1 General

1.1 Introduction

The European Rowing Championships was the first international regatta organised by the World Rowing Federation, FISA, after its foundation in 1892. The championships are one of the oldest pan-continental sporting events. First staged in Orta, Italy in 1893, the continental championships was then organised almost annually until 1973.

In 2007 the European regatta was reintroduced into the international rowing calendar. The demand for this event proved clear and in 2013 the event was moved to the beginning of the rowing calendar, between the first and second World Rowing Cups. It has experienced ongoing popularity and increased participation in this new time-slot.

For this year the event has been integrated as a part of the inaugural European Championships, a multi-sport event to be held every four years in August. In 2018, there are two host cities, Berlin and Glasgow, with seven sports taking part: athletics, aquatics, cycling, golf, gymnastics, rowing and triathlon. These sports will compete over a period of ten days, from 2 to 12 August 2018.

The rowing event will be held in Strathclyde, just outside of the Scottish city of Glasgow from 2 to 5 August 2018. The venue was built on Strathclyde Loch for the Commonwealth Games in 1986. Since then, it has hosted a range of national and international competitions, including the 1996 World Rowing Junior Championships, the 2005 masters regatta and the 2007 World Rowing Under 23 Championships.

The European Rowing Championships are open to the 46 European national rowing federations, including Israel. The programme consists of the 14 Olympic boat classes and three International boat classes (lightweight men's and women's single sculls and lightweight men's quadruple sculls).

In 2017, 34 nations took part with more than 500 athletes. Of those nations, 19 made it to the medals podium. Italy topped the medals table for the first time since 2012. They earned the title by winning gold in the men's pair, men's four and men's double sculls. They also won one silver and four bronze medals. In second place was Romania with three golds and one silver. And tied for third equal were the Czech Republic and Germany.

The European Rowing Championships are monitored and managed by the European Rowing Management Board (ERMB). Their responsibilities have grown to include the European Rowing Junior Championships (held 26-27 May 2018 in Gravelines, France), the European Indoor Rowing Championships (organised annually in January) and in 2018 the European Rowing Under 23 Championships (1-2 September 2018 in Brest, Belarus).

In 2019 the European Rowing Championships will head to Lucerne, Switzerland. The regatta will go back to its usual calendar spot from 31 May to 2 June 2019.



About Strathclyde

Strathclyde is an area of the Scottish city, Glasgow. Strathclyde, which means 'Valley of the River Clyde' was one of nine former local Government regions, located on the west coast and was the largest of all the regions.

Built on Strathclyde Loch, the 2000m, 8 lane international class rowing lake was first built for the Commonwealth Games in 1986. The Scottish Rowing Centre has state-of-the-art facilities both on and off the water and has hosted a range of national and international competitions including the Scottish National Championships, the 1996 World Rowing Junior Championships and the 2005 World Rowing Masters Regatta.

3 Who to watch

3.1 Who to watch

Women's pair (W2-)

The European Championships will see 11 crews compete in the women's pair, but as many of the top international crews hail from outside Europe, the podium will be up for the taking in Glasgow. The Netherlands have entered their bronze medal crew from World Rowing Cup I and they are likely to be leading the pack.

The Dutch will have to watch out for the challenge coming from Romania. Romania has entered a new line-up of Madalina Beres and Maria Tivodariu. Beres has several medals in the women's pair with her former partner Laura Oprea. She has teamed up with Tivodariu who won the pair at the 2017 World Rowing Junior Championships.

Other contenders are likely to be Italy's line-up of Sara Bertolasi and Alessandra Patelli. This duo finished second behind New Zealand at the second World Cup of the season, closely followed by Great Britain's second crew of Rowan McKellar and Harriet Taylor. These two seem to have won selection and are entered again in Glasgow.

Men's pair (M2-)

The 2018 season has been a thriller for the men's pair. Three different crews have seen the top of the podium at the three World Cups. In Belgrade, it was the Sinkovic brothers from Croatia. In Linz, it was the Czech pair of Jakob Podrazil and Lukas Helesic. And in Lucerne, it was the New Zealanders.

In Glasgow, the crew to watch is Martin and Valent Sinkovic. But the Sinkovics will not have an easy time of it. France has entered their all-star crew of Theophile and Valentin Onfroy. They were silver medallists at the 2017 European Championships and they finished in the same position at the third stage of the World Cup. Italy has entered a new line-up of Vincenzo Abbagnale and Matteo Lodo. Lodo is reigning European and World Champion in the men's pair with former partner Giuseppe Vicino.

Watch out too for Serbia. They finished with a bronze medal at last year's European Championships and have had a-final finishes at the World Cups so far this year. And don't forget about Great Britain. They took a bit of time to select their crew but have had success so far this season.

Women's double sculls (W2x)

The early-season leaders of Roos de Jong and Lisa Scheenaard of the Netherlands are back in the double together and looking for a top performance in Glasgow. Scheenaard claimed a silver medal at the 2017 European Championships with then-partner Marloes Oldenburg. Scheenaard and de Jong have been racing well together so far this season and look to be the crew to beat.

Lithuania has entered their combination of Ieva Adomavičiūtė and Milda Valčiukaitė. This duo has seen scattered podium success and they are regularly in the final. The 2017 European Champions in this boat class was the Czech Republic. Lenka Antosová and Kristýna Fleissnerová had an outstanding performance in front of home crowds. They have not been able to repeat their gold medal, but they will be looking to do so in Glasgow.

Men's double sculls (M2x)

The men's double sculls saw an incredible sprint finish at the final stage of World Rowing Cup III last month. Poland first, Germany second and Switzerland third. Poland's crew of Mirosław Ziętarski and Mateusz Biskup are not strangers to the podium. They were silver medallists at the 2017 European Championships and have picked up a host of medals along the way.

Germany has not entered their double of Lars Hartig and Timo Piontek, but a younger combination of Max Appel and Stephan Riemekasten. We'll have to see if these two are able to match the speed of Hartig and Piontek.

Switzerland has also changed their line-up from the last regatta, World Rowing Cup III. Barnabé Delarze is now paired with Nico Stahlberg putting Roman Roeoesli back into the single. These three rowers have all seen success in various line-ups and it looks like it must be hard to pick the crew.

Watch out too for Great Britain. They won the second stage of the World Cup series and although they didn't race in Lucerne, they should be medal contenders in Glasgow.

Women's four (W4-)

The women's four is the new Olympic boat class and it has sparked great interest around the world. Great Britain and the Netherlands have posted successful line-ups so far this season, although line-ups seem to be changing.

The Dutch crew who won gold at the first World Cup of the season has been broken apart and replaced by a new line-up. The British crew that won silver at the second World Cup has also changed. And so has the Danish line-up that won silver at the third World Cup. Keep an eye on Romania. They have a strong women's sweep programme and will look for a podium finish in Glasgow.

Men's four (M4-)

Reigning European Champions Italy has entered the same line-up as last year and should be the crew to beat. However, they had a disappointing performance at the second World Cup in Linz-Ottensheim, finishing in the b-final.

A big challenge should come from the Netherlands. The Dutch took some time to settle on a line-up during the World Cup series, but the final combination scored silver at World Rowing Cup III and the same line-up is entered in Glasgow.

Watch out too for Romania. They have had medal finishes already this season and despite some inconsistent performances, they could finish in the medals. Don't forget Germany. Their men's four is typically a feeder boat for the men's eight, but this line-up has seen success so far this season.

Women's single sculls (W1x)

All eyes will be on Jeannine Gmelin of Switzerland. After her rise to the top in 2017 and World Champion status, she hasn't lost an international race. The closest it came to Gmelin being beaten was at the World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne. Sanita Puspure, the 36-year-old from Ireland, pushed Gmelin right to the line.

Puspure has regularly finished in the final and really seems to be coming into her own. Her speed in Lucerne shows that she might have what it takes to be on top of the podium.

Watch out too for Magdalena Lobnig of Austria. Lobnig finished second at the second World Cup in Linz-Ottensheim and has a European Championship title from 2016. She will definitely be in medal contention. And don't forget reigning European Champion Victoria Thornley of Great Britain. She was not able to find early-season speed, but Thornley is likely to be pushed on by the home crowd.

Lightweight women's double sculls (LW2x)

The Dutch crew of Ilse Paulis and Marieke Keijser won the World Cup series, “from the couch” as they posted on their Instagram account. They won the first two stages of the event and, despite not rowing at the third stage, they still had enough points to take the title. They are the crew to beat in Glasgow.

Poland is looking good. Weronika Deresz is the European Champion and has a new partner this year of Joanna Dorociak. The duo finished first at World Rowing Cup III.

Switzerland has entered their bronze medal winning crew from Lucerne, Frederique Rol and Patricia Mertz. If this duo is able to maintain their speed, they are likely to be in contention for a medal again in Glasgow. Watch out too for Great Britain. They took some time to make their final selection, but the support from the home crowd might just put them into contention.

Lightweight men's double sculls (LM2x)

This is always hotly contested and the 19 boats entered in Glasgow are no exception. All eyes will be on the World Rowing Cup III winners from Lucerne, the O'Donovan brothers. The O'Donovan's typically race from behind and pull out a sprint in the last 500 metres. But in Lucerne, they raced from the front earning a large lead.

Gary and Paul O'Donovan will be watching the Belgian crew of Tim Brys and Niels van Zandweghe. Belgium was on the podium at all three World Cups this season. Italy is also likely to be in hot contention for a medal. The Italians won the second stage of the World Cup season, the only one in which they were entered.

Don't forget about Norway either. They came second at the second stage of the World Cup and will be looking to repeat this performance. The only question mark is the French crew. They are reigning European and World Champions, but with Jeremie Azou's retirement, Pierre Houin has been joined by Thomas Baroukh. The crew hasn't found the podium yet, but perhaps they will in Glasgow.

Women's quadruple sculls (W4x)

The 2017 European title went to Germany, just ahead of the Netherlands. Germany has completely changed their line-up for 2018 and they have been climbing the ranks over the World Cup season. The Germans finished on top of the podium twice. But there will be a lot at play in the boat class.

The Netherlands have been mounting their effort throughout the season. They won gold at the first world cup, tried two different line-ups, and seem to be satisfied with the current combination. Men's quadruple sculls (M4x)

The men's quadruple sculls is a fast boat class. The a-finals often see all six boats finish within a few seconds of each other. On any given day, the order in which they cross the line can change. Great Britain managed the win at the last World Cup in Lucerne, showing they are definitely on-form this season.

Reigning European Champions, Lithuania finished sixth, but only a few seconds behind Great Britain. Lithuania has made a key change in their line-up by putting the experienced Rolandas Mascinskas back in. There are now three of the four members that won at last year's event. The Netherlands won silver in Lucerne and are definitely medal contenders for Glasgow. They've kept the same line-up.

Watch out too for Germany and Poland. Poland finished with a bronze medal in Lucerne and have seen quite some success in this boat class. Germany has been working to find medal success again, after having an historically successful men's quad. Their line-up seems to be going well so far this season.

4 2018 Current season highlights

4.1 Current season summary

With all three World Rowing Cups completed, the European Rowing Championships is the last test for European crews before the World Rowing Championships at the beginning of September. Here is how it has shaped up for European crews so far this season.

Topping the World Cup points table by winning 130 points over the series of three events was Germany. The flagship event for Germany is the men's eight. They managed to take the title at all three World Cups, despite coming under serious pressure from Australia at the final stage in Lucerne. Germany also had a strong showing in the women's quadruple sculls, working their way from a third-place finish at the first World Cup, to gold at the second two stages. They were put under pressure by Poland and the Netherlands.

Germany also posted two of the fastest men's single scullers so far this season with Tim Ole Naske and Oliver Zeidler. Both scullers medalled over the three World Cups, with Zeidler beating Naske and finishing with a silver medal in Lucerne. Zeidler managed to beat the World Champion from the Czech Republic, Ondrej Synek, in the final sprint.

The German men's double won the World Cup series by finishing third at the first World Cup and second at the other two World Cups. Also, the Germans showed success in lightweight rowing, winning the lightweight women's single sculls and the lightweight men's quadruple sculls at World Rowing Cup III.

Coming in second on the World Rowing Cup points table with 127 points was the Netherlands. The Dutch started the season in style by winning ten medals at the first World Cup. However, their dominance was tempered as more countries joined the mix at the second and third World Cups. They continued to win medals in the lightweight women's double, the women's double, the women's quadruple sculls, the women's eight, the men's four, the men's quadruple sculls

and the men's eight. Their most successful crew was the lightweight women's double (Ilse Paulis and Marieke Keijser) who won both the first and second World Cups but did not participate in the third.

Great Britain finished third on the World Cup points table with 104 points. Great Britain did not have one dominating crew, but they managed to collect points consistently across all categories. The British men's quadruple sculls was the only crew to top the World Cup standing for a boat class. They won both the first and the third World Cups but finished in the B-final at the second stage of the series.

Italy entered one of the three World Cups and saw medal success there, winning four golds, two silver and three bronze. They fared especially well in the lightweight categories by winning gold in the lightweight men's double, the lightweight women's double and the lightweight men's quadruple sculls.

In the women's single sculls, Switzerland's Jeannine Gmelin continues to dominate. She won all three World Cup titles, plus the Princess Royal Challenge Cup at the Henley regatta. Switzerland also picked up medals in the lightweight women's double, lightweight men's single and men's double sculls at World Cup III.

The men's pair saw the all-dominant Croatians being dethroned at the second World Cup when the new crew from the Czech Republic topped the podium. This shifted again at the third World Cup when New Zealand finished on top. Croatia, the Czech Republic and France are the European crews that have performed best so far this year.

The Filippi Spirit Award encapsulates rowing's core values of fairness, teamwork, inclusiveness, timeless and environmental awareness. It recognises the achievements of the next generation of rowers.

The award is open to university rowers worldwide and is given to the rower that best demonstrates the core values of rowing in his/her social, academic and sporting life.



Filippi Boats has been involved with the award since its inception. The university rowing club of the winner receives a custom-built, top-of-the-range Filippi eight racing shell. The boat recognises the winner's involvement in the club and is designed to help the club develop young rowers.

A call for nominations for the 2018 Filippi Spirit Award will open in September 2018. To qualify, the applicants must have attended university full time in the 2018 year and row regularly for a university club.

Filippi Lido S.R.L. (also known as Filippi Boats) is a rowing racing boat manufacturer based in Donorotico, Italy. Since 1980 Filippi has produced top Olympic-class rowing boats.
