a roll call. He then informed the delegates that, at that point, there were 54 federations represented, 42 entitled to three votes and 12 entitled to one vote making a total of 138 votes. Therefore, 70 votes would be necessary for a clear majority if all votes were utilised. A list of those present is annexed to these minutes.

3. Appointment of scrutineers for the period of Congress

The Congress unanimously accepted the President's proposal that the following individuals serve as scrutineers for this congress:

- Brenda Liski (CAN)
- Georges Lambert (BEL)

4. Approval of the minutes of the 2008 Ordinary Congress and the 2009 Extraordinary Congress

The President reminded the delegates that they were asked in a circular to submit comments to the above mentioned minutes in advance of this Congress in order to save time. No comments were received in advance, however, he invited the delegates to make comments if they wished.

As there were no remarks, the President considered these minutes as approved unanimously.

5. President's report and reports of the Executive Committee Members

The President commented on the successful staging of the World Under 23 Championships in Racice last month, and thanked the Racice Organising Committee and the Czech Republic Rowing Association. He also recognised the successful Junior Championships at the beginning of August in Brive, France and thanked the Brive Organising Committee and the French Federation. He mentioned the question of moving the finals day of the Junior Championships to the Sunday and asked the federations to give FISA their comments.

He also congratulated the organising committee and the City of Poznan for organising an excellent World Championship regatta that concluded the day before. He mentioned that Poznan was an

example for other regatta venues as they built and gained experience by organising many events leading up to the Championships.

Mr. Oswald concluded by congratulating Thor Nilsen on receiving the Olympic Order. This was a tribute to his long career in helping athletes and coaches of our sport. He mentioned that a few Council members had been elected to new positions in the Olympic movement including Khaled Zain El Din who has been elected Secretary General of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa, and Denis Masegla, now President of the French National Olympic Committee. He joined five other rowers who are presidents of their NOCs; John Coates, Australia; Mike Stanley, New Zealand; Colin Moynahan, Great Britain; Eduardo Palomo, El Salvador and José Quinones Gonzalez, Peru.

For the other members of the Executive Committee, the Vice President added her thanks again to the national federations for their support in the great achievement of having 101 federations participate in the Olympic Qualification process last year. The Treasurer had no additional comments at this point as his report is a part of the financial report which comes later in the Congress. The Executive Director had no additional comments. There were no questions and, thus, the President considered that these reports were approved unanimously.

6. Reports of the Chairs of the Specialist Commissions

The Chairs of the Commissions had no additional comments to add to their written reports, expect for the following:

- John Boulton, Chair of the Competitive Rowing Commission, announced that the Coaches Conference will take place in January 2010 in Copenhagen, instead of the usual date in November.

- Peter Morrison, Chair of the Masters Rowing Commission, announced that the Council has attributed the 2012 World Rowing Masters Regatta to Duisburg, Germany.
- Algirdas Raslanas, Chair of the Youth Rowing Commission, reminded delegates that the Youth Coaches Conference would take place in Naples in October 2009.

There were no other comments or questions and the President considered the reports approved unanimously.

7. Reports of the Continental Representatives

The President announced that the Continental Representatives had no additional comments to their reports. As the delegates had no further questions, he considered that the reports were approved unanimously.

8. Accounts, financial report and auditors' report

Mike Williams, the Treasurer, presented the accounts of FISA including the financial report and the report by PriceWaterhouseCoopers, the independent auditors. The Treasurer directed the delegates to the detailed explanations in the Agenda Papers but repeated that the surplus of CHF 392'471 for the year 2008 was the better than the expected deficit of CHF 90'610. The surplus was primarily due to higher than expected sponsorship results and exchange rate gain from the Olympic Television Rights.

He commented on the cuts in the 2009 budget that had been made following Cape Town Congress. The world economic crisis caused FISA to make cuts of approximately CHF 1'000'000 in the four year plan so that any risk of a financial shortfall

was minimised. He thanked Emilio Pastorello, FISA Controller, for his good work in maintaining and preparing the accounts. There were questions from USA and AUS related to television and sponsorship rights to which the Treasurer and the Executive Director responded.

9. Approval of 2008 Accounts

The accounts as presented were approved by the delegates in a show of voting cards and they approved unanimously.

10. Determination of entrance fee and annual subscription

No change had been proposed by the Council and the delegates did not disagree.

11. Budget for 2010

The Treasurer presented the budget for 2010. The President asked if there were any questions and there were none. He then asked for and received unanimous approval for the 2010 budget.

12. Reports on future FISA Events and Olympic regattas

The President started a chronological review of the upcoming events starting with the 2010 World Rowing Under 23 Championships in Brest, Belarus and the 2010 World Rowing Junior Championships in Racice, Czech Republic. The Chairman of the 2010 World Rowing Championship gave a short report and pointed out that their bulletin had been placed on the tables of the delegates.

13. Place and date of the 2010 Ordinary Congress

The President proposed that the 2010 Ordinary Congress would take place on Monday, 8 November 2010 in Hamilton, New Zealand following the World Rowing Championships. This was approved by the delegates.

14. Attribution of future FISA Events in accordance with Rule 5

Attribution of the 2013 World Rowing Under 23 Championships – The Council decision was to support the sole candidate Trakai presented by the Lithuanian Rowing Federation. The Congress supported this decision unanimously. As there were no candidates with the required financial guarantees, the attribution of the 2014 World Rowing Junior Championships was postponed for the 2010 Congress.

Attribution of the 2013 and 2014 World Rowing Championships – The Council explained its wish to attribute the 2013 and 2014 World Rowing Championships in Circular No. 4 and it received no objections. So, the President concluded, the Council has decided to move ahead and attribute both events at this Congress.

The candidates for the 2013 and 2014 events were Brandenburg GER, Chungju KOR and Amsterdam NED. The president announced that the first attribution will be the 2013 Championships. Mike Tanner, Chair of the Events Commission, explained the Council's decision to present Chungju as the candidate of choice for 2013. Jean-Christophe Rolland, Chair of the Athletes Commission, presented the position of the Athletes Commission which was to support the Council

decision.

The delegate from the German Federation asked for a secret ballot which was supported by six federations. A secret ballot was held and the result was 96 votes in favour of the Council decision for Chungju, 42 votes against. The result is that Chungju is attributed the responsibility of hosting the 2013 World Rowing Championships. The representatives of the Korean Rowing Federation and government authorities then signed the Event Agreement in front of the delegates.

The President then spoke to the question of the 2014 World Rowing Championships. The Council report presented the technical arguments in support of the candidacy of Amsterdam by the Netherlands Rowing Federation. He asked if any delegate had a question or remark about the Council proposal. The delegate from German Federation withdrew the candidacy of Brandenburg for 2014.

The British delegate David Tanner expressed some concerns from the coaches about the fairness of the course in Amsterdam and asked the Dutch representatives to respond to these concerns. The delegate from the Netherlands Eric Nieve responded by saying that in 2002 the Bosbaan regatta course was widened to include eight lanes. The Bosbaan has hosted two FISA Championships since then without any disruptions of racing and promised that a well-known university in the Netherlands is examining the issue as well.

John Boulton, Chair of the Competitive Rowing Commission, expressed the fact that all artificial regatta courses have problems from time to time and this is why there are contingency scenarios to deal with this issue. A member of the Competitive Rowing Commission Henk-Jan Zwolle will be following this issue closely. The vote was strongly in favour, with one federation abstaining and no federation opposing. The 2014 World Rowing Championships were attributed to Amsterdam. The representatives of the Netherlands Rowing

Federation and government authority then signed the Event Agreements in front of the delegates.

15. Reports on applications for affiliation and voting consequent thereon

No requests were received.

16. Reconsideration or Confirmation of decisions (ref. Art. 32) taken by the Council in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of Art. 44 or by the Executive Committee in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 of Art.50

No requests had been received at the deadline.

17. Executive Committee Elections, in accordance with Articles 39 and 48

Elections were held for the offices of President, Vice President, Treasurer and the Council representatives on the Executive Committee.

President: Denis Oswald was re-elected for a further four-year term by standing ovation. At this point, he received a large bouquet of flowers from the organizing committee as congratulations for his 20 years as FISA President.

Vice-President: Anita DeFrantz was re-elected for further four-year term by acclamation.

Treasurer: Mike Williams was re-elected for a further four-year term by acclamation.

Council representatives: Tricia Smith, John Boulton and Jean-Christophe Rolland were re-elected for a further four-year term by acclamation.

18. Specific Proposals from the Member Federations, the Council or the Executive Committee

There were no specific proposals received.

19. Other Items proposed by Member Federations, the Council or the Executive Committee

a. Comments on the 2008 Olympic Qualification System and proposals for the 2012 Olympic Qualification System

The Executive Director summarized the arguments presented in Circular No. 4. There were three options presented in this paper; one is status quo from 2008, the second option affected the Men's eight and Women's Quadruple sculls and the third option which had a number of changes.

The Chair of the Competitive Rowing Commission John Boulton presented some of the arguments about the second alternative proposal. The Chair of the Athlete's Commission Jean-Christophe Rolland presented some of the arguments about the third alternative proposal.

The President asked the Swiss Federation if they had a position on these three proposals. The delegate from the Swiss Federation expressed the view that the alternatives did not completely satisfy their concerns, but he did raise the financial issues related with delaying more qualifications to the Olympic year and, therefore, supports option one. He further proposed exchanging women's heavyweight places for women's lightweight places to better, in his view, correspond to the distribution of lightweight and heavyweight men's events. There was a correction to be made in the chart presenting alternative three, there should be 3 each of the Men's Lightweight doubles and fours qualifying at the final qualification regatta.

Several delegates then took the floor and expressed their support for the first alternative.

The President thanked all delegates for their comments and suggestions. The Council would take all the points into consideration when they finalise this issue at the beginning of 2010.

20. Any other items proposed by the Council or the Executive Committee

None were proposed.

21. Report of the Development Programme

The report was submitted in the Agenda papers. Anita DeFrantz and Thor Nilsen were ready to answer any questions or respond to any comments. The delegate from the Portuguese Federation took the floor and proposed that federations receiving money from FISA be obliged to participate at the World Championships. He suggested that money was lost with the present system by not obliging their participation.

The Vice President Anita DeFrantz responded to say that financing for the development programme was cut back this year so support was limited. She emphasized that it was most important that programmes in the countries keep going in these difficult period. The President pointed out that there were record participations at the Under 23 and Junior Championships this year which did demonstrate progress in the area of development.

Several delegates took the floor to show their support of the policies and projects carried out by the FISA Development Programme, some having participated in it for up to 20 years. The Australian delegate Pat McNamara informed the congress of a commitment to development from representatives of the federations of Australia,

Italy, Germany, France, Great Britain, Canada and the United States. They had discussed several possible actions that they could take to assist FISA in these efforts but have not yet concluded on a combined action. He asked for FISA to suggest some actions that the large federations could take.

Development Director Thor Nilsen responded that many of the big federations have supported the Development Programme tremendously. Many of the big federations are often asked for support and they respond positively. He also pointed out that many developing nations are not on the same level as the existing nations but it is a big motivation to compete against countries on the same level down in finals D, E and F. He also pointed out that development is a difficult process, some steps forward and then a few steps back. Most often financing is connected to Olympic qualification from the sports ministries and national Olympic committees.

22. Any other business

- a. Adaptive Boat Weights – The Chair of the Materials Commission Paul Fuchs reported on a change in the minimum eights for adaptive boats for singles from 22 kgs to 24 kgs, doubles from 36 to 37 kgs and fours would stay at 51 kgs and the fours could be bow or stern coxed in the future.
- b. Anti-Doping Rules – The Chair of the Sports Medicine Commission Alain Lacoste announced the launch of “Real Winner”, an on-line educational tool in multiple languages. He also reminded the delegates that there were significant changes in the World Anti-Doping Code related to the use of the on-line system from WADA called ADAMS.

- c. Wind at Racice – The Belgian delegate Georges Lambert asked for the report on the adverse weather event in Racice. The report would be distributed next week.
- d. Coaching Education Course – The Egyptian delegate reported that the FISA Coaching Development Programme course has been translated into Egyptian.
- e. 2011 Rowing World Cup regattas – The Executive Director reported that the Council has selected the locations for the 2011 Rowing World Cup will be Munich, Hamburg and Lucerne.
- f. 2012 Rowing World Cup regattas – There are still negotiations about the venues of the 2012 Rowing World Cup regattas. The British delegate asked about the time frame for the regattas. The Executive Director reported on the dates which would be three weeks earlier than the usual dates. It was still unclear whether the qualification regatta would be concurrent with the second Rowing World Cup regatta or starting the weekend before in the existing format.
- g. Women’s Fours – The Australian delegate pointed out that the women’s four was at risk due to the natural death rule for 2010. He asked if there were any other boats facing the natural death. The Executive Director reported that there were two events in Poznan that had six or fewer entries and they were the lightweight women’s quad and the women’s four. In 2008, there were seven women’s fours and seven lightweight women’s quads which would mean that these boats were not in danger for 2010.
- h. Iranian delegate – The delegate from Iran asked that FISA issue certificates that confirm that boats produced by boat builders comply with minimum quality standards so that national federations are assured of

quality. He also suggested a small fee on the boat builders that could assist FISA with its development programme.

23. Closing

The President thanked the delegates for their excellent co-operation. He also expressed his gratitude to the Polish Rowing Association and the Poznan Organising Committee for their excellent organisation of the Congress as well as to the FISA staff for their preparation of the Agenda Papers. He also thanked the interpreters for their excellent work.

He declared the 2009 FISA Ordinary Congress closed at 13:05 hrs.
