### 1.3. 2010 World Rowing Season – Highlights

#### World Rowing Championships (Karapiro, NZL)

Seldom is the World Rowing Championships staged in the Southern Hemisphere, so when it is, it's a big deal. The last time was 1990 when Lake Barrington in Tasmania, Australia, played host. This time Lake Karapiro in New Zealand was the venue and so, to make the most of warmer spring weather, these championships were held later than usual, at the end of October. Forty-nine nations made the trek Down Under'.

The World Rowing Championships stretches over eight days and traditionally all finals have been raced on the last two days. In a move to cater for television and spectator viewing, finals were spread over the last four days.

Adaptive finals were first up. Tom Aggar of Great Britain proved again to be the shining light of adaptive rowing. He broke his own World Best Time in the men's heat of the arms and shoulders men's single sculls and then won the final handily to become a three-time consecutive World Champion.

It took technical superiority to win on the second day of finals when choppy water played over the 2000m course. France (Macquet, Chardin, Despres and Mortelette) caused a dramatic upset when they pushed reigning World Champions Great Britain out of first. The British finished out of the medals as an on-form Greece and a fired-up New Zealand stormed through to second and third respectively.

The biggest upset of the championships, however, involved the solo scullers. The relatively petite Frida Svensson of Sweden took on the statuesque multi World and Olympic Champion Ekaterina Karsten of Belarus in the women's single sculls, and won. The men's single sculls also witnessed a changing of the guard when Ondrej Synek (CZE) beat four-time World Champion Mahe Drysdale (NZL) to the line.

Croatia's youthful, but adept, men's quadruple sculls – Sain, Martin and the Sinkovic brothers – rounded out a splendid season by adding their first World Champion title to their world under-23 titles. This result bodes well for the Croatians in future battles with Olympic Champions, Poland, who did not race in New Zealand.

Buoyed by the home crowd, New Zealand pulled off a double-header, winning both the men's and women's pairs. New Zealand last hosted the World Rowing Championships in 1978 and on that occasion the nation picked up just one medal. This time the Kiwis walked away with 10 medals – three of them gold.

Katherine Grainger and Anna Watkins completed an unbeaten season with a win in the women's double sculls at Lake Karapiro. This continued Grainger's reign as Great Britain's most successful woman rower ever and the match-up with Watkins looks to be a partnership that could go down in rowing history.

The blue riband men's and women's eights rounded out the 2010 season and saw current World Champions – the United States women and the German men – reinstate their dominance. The USA, coxed by Mary Whipple, never really had to sprint, with Canada pushing into second and former eights dominator, Romania, managing to finish third. Martin Sauer, coxswain of the German men, took his crew to the lead at the start and raced from the front for the entire 2000m. Australia and Great Britain fought for second with the British sprint rewarding them with silver.

At the end of the regatta Great Britain had come through at the top of the medals table.

## **World Rowing Cup Series (Bled, SLO; Munich, GER; Lucerne, SUI)**

This was the season of Great Britain with Team GB sending large numbers to all three World Rowing Cup regattas and collecting enough medals throughout the season to not only become the overall World Cup winners, but also earn more than double the points (231) of their nearest contender – Germany who finished in second (109).

The British medal rush was ably assisted by the nation's top two women scullers, Katherine Grainger and Anna Watkins. By the end of the season the duo had collected an impressive five golds and a silver from racing in the women's double and quadruple sculls. This is the first time a tally like this has been achieved in the 13 year history of the World Rowing Cup series.

The three-regatta series kicked off in May on Lake Bled, Slovenia. Bled is the venue for the 2011 World Rowing Championships and the first leg of the World Rowing Cup series consequently served as a test event for the championships. Slovenia has a soft spot for rowers as their first ever Olympic gold medal was achieved in the sport of rowing by Luka Spik and Iztok Cop at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games. Cop calls Bled his training home and the stunning lake venue has already hosted three world championships (1966, 1979, 1989).

Great Britain started off the season with a bang winning seven gold medals including both the men's and women's eights. The win in the men's eight heralded the return of 1992 Olympic Champion, Greg Searle.

In the men's single sculls, Bled signaled the beginning of the ascent of Ondrej Synek of the Czech Republic. Synek went on to win at all three World Cup regattas. The domination of women's single sculler, Ekaterina Karsten of Belarus continued with Karsten, 38, also winning all three races in the series.

China used the World Cup series to experiment with new crew combinations mixing experience with new blood. This included Bin Tang from her country's 2008 Olympic Champion quadruple sculls racing now in the single and taking bronze in Bled.

Second in the Rowing World Cup series, Munich, Germany, attracted 40 nations with large teams from China, Great Britain and Germany. This regatta showed the return to top form of Olympic Champions Zac Purchase and Mark Hunter (GBR) in the lightweight men's double sculls. They beat reigning World Champions New Zealand to claim the gold – one of five golds won by Great Britain in Munich.

New Zealand showed their pair power and gave a glimpse of things to come by taking out the gold in both the men's and women's pairs in Munich. The new combination of Rebecca Scown and Juliette Haigh absolutely dominated their women's race while Eric Murray and Hamish Bond continued to deny the top British pair (Andrew Triggs Hodge and Peter Reed) of gold. Murray and Bond went on to hold the Brits in second spot again at the final stage of the World Rowing Cup.

As is customary, the final World Rowing Cup regatta was raced on the beautiful Rotsee in Lucerne, Switzerland. Lucerne attracted a record number of nations – a total of 54 – with more than 900 athletes competing in a packed three days of racing. Great Britain, again, led the way on the medals table but suffered a couple of upsets when lightweights Purchase and Hunter lost to New Zealanders Uru and Taylor. New Zealand was not so lucky in the men's single. This was Mahe Drysdale's first major race of the season, as he fought off back troubles, and it ended in a bronze medal.

Germany, who finished second overall, struck gold again in the men's eight and also showed promise in the lightweight men's double sculls with the youthful duo of Lars Hartig and Linus Lichtschlag taking silver. The country's top single sculler, Marcel Hacker medalled at the first two World Cups and then opted out of the remainder of the season for personal reasons.

This season saw a reshuffling of racing with finals ending in a one hour block of 'Blue Riband' events – the men's and women's singles and the men's and women's eights. The goal was for better television broadcasting and spectator enjoyment and the feedback was positive.

The World Rowing Cup series was launched in 1997, and includes all 14 Olympic boat classes as well as international events. The overall World Rowing Cup winners are determined after a series of three regattas. Germany has dominated the series since its beginning. Great Britain, however, upset the trend and has won for the past four years.

### **World Rowing Under 23 Championships (Brest, BLR)**

The city of Brest, on the western border of Eastern Europe's country of Belarus, was the venue for 58 nations to compete at the World Rowing Under 23 Championships.

The under-23s is considered a stepping stone for athletes who are aiming for their nation's senior national team and the regatta has been growing every year since it became a World Championship in 2005. Nearly 900 athletes entered in 2010 – a record number of participants.

Germany regularly excels at the under-23 level and this year was no exception with German athletes picking up 12 medals – five of them gold – from the 21 events contested. Germany won the prestigious men's eight and also took gold in the women's quadruple sculls and double sculls and men's single sculls and lightweight men's quadruple sculls.

Winner of the men's single, Karl Schulze is an example of the methodical German progression system. Schulze comes through to the under-23s from racing successfully as a junior on Germany's national team. For Schulze this year's under-23s was his fourth and he added a first gold to his collection of under-23 medals. A few months later Schulze raced for the first time at senior level at the 2010 World Rowing Championships.

The Greeks showed their love of the lightweight double sculls winning both the men's and women's event. For the women (Triantafyllia Kalampoka and Christina Giazitzidou), it meant successfully defending their 2009 title. Giazitzidou then went on to claim bronze at the senior World Rowing Championships.

But it was the United States who showed the biggest progress compared to achievements in previous years. Along with Germany, the United States sent the biggest team of 69 athletes, each covering all 21 events. Their women's pair of Ashley Kroll and Felice Mueller were the only crew to set a new World Best Time at this regatta. The pair standard is now 7:14.07, breaking the dominating Romanian record set four years prior.

The emerging rowing nation of Iran again experienced success led by their promising lightweight single sculler Mohsen Shadi Naghadeh. Naghadeh won the lightweight men's single last year and capped off his under-23 reign with another gold at Brest. This win was impressive as Naghadeh had to beat Great Britain's senior squad member Peter Chambers to win. Chambers finished second.

The Croatian men's quadruple sculls continued their dream run by defending their 2009 under-23 title. This quad came together in 2009 and soon found success, not just at the under-23 level, but also at the senior level, as they went on to become the senior 2010 World Champions. There is no doubt the crew of David Sain, Damir Martin and brothers Valent and Martin Sinkovic are a crew to watch and that they are a major threat to current Olympic Champions, Poland.

The Brest regatta course is a 10-laned international standard rowing course. The rowing centre was completed in 2007 and two years later it hosted its first international event, the European Rowing Championships. The under-23s was the second international regatta staged at this venue and marks the growing desire by the Lukashenko-led government to vigorously support sport.

### **World Rowing Junior Championships (Racice, CZE)**

The World Rowing Junior Championships is renowned for its exuberant racing and just as exuberant crowds. In 2010, the championships served as a warm-up for some of the competitors who went on to race at the inaugural Youth Olympic Games.

In 2010, at the Czech Republic's premier rowing venue in Racice, the German team proved once again that their system works when it comes to junior rowing. Despite huge entries at the junior championships (216 crews from 50 countries), Germany managed to qualify for 12 of 13 finals and win medals in 10 of them. Highlights included gold in both the men's and women's single sculls - Felix Bach defended his title in dominating style while Judith Sievers came through at the 1,000m mark to lead until the end. Judith Sievers won gold again at the Youth Olympic Games in Singapore shortly after.

But Racice was not all about Germany. Romania has always been a country with a strong rowing tradition at the international level and their women's pair kept the tradition alive. Alexandra Bizom and Elena-Oltita Hrisca came into the final as favourites and outclassed the field, including the strong Greeks and Germans, to take gold. This turned out to be one of two gold medals for Romania who also won the men's four.

Azerbaijan made history by earning their first medal ever in a junior world event. The medal was in the men's pair with Radoslav Drenovski and Aleksandr Glotov, taking a proud bronze for their country. The United States marked a milestone by medalling for the first time in 36 years in the men's single; Andrew Campbell was the sculler behind this achievement. Switzerland also hit a landmark by earning their first gold medal in 16 years at a junior event, in the junior men's coxed four.

Greece continued its rise up the rowing ranks as a nation. They secured four medals, including gold in the men's pair. Michalis Nastopoulos and Apostolos Lampridis went on to win silver a few weeks later at the Youth Olympic Games.

This was the first year for finals to be spread over the last two days of racing, with the Blue Riband women's and men's eights racing last each day. Great Britain's women's eight beat the favoured United States crew. Although usually strong in the men's eight, the United States had only just made it to the final by finishing second in their repechage. But they put it all together on finals day to beat Germany and Italy (second and third respectively) at the line.

To compete at the World Rowing Junior Championships, rowers must be 18 years of age or under. The World Rowing Junior Championships is partly subsidised by the FISA Masters Regatta which donates 1 Euro of every Masters Regatta entry fee to support youth rowing.

## 2. TOP ROWERS

To be eligible to appear as a 2010 Top 10 Male or Female rower, athletes had to have been active at elite international level in 2010 by taking part at the World Rowing Championships or at a Rowing World Cup. All-Time Olympic and World Championship results have been taken into account with a weighting to favour Olympic medals three times higher than World Championship medals. World Championship medals in international boat classes are attributed half the value of a World Championship medal in an Olympic boat class. Ranking is then sorted according to gold medal points, then silver, then bronze. Athletes are listed in order of ranking.



These Medal Tables weight Olympic medals three times higher than World Championship medals in Olympic boat classes. World Championship medals in international boat classes are attributed half the value of a World Championship medal in an Olympic boat class. This results in a number of Gold Medal Points that decide the sort order in the table.

Where athletes have the same number of Gold Medal Points, the ranking has been tie-broken based on Silver Medal Points and Bronze Medal Points.

Points system:

Olympic medal = 3 points

World Championship medal in Olympic boat class = 1 point

World Championship medal in International boat class = 0.5 point.

She took the driver to court and won a settlement, and a taxi tribunal subsequently revoked the driver's license.  
 After the birth of her children her degenerative condition left her almost totally blind, with about three percent sight. So she "turned to sport to help combat her loss of vision». She jumped in a boat after reading online that Toronto's Argonaut Rowing Club were starting a programme for people with disabilities."

## 11. WORLD ROWING AWARDS

### 11.1. Thomas Keller Award

The Thomas Keller Medal is the highest distinction in the sport of rowing. It is awarded to recognise an exceptional international rowing career as well as exemplary sportsmanship and legendary aspect.

Thomas Keller (Thomi) born 1924, was elected President of FISA in 1958, at the age of 34 and was then the youngest president of an international sports federation ever. At that time he was still an active athlete himself, and he made it his principle always to give priority to the competitors' interests, an axiom which has been a guiding principle for his beloved sport ever since.

Following the 1988 Olympics, Thomi Keller spontaneously awarded the FISA Medal of Honour to Peter-Michael Kolbe and Pertti Karpinnen to commemorate one of the greatest rivalries in the history of the sport and recognising their exceptional talent and sportsmanship. This shaped the idea of the Thomas Keller Medal which was initiated by the Keller family following Thomi's passing in 1989 and first awarded to the great Norwegian oarsman Alf Hansen in 1990.

Each year, the winner is carefully selected by the Thomas Keller Medal committee, after a broad international nomination process, to ensure that the true values which Thomi so strongly believed in are represented in this award.

## 11.2. World Rowing Awards

The World Rowing Awards are a series of four distinctions which each year honour the most deserving male and female crews, as well as the coach of the year and a special medal for distinguished services to rowing which rewards an outstanding contribution to the development of international rowing.

Nominations are submitted by FISA's Council, Commissions and Staff. The shortlist is selected by FISA's Council and then put to the Executive Committee and the relevant Commission Chair person for the final decision. The awards are usually presented to the winner during the annual Gala dinner which takes place during the Coaches Conference or the World Rowing Forum.
