

1 General

1.1 Introduction

The European Rowing Championships was the first international regatta organised by the World Rowing Federation, FISA, after its foundation in 1892. The championships are one of the oldest pan-continental sporting events. First staged in Orta, Italy in 1893, the continental championships were then organised almost annually until 1973.

In 2007, the European regatta was reintroduced into the international rowing calendar and in 2013 it was moved to the beginning of the rowing calendar allowing it to grow in participation and popularity.

This year, the European Rowing Championships is the only major senior-level regatta to take place due to the coronavirus outbreak. The championships was postponed from the original date in June and is now taking place in the first week of October.

The European Rowing Championships is open to the 46 European member federations, including Israel. The programme consists of the 14 Olympic boat classes and three International boat classes (lightweight men's and women's single sculls and lightweight men's quadruple sculls).

In 2019, the event was held in Lucerne, Switzerland and saw record numbers of entries with close to 600 competitors from 36 countries. Germany topped the medal table, with gold medals in five boat classes. They defended their title in the men's eight and won the men's single sculls and lightweight men's double sculls. Germany also showed prowess in women's sculling by winning the women's double sculls and the women's quadruple sculls.

A number of European Best Times were set during the event, including the women's four, which was won by the Netherlands. The Netherlands finished second on the medal table with seven medals, including two gold, and Italy picked up two gold medals to finish third overall.

The European Rowing Championships is monitored and managed by the European Rowing Board (ERB). Their responsibilities have grown to include the European Rowing Junior Championships (26-27 September 2020 in Belgrade, Serbia), the European Rowing Under 23 Championships (5-6 September in Duisburg, Germany), and the European Rowing Indoor Championships (held 11 January 2020 in Prague, Czech Republic).

Next year, the European Rowing Championships will head to Varese, Italy. Varese has become a regular on the international rowing circuit. The regatta will take place from 9-11 April, 2021.



About the venue

Lake Malta regatta course is located in the centre of Poznan. It is one of the most modern venues in the world and over the last 20 years has hosted large international events in water sports. Poznan hosted the 2007 European Rowing Championships, the 2009 World Rowing Championships, the 2015 European Rowing Championships and World Rowing Cups in 2016 and 2017.

Set in the midst of an active leisure centre, the course offers excellent facilities for teams and spectators. Surrounding the venue are numerous recreational installations such as a summer skiing slope, paths for jogging and rollerblading, and volleyball courts. It is a favourite outdoor spot for locals year-round.

The City of Poznan is central to many commercial and trade events and regularly hosts international visitors. Experience everyday Polish life by visiting the picturesque market square full of bar and restaurant terraces.

Media parking

Parking is available for media near the venue, at the entrance of the Malta Venue from Baraniaka Street. Please note that it is paid parking.

Media facilities

The media centre will be open the following times: Thursday 08 October 12:00hrs - 18:00hrs, on racing days (09-11 October) from 07:00hrs. Please note that the venue officially closes at 18:00hrs to allow the disinfection and cleaning of the venue to take place. The Media Centre will remain open for 1 hour after the close of the venue, but all media are required to be off venue by 19:00hrs on Friday 09 October. On Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 October, the Media Centre will close at 18:00hrs.

TV commentator and radio commentator positions are situated in the media grandstand and should be booked in advance through <http://www.worldrowing.com/mediacenter/>

The usual facilities are available to the press in the media area:

Accreditation

All media accreditations should be submitted through World Rowing at <http://www.worldrowing.com/mediacenter/>. Last-minute media accreditation requests should be made directly to media@fisa.org. All filming and broadcasters (whether national or international) need to be approved by World Rowing.

A media accreditation confirmation email will be sent to media having requested accreditation for this event. Accreditation can be collected on site upon arrival at the venue.

Photographers & TV camera operators

There will be a photographer shuttle service running from the media centre to the start area. Information on the schedule and the booking process will be available at the media centre. Due to Covid-19 restrictions at the venue, only ten photographers are permitted in the start area at one time. This will be managed on a first come, first served basis at the media centre.

Bibs must be worn to distinguish accredited photographers from private/non-professional photographers or TV camera operators. These bibs must be worn throughout the event. They are handed out upon a deposit of 50 Euros.

Filming equipment needs to be approved by World Rowing and be identified with an event logo sticker that must remain clearly visible. Accredited camera teams must contact World Rowing in the media centre upon arrival and sign a Filming Request Form in order to receive an accreditation sticker for their equipment.

Covid-19 Information

All members of the media must have read the Organising Committee Covid-19 Protection Plan (available online: <https://www.erch2020.eu/covid>). Any accredited person is required to submit a Pre-Event Health Questionnaire to the Organising Committee at covid@rowing.poznan.pl, between 02-04 October before their arrival in Poznan. Wearing a face covering or mask that covers the mouth and nose is mandatory anywhere in the accredited areas at the venue, including in the start area.

In case of violations against the Event Infection Protection Plan, World Rowing and the Organising Committee reserve the right to remove the participant's accreditation and expel him/her from the venue for the remainder of the event.

3 Who to watch

3.1 Who to watch

Women's pair (W2-)

Eleven crews are entered in the women's pair, including the defending champions from Spain, Aina Cid and Virginia Diaz Rivas. This is definitely the pair to beat, although they will face some serious challengers.

Romania finished with the silver medal last year, but they have a new-look combination of returning Adriana Ailincai and new partner Iuliana Buhus. Buhus comes out of the 2018 bronze-medal winning Romanian women's four. Watch out too for the young Greek crew. The Greeks recently finished second at the European Rowing Under 23 Championships. And don't forget about the Dutch double of Marloes Oldenburg and Carline Bouw. Together the two hold a host of medals, however they have not often competed together in the pair.

Men's pair (M2-)

The men's pair has drawn an impressive 14 boat entry including the defending European Champions, the Sinkovic brothers of Croatia. The race, however, is far from a done deal. Back to challenge the Sinkovics are the 2019 silver and bronze medallists from Romania and Spain respectively.

The Romanian combination of Ciprian Tudosa and Marius-Vasile Cozmiuc have had impressive performances at the European level, but they found themselves in the B-final at last year's World Rowing Championships. The Spanish have had more consistent results, with a fifth-place finish last year at the World Championships, enough to qualify them for the Tokyo Olympic Games.

Watch out too for the Italian combination of Giuseppe Vicino and Matteo Lodo. They finished in fourth, ahead of the Spanish, at last year's World Rowing Championships.

Women's double sculls (W2x)

The Romanian double has kept their 2019 line-up, which may give them the advantage over the field. They finished second at both the 2019 World and European Rowing Championships. Germany took the gold at the 2019 European Rowing Championships and have kept Leonie Menzel in the boat. She will now row together with national team stalwart, Annkatrin Thiele. Thiele is an extremely experienced sculler with a bucket of medals to her name including Olympic Champion. The Dutch are back with their line-up of Roos de Jong and Lisa Scheenaard. This duo finished third at the 2019 World Rowing Championships after racing separately much of the season due to injury in the Dutch team. And don't forget about the French and the Italians. They have both had podium finishes in the last few years and are definitely contenders.

Men's double sculls (M2x)

This boat class sees one of the largest entries in Poznan with 19 crews competing. The Polish men's sculling team saw significant success in the 2019 season even though their line-ups regularly changed. Miroslaw Zietarski was part of the double that won at the 2019 European Rowing Championships together with Fabian Baranski. Baranski was replaced by Mateusz Biskup for the 2019 World Rowing Championship and the double finished third. Zietarski and Biskup are set to compete in Poznan and in front of a home crowd, they will be going for gold.

Watch out for the Swiss double of Barnabe Delarze and Roman Roeoesli. They took silver at last year's European Championships, but finished out of the medals at the World Championships. Romania took bronze at the 2019 Europeans and have returned in 2020 with the same line-up. Keep an eye too on the Irish combination of Ronan Byrne and Daire Lynch. Byrne took a surprise silver together with Philip Doyle at the 2019 World Rowing Championships. With Lynch in for Doyle, will the double be able to reach the podium?

Women's Four (W4-)

The women's four has an impressive 12 entries. This boat class has gained significant popularity since it became an Olympic event for the Tokyo 2020 Games. As such, the leaders are not set in stone and the podium is not easy to predict. The Dutch are probably the crew to watch in Poznan. They are defending European Champions and finished second at the 2019 World Rowing Championships. They have retained the same line-up and look to be going strong.

Romania took silver at the 2019 European Championships, but they come to Poznan with a completely new-look crew. Watch out too for Poland. They have a small stack of medals in their pockets and will be racing with a home advantage. And don't forget about Denmark. They set the early standard in the women's four and have been building ever since.

Men's four (M4-)

Poland is definitely the crew to beat in the men's four. They are reigning World Champions and European silver medallists. They have retained the same line-up and have a home advantage meaning their chance of a podium is exceptionally high.

Watch out too for Romania. They took silver at last year's World Championships and also return with the same line-up. And keep an eye on Italy. The Italians have had inconsistent results, but their crew has quite a pedigree and they will be looking to medal at the one on-water event of the 2020 season.

Women's single sculls (W1x)

Sanita Puspure came blasting through the ranks in 2018 to claim her first World Championship title. She successfully defended it last year as well as claiming the 2019 European Championship title. Puspure is certainly the one to watch heading into Poznan.

But hot on her tails is Switzerland's Jeannine Gmelin. Gmelin rose in the ranks in 2017 and has been consistently on the podium ever since, including a silver at the 2019 European Championships behind Puspure. Watch out too for Austria's Magdalena Lobnig who has frequently medalled at the European Championships.

Men's single sculls (M1x)

This blue ribband event attracted 23 entries and the big European names are back. Of course, all eyes will be on the German Oliver Zeidler. After finding his footing, the young Zeidler roped in gold at the 2019 World and European Championships. With another year under his belt, can anyone stop him?

There are certainly some great contenders. Norway's Kjetil Borch is the 2018 World Champion and finished third last year after some ups and downs in the 2019 season. Denmark's Sverri Nielsen blasted onto the scene in 2018 and finished second at the World Championships.

Keep an eye too on Jakub Podrazil from the Czech Republic. He comes out of the men's pair, but has an impressive time on the indoor rowing machine and if he can translate that power in the single, he might just surprise. And don't forget about Croatia's Damir Martin. Martin has struggled with injury in this Olympiad, but you never know when he might pull off the spectacular.

Lightweight women's double sculls (LW2x)

The favourites must be the defending European Champions from Belarus, Alena Furman and Anastasiia Ianina. But the Belarussian double have not posted the most consistent results; they finished sixth at last year's World Rowing Championships. France and Switzerland finished second and third respectively at the 2019 European Rowing Championships and are both back with the same combinations and another year of training.

The Dutch double of Marieke Keijser and Ilse Paulis did not compete at last year's European Championships due to injury, then went on to finish second at the World Rowing Championship. They are likely to be going for gold in Poznan. And, of course, keep an eye on the Romanian combination of Ionela-Livia Cozmiuc and Gianina-Elena Belega. They've had some ups and downs, but still have a stack of medals in their pocket.

Lightweight men's double sculls (LM2x)

The lightweight men's double sculls is always a tight race. Over the last few years there has been a handful of crews that land in the top six, but the order at the finish has varied greatly. At the 2019 European Rowing Championships it was Germany's Jason Osborne and Jonathan Rommelmann to take the top spot, followed by Italy and Belgium. The World Rowing Championships saw a shake-up with Ireland taking the top spot, Italy in second and the Germans back in third.

The 16 boats entered will be fighting for those top spots. The only notable absence is that of the Irish. Germany, Italy and Belgium are all in the running and watch out too for Spain and Denmark - both are frequent finalists.

Women's quadruple sculls (W4x)

At the 2019 European Rowing Championships, the Germans finished on top, followed by the Netherlands, Ukraine and Poland. This order flipped at the World Rowing Championships, when Poland finished second ahead of the Netherlands and Germany (Ukraine did not compete). All four crews are lining up in Poznan.

The Polish have kept their 2019 line-up and are the only crew to do so. Germany made one change from their World Championship crew with Carlotta Nwadije replacing Michaela Staelberg. The Dutch have replaced Sophie Souwer with Laila Youssifou, while Ukraine has a completely new-look crew. These four crews are likely to be in the final, but in what finishing order?

Men's quadruple sculls (M4x)

Naske has become a member of the German men's sculling squad and shifted into the bigger boats after being knocked out of the men's single sculls by Oliver Zeidler.

3.2 International boat classes

Lightweight Women's Single Sculls (LW1x)

There are 11 entries in the lightweight women's single sculls and it is a young field. Keep an eye on the Dutch Martine Veldhuis. She raced in the final at last year's World Rowing Championships and watch out for Switzerland's Sofia Meakin who boasts a fourth-place finish at the 2019 European Championships.

Lightweight Men's Single Sculls (LM1x)

The lightweight men's single sculls has seen impressive entries due to several top names coming out of the lightweight double. The Irish have sent World Champion Fintan McCarthy to race in the single in the absence of his double's partner Paul O'Donovan. Similarly, Norway's Kristoffer Brun is set to compete in the single. Watch out too for the young Niels Torre from Italy who recently won at the under-23 level and outraced 2019 World Champion in the lightweight men's single, Martino Goretti, to claim his spot.

Lightweight Women's Quadruple Sculls (LW4x)

The lightweight women's quadruple sculls will be a race between Italy and Germany. Italy might have the slight upper-hand on paper, but it will all come down to the final.

Lightweight Men's Quadruple Sculls (LM4x)

The lightweight men's quadruple sculls is a four-boat field, but it will be a tough one to call. In the absence of an Italian crew, it might be Germany to top the podium. Austria has also put together top teams in this category and the Netherlands comes with a new-look line-up.

3.3 Para-rowing boat classes

Para PR1 Women's Single Sculls (PR1 W1x)

The European Rowing Championships also offers the four Paralympic events. In the PR1 women's single sculls all eyes will be on 2019 World silver medallist Nathalie Benoit of France. Watch out too for Ukraine's Anna Sheremet and Germany's Sylvia Pille-Steppat who are both regular A-final finishers.

Para PR1 Men's Single Sculls (PR1 M1x)

The PR1 men's single sculls sees the return of 2019 World Champion from Ukraine, Roman Polianskyi. Polianskyi is definitely the favorite, but he will face a big challenge from world silver-medallist Alexey Chuvashv from Russia.

Para PR2 Mixed Double Sculls (PR2 Mix2x)

The PR2 mixed double sculls sees the return of the world silver medallists from the Netherlands Corne de Koning and Annika van der Meer. Watch out too for the French duo of Perle Bouge and Christophe Lavigne. They finished third at the 2019 World Championships and now have had another year of rowing together. Keep an eye too on Ukraine who are regular A-final finishers.

Para PR3 Mixed Coxed Four (PR3 Mix4+)

The PR3 mixed coxed four has a five-boat entry and in the absence of Great Britain, all eyes will be on the Italian crew. Italy finished third at the 2019 World Championships and has kept the same line-up. Watch out too for Russia who finished fifth at the 2019 World Championships.
