1. Opening of the session

FISA President Jean-Christophe Rolland declared the Congress open and greeted the delegates. He also welcomed the Honorary President Denis Oswald. The Council members were then introduced to the delegates.

The President mentioned the tragedy that took place on Wednesday, 21 August 2019 when Belarus Para Rower Dzmitry Rushkevich passed away. As the investigation was ongoing, no more details could be mentioned at the time of the Congress. And, as a tradition at the Congress, in memory of recently deceased rowing friends and colleagues, the President then asked the delegates to stand and observe a moment of silence.

Referring to the 2019 World Rowing Championships just completed, the President congratulated the organising committee for the excellent championships, especially in a context of a record number of entries and high participation linked with the first 2020 Olympic and Paralympic qualification event. He commented on the great performances and the extremely exciting races. He also mentioned the unfortunate incident that led to a re-row and the unexpected, sudden cross wind gusts that penalised a few crews. Horst Anselm, Chair of the organising committee, thanked the delegates for their support and efforts to make the championships a success.

The President provided general information about the organisation of the Congress. He reminded the delegates that the Congress was being filmed and live streamed on the internet, that they should feel free to speak but asked that they be as concise as possible. The President reminded the delegates also that a member federation (MF) conference was scheduled to take place immediately following the Congress. There were no questions regarding the proceedings of the Congress or the Agenda for the Congress.

For the first time, due to the large number of event attributions and elections at this Congress, an electronic voting service had been provided to help stay within the planned time. The Executive Director explained to the delegates how to use the electronic voting handheld device. The electronic voting cards were distributed to the delegates. A test vote was then carried out.

2. Identification of the delegates and confirmation of their authority

The Executive Director Matt Smith made the roll call. He then informed the delegates that, at that point, there were 53 federations represented, with 45 entitled to three votes and 8 entitled to one vote making a total of 143 votes. Therefore, 72 votes would be necessary for an absolute majority if all votes were cast. This was the status at the time of the event attribution vote. A list of those present is annexed to these minutes.

3. Appointment of scrutineers for the period of Congress

The Congress unanimously accepted the President's proposal that the following individuals serve as scrutineers for this congress:

4. Approval of the minutes of the 2018 Ordinary Congress

The President reminded the delegates that they were asked to submit any comments to the above-mentioned minutes in advance of this Congress. No comments had been received but he invited the delegates to make comments, if they wished.

As there were no remarks, the President considered the minutes of the 2018 Ordinary Congress as approved unanimously.

5. President's report and reports of the Vice President, Treasurer and Executive Director

The President had no additional remarks to complement his report for the year 2018.

Referring to the Olympic Strategy described in the report, the President informed the delegates that an update on the Olympic Programme and the preparation of the 2020 FISA Extraordinary Congress would be made at the MF conference immediately following the Congress.

The President added a comment on the successful 2019 rowing season. He specifically mentioned the success of the World Junior Championships as a test event for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games, thanks to the great support and contribution of JARA, the Japanese Rowing Federation.

In regards to FISA's engagement and leadership for sustainability he mentioned the signature of the commitment for Sport against Climate Change with the United Nations, and the renewal of the partnership with WWF.

The Vice President, Treasurer and Executive Director had no additional comments, and there were no questions about their reports. The President considered these reports as approved unanimously.

6. Reports of the Chairs of the Specialist Commissions

The Chairs of the Commissions had no additional comments to add to their written reports. There were no other comments or questions and the President asked the delegates if he could consider the reports approved and asked if there were any who disagreed. No delegates disagreed and the reports were considered as approved.

7. Reports of the Continental Representatives and Co-opted Members

The President announced that the Continental Representatives and the Co-opted members had no additional comments to their reports. As the delegates had no further questions, he considered that the reports were approved unanimously.

8. Accounts, financial report and auditors' report

The Treasurer Gerritjan Eggenkamp, presented the accounts of FISA including the financial report and the report by PriceWaterhouseCoopers, the independent auditors. The Treasurer directed the delegates to the detailed explanations in the Agenda Papers and reiterated that the accounts of 2018 showed a surplus of CHF 35'330 on total expenditure of CHF 7'435'987. He added that this surplus was decreased by a provisional booking of CHF 722'919 to reflect an unrealised decrease in the value of bonds and securities at the lower of purchase price or

market value and a loss on exchange rate of CHF 48'650 as required under Swiss law, thus creating a reported loss of CHF 736'239. The details of the finances are found in the financial report of the Agenda Papers.

He thanked the FISA staff for the good work in maintaining costs and preparing the accounts. The President asked if there were any questions for the Treasurer. There were none.

9. Approval of the 2018 accounts

The 2018 accounts as presented were approved by a vote of the delegates: Yes 133, No 3, Abstain 6. The 2018 accounts were approved.

10. Determination of entrance fee and annual subscription

No change had been proposed by the Council and the delegates did not disagree.

11. Budget for the following year, 2020

The Treasurer presented the budget for 2020 which showed estimated expenditures of CHF 5'538'001 with estimated income of CHF 5'538'001. The President asked if there were any questions and there were none. He then asked for a vote of the delegates. The result of voting was Yes 134, No 0, Abstain 9. The 2020 budget was approved.

12. Reports on future FISA events and Olympic and Paralympic regattas

The President informed the delegates that the organising committees for events for the coming two years had distributed their bulletins to the delegates. Four presentations were made by future organising committees during the Congress:

- 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Tokyo, JPN
- 2020 World Rowing Senior, Under 23 and Junior Championships, Bled, SLO
- 2021 World Rowing Championships, Shanghai, CHN
- 2019 World Rowing Coastal Championships, Hong Kong China, HKG

Otherwise, all relevant information for all upcoming events is available in the bulletins, on the FISA website, and on the organising committees' websites.

13. Place and date of the next Congress

The President proposed that the 2020 FISA Ordinary and Extraordinary Congresses be held from 14 to 17 October 2020 in London.

There were no other proposals and the President considered this to be approved by the delegates.

14. Attribution of future World Rowing Championships in accordance with Rule 6

This agenda item was complemented by a replacement page in the Agenda Papers with information on the Strategic Event Attribution Process leading to votes for the following events:

- a. 2023 World Rowing Championships
- b. 2025 World Rowing Championships
- c. 2024 World Rowing Senior, Under 23 and Junior Championships
- d. 2021, 2022 World Rowing Junior Championships, 2022, 2023 World Rowing Under 23 Championships

a. 2023 World Rowing Championships – the candidates were:

- i. Belgrade, Serbia
- ii. Poznan, Poland
- iii. Trakai, Lithuania

A vote was taken on the Council's recommendation of Belgrade, in accordance with Rule 6, with the following result: Yes 110, No 30, Abstain 3. The Congress attributed the 2023 World Rowing Championships to Belgrade, Serbia.

b. 2025 World Rowing Championships – the candidate was:

- i. Sydney, Australia

This candidacy was subject to a final positive evaluation by the New South Wales government which, unfortunately, followed the Congress. A provisional vote was taken subject to a positive funding decision by the government with the following result: Yes 113, No 27, Abstain 3 (note: due to unanticipated budget reduction requirements, the decision of the NSW government was negative so this event will be attributed in the next bidding process).

c. 2024 World Rowing Senior, Under 23 and Junior Championships – the candidates were:

- i. Linz-Ottensheim, Austria
- ii. St. Catharines, Canada

A vote was taken on the Council's recommendation of St. Catharines, in accordance with Rule 6, with the following result: Yes 106, No 33, Abstain 3. The Congress attributed the 2024 World Rowing Senior, Under 23 and Junior Championships to St. Catharines, Canada.

d. 2021, 2022 World Rowing Junior Championships, 2022, 2023 World Rowing Under 23 Championships – the candidates were:

2021 World Rowing Junior Championships

- i. Varese, Italy
- ii. Plovdiv, Bulgaria

(note: the 2021 World Rowing Under 23 Championships were attributed to Racice, Czech Republic in 2018)

2022 World Rowing Junior and/or Under 23 Championships

- i. Varese, Italy
- ii. Plovdiv, Bulgaria

2023 World Rowing Under 23 Championships

- i. Plovdiv, Bulgaria

(note: discussions have started with the French Rowing Federation and appropriate French government authorities regarding staging the 2023 World Rowing Junior Championships as a test event for the 2024 Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games regatta)

The Council asked the Congress to delegate its authority to the Council to attribute the above Championships so that the goals established for the SEAP could be more closely achieved, that is, for a maximum number of regatta venues around the world to be selected to stage World-level events over the four-year period. A vote was taken on the above question and the result was: Yes 113, No 24, Abstain 3. The Congress therefore authorised the Council to attribute these Championships.

15. Reports of Continental Rowing Confederations and other Member Groupings

Reports were received from FISA recognised Continental Rowing Confederations (COPARE – the Americas, and ORCON – Oceania), and Member Groupings (CDLJ – Europe, and CSAR – South America). These reports were included in the Agenda Papers. There were no questions or comments.

16. Reports on applications for affiliation and voting consequent thereon

One new rowing federation had submitted an application for membership of FISA:

- Dominica

The President confirmed that all documentation was in order. A vote was held on this application for membership with the following result: Yes 133, No 0, Abstain 10. FISA now has 156 member federations.

17. Reconsideration or confirmation of decisions (ref. Art. 31) taken by the Council in accordance with the provisions of Art. 33 and paragraph 4 of Art. 46 or by the Executive Committee in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of Art. 52

No requests had been received at the deadline.

18. Council and Executive Committee elections in accordance with Articles 40 and 50

Elections were staged for the following positions in accordance with Article 40 of the FISA Statutes:

1. Chair of the Athletes Commission

Candidates: Julien Bahain (CAN)
Robin Prendes (USA)
Frida Svensson (SWE)

Frida Svensson was elected with 83 votes, Julien Bahain received 30 votes and Robin Prendes received 16 votes.

2. Chair of the Equipment and Technology Commission

Candidate: Paul Fuchs (USA)

Paul Fuchs was elected, with the following result: Yes 113, No 12, Abstain 0

3. Chair of the Rowing for All Commission

Candidate: Guin Batten (GBR)

Guin Batten was elected, with the following result: Yes 117, No 10, Abstain 0

4. Chair of the Sports Medicine Commission

Candidate: Dr Juergen Steinacker (GER)

Juergen Steinacker was elected, with the following result: Yes 121, No 10, Abstain 0

5. Chair of the Women's Rowing Commission

Candidate: Jacomine Ravensbergen (NED)

Jacomine Ravensbergen was elected, with the following result: Yes 124, No 9, Abstain 1

6. Chair of the Youth Rowing Commission

Candidate: Algirdas Raslanas (LTU)

Algirdas Raslanas was elected, with the following result: Yes 133, No 3, Abstain 0

Elections were staged for the following position in accordance with Article 50 of the FISA Statutes:

7. Election of one Commission Chair to the Executive Committee

In the convening notice for this Congress, it was announced that Lenka Dienstbach-Wech had reached the term limit for Chair of the Athletes Commission and could not seek re-election. Following the above Council elections, in accordance with Article 50, the Council met to select a candidate to present to the Congress, to complete Lenka's term on the Executive Committee, until 31 December 2021.

The Council selected Eva Szanto (HUN), Chair of the Events Commission, to present to the Congress for vote.

Eva Szanto was elected, with the following result: Yes 130, No 6, Abstain 0

The President expressed his sincere thanks to Lenka Dienstbach-Wech for her long and dedicated service to the Athletes Commission and announced that the Council had decided to appoint her as a Co-opted member of the Council for a term ending on 31 December 2020.

The President then reported that the Council had appointed Mehdi Garidi (ALG) as the replacement for Khaled Zein Eldin (EGY) as Continental Representative for Africa for a term ending on 31 December 2020. Honorary President Denis Oswald presented a tribute to the more than 20 years of service by Khaled.

The President also announced that the Asian Continental Representative Liu Aijie had asked to step down from his position by the end of the year. FISA will ask the Asian member federations to propose candidates by email.

19. Specific Proposals to an existing agenda item from the Member Federations, the Council or the Executive Committee

No proposals were received by the due date.

20. Other additional agenda items proposed by Member Federations, the Council or the Executive Committee

1. Article 18 – Continental Rowing Confederation application

An application for recognition was received from the European Rowing Confederation. The Council confirmed that the application fulfilled all requirements and presented it to the Congress for approval. A vote was held with the following result: Yes 133, No 0, Abstain 3. The European Rowing Confederation is now the recognised Continental Confederation for Europe.

2. Proposal received from AUS, CAN, GBR and USA

These MFs proposed an independent working group to assess further options “to secure Olympic and Paralympic inclusion for the long term”. The Council agreed to form working groups in two key areas: National Media Rights and Creation of Innovative Events. Terms of Reference will be developed at the conferences taking place in November in London.

21. Any other business

The following points were addressed:

1. 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Qualification Events – the dates and locations of these events were presented on the big screen.
2. Conferences - the dates and locations of several upcoming conferences were presented on the big screen.
3. SEAP - the full SEAP attributions were presented to the delegates. There were a few gaps that would be filled in a “repechage” round that would end at the Council meeting in January 2020. As well, it was announced that the Indoor Championships and the

Coastal Championships bid processes would take place in early 2020 for attribution mid-2020.

4. Safeguarding – Lenka Dienstbach-Wech provided the delegates with an update on FISA's initiatives to safeguard participants in rowing from harassment and abuse in sport, including the introduction in 2019 of the FISA Safeguarding Policy and Procedures. Delegates were asked to complete and submit a brief one-page questionnaire regarding safeguarding within their own MF prior to leaving the Congress room.

The President thanked the delegates for their excellent co-operation. He also expressed his gratitude to the Linz-Ottensheim organising committee for their excellent organisation of the Congress. He also thanked Matt Smith and the FISA staff for their preparation of the Congress and the Agenda Papers. He also thanked the interpreters for their excellent work.

The President declared the 2019 FISA Ordinary Congress closed.
