





The European Rowing Championships has a history that goes back to 1893. After a lapse it was reinstated in 2007 and it has grown in stature ever since in both numbers and calibre of athletes. We expect around 500 athletes from more than 40 nations to attend and also a large number of spectators.

I would like to thank the organising committee and the large number of volunteers without whom this event would not be possible. I would also like to welcome the stars of the show, our athletes, their support staff and, of course, the fans and supporters to Munich and its environs for a great four days of racing.

1.2 Introduction

European Rowing is steeped in history. The European Rowing Championships was the first international regatta organised by World Rowing and it's one of the oldest pan-continental sporting events.

First staged in Orta, Italy in 1893, it was organised almost annually for the next 80 years. In 2007 the European regatta was reintroduced and the demand was clear from the beginning. Five years later it was moved to the start of the rowing season, following World Rowing Cup I, where it fitted in well with the international season. It has experienced ongoing popularity and increased participation ever since with on average over 500 athletes competing from more than 30 European countries.

As with all sporting events, the last two seasons have been disrupted by the Global Pandemic. In 2020 the European Rowing Championships was the only senior-level regatta to take place, albeit later in the year than originally planned.

For 2021 the event took place in Varese, Italy with 629 athletes competing from 35 countries. The men's single sculls had the most entries with 26 nations competing and comprised the cream of single sculling. European Champion Sverri Nielsen of Denmark raced against Kjetil Borch of Norway, Oliver Zeidler of Germany and Greece's Stefanos Ntouskos. Zeidler won the race. Ntouskos went on to become the Olympic Champion in Tokyo later that year. Great Britain topped the medals table winning 12 medals and host nation Italy were second with the Netherlands in third.

The championship is open to the 46 European national rowing federations, including Israel. The programme consists of the 14 Olympic boat classes, the lightweight single, pair and quadruple sculls and the para PR1 single sculls, PR2 mixed double sculls and PR3 mixed coxed four. There are the same number of boat classes for women and men.

In 2018 the European Rowing Championships joined into the inaugural European Championships. This multi-sport event was held in Berlin and Glasgow with seven sports taking part: athletics, aquatics, cycling, golf, gymnastics, rowing and triathlon. Rowing took place at Strathclyde Loch in Glasgow. This was built for rowing at the 1986 Commonwealth Games.

The European Championships is held every four years and rowing has joined again for this second edition held in Munich. From across Europe more than 4,700 athletes are competing in beach volleyball, athletics, canoe sprint, gymnastics, triathlon, table tennis, sport climbing, cycling and, of course, rowing.

The rowing regatta venue is the Munich Olympic Regatta Centre in Oberschleissheim. Home of the 1972 Olympic rowing regatta, the centre has regularly held world-class events since. The course features eight lanes covering 2000 metres.

Added to the schedule for the first time at the European Championships is para rowing which will see competition in the four Paralympic boat classes.

The European Rowing Championships is monitored and managed by the European Rowing Management Board (ERMB). Their responsibilities have grown to include the European Rowing Under 19 Championships (21-22 May, Varese, Italy), European Rowing Under 23 Championships (3-4 September, Hazewinkel, Belgium), European Rowing Coastal and beach Sprint Championships (27-30 October, San Sebastian, Spain).

Next year the European Rowing Championships will be held in Bled, Slovenia. Beautiful Lake Bled is a regular regatta venue on the international circuit. The regatta will take place from 25-28 May 2023.

1.3 A look at Munich

It was an ambitious project and one that would create a rowing venue for the Munich 1972 Olympic Games. Several locations were considered. In 1969 Oberschleissheim was chosen due to its closeness to the City of Munich and also its ability to be used after the Olympic Games.

Construction began in September 1969 with the venue opening less than two years later. It was designed as a multi-functional park and included a 9000-seat grandstand. This remains a landmark and an iconic symbol for the world of rowing. The entire venue is now under Landmark Protection.

Much of the original sights and sounds from 1972 can still be seen today. The old signage is present around the venue and most of the buildings are still in their original shape and design.

One change from 1972 is the environmentally precious nature embedded in the Dachauer Moos landscape which has been developed over the decades. The original architect, Michael Eberl and the landscape designer Georg Penker, created a unique setting specifically designed to fit perfectly in the surrounding moorlands.

The venue has been in constant use since the 1972 Olympic Games and is the home for four rowing clubs as well as several other sports clubs like canoeing. It has hosted many international rowing events including the 1981 and 2007 World Rowing Championships and more recently, in 2021, the European Rowing Junior Championships.

One of Germany's top men's single scullers, Marcel Hacker trained at the Munich venue for many years. Hacker was an Olympic medallist and former World and European Champion. He retired after the Rio 2016 Olympics. Following in Hacker's footsteps is Germany's newest and best men's single sculler, Oliver Zeidler. The 26-year-old World and European Champion uses Munich as his training base.

It is one of the busiest regatta venues in Europe and the clear water with a complete lack of water algae makes it perfect for rowing.

During the European Championships the Munich regatta venue will also be used for the European Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe Championships. These will take place from 18-21 August 2022.

The European Championships honours the 1972 Olympics by marking the 50-year anniversary. The event's slogan is "Back to the Roofs" which remembers the legacy of the Olympic Games and the famous tent-roof architecture.

2.2 World Rowing season so far

After the flurry that was the Tokyo Olympics in July 2021, it marked the end of an Olympiad and 2022 – albeit a year late – marks the start of a new one leading up to the Paris Olympic Games in 2024. This new Olympiad presages change. Athletes retire and new athletes make themselves seen. The playing field transforms.

Athletes came into the 2022 season not knowing what to expect. World Rowing Cup I in May in Belgrade, Serbia was the first look at who was putting themselves forward. Belgrade had 36 nations racing and had Great Britain coming out firing on all cylinders. They topped the medals table with eight gold, two silver and four bronze medals. This included dominating the sweep events by winning the men's and women's pair and men's and women's four and men's eight. The line ups were new as were the crew names.

The Netherlands came second on the medals table with gold medal success in the women's single, double and quadruple sculls. Olympic medallist Karolein Florijn was particularly impressive in the single as was Roos de Jong and Laila Youssifou in the double. De Jong and Youssifou then went on to take gold in the women's eight just a couple of hours later.

Multiple Olympic medallists, Martin and Valent Sinkovic of Croatia swapped from the Olympic Champion pair into the double sculls for the 2022 season and won.

Then came World Rowing Cup II in June in Poznan, Poland. This saw more than 600 athletes sign up to race. These numbers were despite Great Britain's absence and the Netherlands grabbed the opportunity to rank first with six gold medals. De Jong and Youssifou again won the double and the eight. The Dutch also won the men's and women's single sculls with Florijn making it two for two and Melvin Twellaar taking his first gold in the single.

The men's double turned out to be the most exciting race of the regatta. Maybe unsurprisingly, the Sinkovic brothers won, with home favourites Poland taking second and then a dead heat for third defied the best photo finish camera. The Netherlands and Australia could not be separated, both taking bronze.

The final in the World Cup series, World Rowing Cup III took place in Lucerne, Switzerland and favourable weather saw a new World Best Time being set. Imogen Grant of Great Britain led the lightweight women's single sculls final and clocked 7:23. Paul O'Donovan of Ireland followed this up one race later in the lightweight men's single and set a new World Cup Best Time.

Great Britain comfortably topped the medals table scoring seven gold medals – three of these were in men's sweep events. They also took gold in the women's four and set a World Cup Best Time in the process. Germany moved up in the ranks placing second in the medals table. This included gold for young single sculler, Alexandra Foester, 20, who surprised everyone by winning the women's single. Germany, however, could only score bronze in the men's eight with Great Britain and Australia finishing first and second respectively.



3 Rowers to watch

3.1 Rowers to watch

Oliver Zeidler (Germany)

Munich 2022 ambassador Oliver Zeidler is the reigning World and European Champion in the men's single sculls and already this season his form suggests he is on track to win his third European title in his fourth attempt. Zeidler previously picked up European gold in 2019 and 2021. He won gold at World Rowing Cup I in Belgrade this year and also earned a decisive victory against Australia's David Bartholot in the Diamond Challenge Sculls at Henley Royal Regatta. It seems hard to believe it is still only four years since Zeidler first burst onto the international scene, but he is firmly established at the top of the men's single rankings.

Laila Youssifou (Netherlands)

Reigning European Champion in the women's quadruple sculls, Laila Youssifou has switched into the double sculls for the 2022 season and is so far unbeaten with partner Roos de Jong. Youssifou and de Jong also doubled up successfully into the eight for both the first two World Rowing Cups. In fact Youssifou has raced internationally in every boat class since starting her senior career in 2018 and has won medals in several. The question is whether the double will be the boat in which she has the most success.

Esme Booth (Great Britain)

Esme Booth fell into rowing by accident when her name was drawn in a competition to try the sport at primary school. It proved to be a lucky chance. After honing her skills at Oxford Brookes University, the 23-year-old made her senior international debut in the women's four at World Rowing Cup III 2021 as part of a development squad, finishing fourth. This season, she and partner Emily Ford won World Rowing Cup I in the women's pair and were third at World Rowing Cup III.

Martin and Valent Sinkovic (Croatia)

After winning gold in the men's pair at the Tokyo Olympic Games, the Sinkovic brothers declared they were done with sweep and were keen to get back into sculling. So far the switch has been impressive: a tremendous sprint gave them gold at World Rowing Cup I in Belgrade, and they also won at World Rowing Cup II in Poznan and World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne. It might be six years since their last European Rowing Championships in the men's double sculls, but the Croatians are again hot favourites. A win would be their third European gold in this boat class, to add to three in the pair and one in the quadruple sculls from 2012.

Simona Radis (Romania)

In three previous European Rowing Championships in the women's double sculls, Simona Radis has never finished off the podium. She and partner Ancuta Bodnar teamed up in 2019, after Radis began her senior career in the women's quadruple sculls, to instant success. They won European silver in 2019 and improved to gold in both 2020 and 2021, so the pressure is now on to make it a three-peat alongside Bodnar. Radis and Bodnar featured on a stamp in Romania after their victory at the Tokyo Olympics and made a winning return to racing at World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne with yet another gold.

Tom George (Great Britain)

Following a career spent largely in the men's eight, Tom George has stepped into the pair this season. George and Oliver Wynne-Griffith – who won the Boat Race for Cambridge University in April and men's eight bronze at the Tokyo Olympics together – stamped their authority on the final at World Rowing Cup I in Belgrade, backing up with another win in Lucerne in July. The wins made them undoubtedly Great Britain's top pair in a stacked sweep squad. George is also the 5000m world record holder on the ergometer for open men and that power is undoubtedly being put to good use.

Giedre Rakaustaike (Great Britain)

Giedre Rakaustaike stepped into the all-dominant British PR3 mixed coxed four in 2017 for the first time and since then has not been beaten with wins at the 2017 and 2019 World Rowing Championships, the 2021 European Rowing Championships and the Tokyo Paralympics. Now part of a new-look mixed four, Rakaustaike carried on the winning ways at World Rowing Cup II in Poznan, continuing an impressive legacy for Great Britain in this boat class.

Melvin Twellaar (Netherlands)

Dutch sculler Melvin Twellaar comes to Munich after several successful years in the double sculls, with silver and gold at the last two European Championships and silver at the Tokyo Olympics. He made his senior debut in the double in 2018, the same year as winning silver at the World Rowing Under 23 Championships. He switched to the single this season and has made an immediate impact, chasing Oliver Zeidler closely at World Rowing Cup I and winning World Rowing Cup II by a large margin. The 25-year-old seems to be relishing the new challenge.

Pascale Walker (Switzerland)

Silver for the Swiss women's quadruple sculls crew at World Rowing Cup II in Poznan this year was the best-ever senior result for Pascale Walker, showing that several years of hard work are beginning to pay off. The 2017 under-23 European Champion in the women's single sculls, Walker is focused on racing at the Paris 2024 Olympics and on current form is on track to make it. When she is not on the water, Walker can be found working in her parents florist shop.

Tonu Endrekson (Estonia)

There are few rowers on the current international scene with as much experience as Tonu Endrekson. Munich 2022 is his 14th European Rowing Championships and he has competed at the last five Olympic Games. Endrekson has spent much of his career in the quadruple sculls and this is where he finds himself once again. The Estonian quad won silver behind China at World Rowing Cup II and won the B-final at World Rowing Cup III. Another medal for Endrekson in Munich – on top of three previous European golds, a silver, and a bronze in 2021 – is entirely possible.



Mirosław Ziętarski (Poland)

Mirosław Ziętarski had an exceptional World Rowing Cup season in 2021, with two golds and a silver in the men's double sculls. But when it came to the Tokyo Olympics, Ziętarski and his stroke man Mateusz Biskup found themselves off the back in the final, finishing sixth. This season, the experienced Pole is back on form with silver in the double sculls at the first two World Rowing Cups and gold in the quadruple sculls in Lucerne. Ziętarski started his senior career in the quad back in 2013 and this could well be the boat to deliver him a maiden European title.



Birgit Skarstein (Norway)

The ever-cheerful Birgit Skarstein has made her name beyond para rowing. She's added to her many achievements on the water with appearances at the last three Winter Paralympic Games in cross-country skiing and breaking taboos in Norway by performing on 'Dancing with the Stars'. But it is on the water where she really shines. Skarstein is the reigning Paralympic, World and European Champion in the PR1 women's single sculls and set a new World Best Time at World Rowing Cup II in Poznan this year.

Laura Tarantola (France)

Like several other Olympic medallists, Laura Tarantola took a break from racing after the Tokyo Olympics to return for World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne. She and lightweight doubles partner Claire Bove won silver – the same medal as they picked up in an incredibly close final in Tokyo. Tarantola has appeared at several previous European Rowing Championships, including in the openweight women's quadruple sculls in 2016 and has silver from 2018 in the lightweight single sculls and from 2019 in the lightweight double sculls.

Marius Cozmiuc (Romania)

In the past four years, Tokyo Olympic silver medallist Marius Cozmiuc has established himself as one of the world's leading men's pair specialists, with medals at all the major regattas. That included the European Rowing Championships in 2020, when Cozmiuc and partner Ciprian Tudosa upset the favoured Sinkovic brothers to take gold. With the Croatians out of the way, the path could be clear for Cozmiuc and new partner Sergiu Bejan to become European champions again.



Hugo Beurey (France)

At the age of just 24, Hugo Beurey is working his way up through the rankings of lightweight men and 2022 is looking like his breakout season. Beurey's first senior success was in the lightweight men's quadruple sculls at the European Championships in 2019, when the French lightweight quad won bronze. After a switch into the lightweight double sculls Beurey has partnered with several other scullers and with Ferdinand Ludwig won his first World Rowing Cup medal (silver) in this boat class in Belgrade this year.

Alexandra Foester (Germany)

Twenty-year-old Alexandra Foester made her senior international debut at last year's European Rowing Championships, winning the B-final. But this year the 2019 junior and 2021 under-23 world champion has shown she is ready to challenge the best in the world in the single sculls. She was fourth at World Rowing Cup II and then rowed through the pack to take gold in Lucerne in a confident performance. Foester is definitely one to keep an eye on.

Katarzyna Zillmann (Poland)

Katarzyna Zillmann has been a fixture in the Polish women's quadruple sculls since 2017, when the crew won silver at the World Rowing Championships. The crew had a disappointing European Rowing Championships last year, missing out on the final, but made up for it at the Tokyo Olympics with silver. Poland's new-look crew for 2022 is still finding its form, but with Zillmann secure in her seat at stroke, they will always be a combination to watch.



Matteo Lodo (Italy)

Matteo Lodo first caught the attention of the rowing world when, still just 19 years old, his Italian men's four finished a close fourth at the 2013 World Rowing Championships. By 2015 he was a world champion and the men's four won bronze at the Beijing 2016 Olympic Games. With one change in their line-up, Lodo and his crewmates repeated that achievement at the Tokyo Olympics, finishing less than a second down on winners Australia in a desperate dash for the line. Lodo has switched in and out of all sweep boat classes with success and several medals – including European Championship gold in the men's pair in 2017.

Paul O'Donovan (Ireland)

When Paul O'Donovan and his brother Gary swiped silver at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games they shot to fame, becoming instantly popular for their frank interviews and tough approach to racing. O'Donovan kept his seat in the lightweight men's double sculls through the next Olympiad, taking Ireland's first-ever Olympic gold in rowing in Tokyo last year. After the Olympics O'Donovan focused on his medical studies. He then returned to racing for World Rowing Cup III and had an emphatic win and World Cup Best Time in the lightweight men's single sculls.



Donata Karaliene (Lithuania)

After winning bronze in the women's double sculls at the Rio 2016 Olympics, Donata Karaliene took a break from international rowing. She made her comeback at the European Rowing Championships last year, winning silver in the double with Milda Valciukaite, but the duo missed out on the medals at the Tokyo Olympics. Undeterred, Karaliene has continued her career and with new stroke-woman Dovile Rimkute picked up bronze at World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne. It is 14 years since Karaliene made her senior debut, at the 2008 European Rowing Championships and despite her break she remains one of the most decorated scullers in the field with five previous medals – two gold, two silver and a bronze.

Aina Cid (Spain)

Aina Cid has always flourished at the European Rowing Championships, winning a full set of medals in her three appearances in 2019, 2020 and 2021, all in the women's pair. Cid has also represented Spain at two Olympic Games, finishing sixth in the A-final in the pair both times. In the 2022 season she is the experienced head in a new, young Spanish women's four looking to qualify for the Olympics for the first time and Munich will be a test of their speed.

Corne de Koning (Netherlands)

Corne de Koning has been one of the trailblazers for para rowing in the Netherlands. Now in his ninth international season, de Koning has been consistently successful, especially in the last five years. He took silver at the Tokyo Paralympic Games in the PR2 mixed double sculls. This season, he won gold at World Rowing Cup II in the PR2 men's single sculls and was third with new partner Chantal Haenen in the PR2 mixed double sculls. Munich will, however, be only his third European Rowing Championships. De Koning previously won the PR2 mixed double title in 2020 and earned silver in 2021.

Stefania Gobbi (Italy)

Stefania Gobbi spent the 2021 season in the Italian women's quadruple sculls crew which narrowly finished off the podium at the Tokyo Olympics. For 2022 she is back in the double sculls, the boat in which she has had the most international success including bronze at her senior European Rowing Championships debut in 2017. Alongside Kiri Tontodonati, Gobbi took silver at World Rowing Cup III in July in the crew's first competition together – a promising start.

4 Rowing

4.1 About rowing

The origin of rowing

The boat was mankind's most significant mode of transport for centuries and the oar is considered to be the most important invention before the wheel. The first representation of a rowing boat was discovered in Finland and dates back to 5,800 BC. The earliest regatta was held on 16 September 1274 in Venice, Italy, where regattas developed as challenges between gondoliers and boatmen in a variety of rowing boats. Rowing has evolved all over the world wherever people and water mix. The origin of the sport of rowing as we know it today comes from England, where the world-renowned Oxford versus Cambridge University Boat Race was first held in 1829 on the River Thames.

Rowing at the World Rowing Championships

The first World Rowing Championships was staged in Lucerne, Switzerland in 1962. Initially held every four years, the championships soon became an annual event. It is the biggest annual World Rowing event. The 2018 World Rowing Championships were held in Linz-Ottensheim, Austria with 1200 athletes from 80 nations competing

Female boat classes were included on the World Championship programme in 1974, with lightweight categories for both men and women featuring annually from 1985. In 2018 the championship programme became gender equal with the same number of boat classes for men and women. Para rowing was integrated into the World Rowing Championships programme in 2002. Originally raced over 1000m, in 2017 the length of racing changed to 2000m.

Rowing at the Olympic & Paralympic rowing regattas

Rowing became an Olympic sport in 1896, at the first Olympic Games of the modern era held in Athens, Greece. Rough seas in the Piraeus harbour, however, forced the event to be cancelled which is why rowing won its first Olympic medals four years later in Paris. Women's events were added to the Olympic programme in 1976 and lightweight events in 1996. Para rowing first appeared at the Paralympic Games in 2008.

The boats

Boats, or shells, were traditionally made from wood. Top level boats are now fabricated from composite materials such as carbon fibre and kevlar. The width of boats varies from approximately 30cm for a single scull and up to 65cm for an eight. A small fin is fitted beneath the boat for directional stability. A rudder is attached to the fin or the stern for steering (except on most sculling boats). A white ball (bow ball) is attached to the bow for safety as well as for judging precision of the start and finish of races. A splashboard prevents waves from splashing water aboard. Seats are fitted with wheels which roll on runners or tracks.

The oars

Oars are hollow to reduce weight, attached to the boat by adjustable outriggers. The size and shape of oars is unrestricted, the average length of a sweep oar is 3.70m and of a scull 2.85m.

4.2 About World Rowing

The World Rowing Federation is the governing body of the sport of rowing. It is empowered by its 156 member National Rowing Federations, the National Olympic Committees and the International Olympic Committee, to govern the sport of rowing.

World Rowing was previously called FISA (from the French, Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d’Aviron) with a full name change to World Rowing coming into effect in 2020.

World Rowing sets the rules and regulations for the practice of the sport in all its forms (elite, para rowing, coastal, masters and aspects of indoor). It organises sanctioned World Rowing events including those for junior and under-23s. It provides advice and expertise for the organisation of rowing regattas, coaching education, rowing development and other matters relating to the sport and its development.

In 2017 World Rowing, as FISA, celebrated its 125th anniversary. It was founded by representatives from Belgium, France, Italy, Switzerland and Adriatica (now a part of Italy) in Turin, Italy on 25 June 1892. It is the oldest international sports federation in the Olympic movement. World Rowing established its first headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1922 and, after moving away, it returned to its roots in February 1996.

World Rowing’s vision

To encourage the development of the sport of rowing and strengthen the bonds that unite all who enjoy the sport.

World Rowing’s mission

To make rowing a universally practised and globally relevant sport in all its forms. To effectively and efficiently govern, develop, showcase and promote the sport of rowing and respect and protect the environment when practising the sport.

World Rowing’s Guiding Principles

- **Priority to Rowers and Rowing:** The interests, well-being and health of the rowers are always at the centre of our sport. World Rowing directs its work in the interests of rowers and rowing.
- **Rowing in all its Forms:** World Rowing recognises the value of the different forms of rowing that exist globally and that enable the sport to be practised by people of differing ages, abilities and training objectives. World Rowing seeks to both represent and develop all of these different forms of rowing.
- **Equality of Opportunity & Fairness:** World Rowing seeks to ensure fairness and equality of opportunity, both in competition and across all levels of the organisation.
- **Inclusion & Non-Discrimination:** World Rowing is committed to inclusion and accessibility, strives for gender equality and does not tolerate any form of discrimination.
- **Integrity:** World Rowing is committed to the highest ethical standards, is a recognised leader in the fight against doping and is dedicated to preventing the manipulation of competitions.
- **Sustainability:** World Rowing carefully assesses sustainability in all its actions and decisions. FISA endorses a responsible and sustainable approach to the planning and staging of its events so as to maximise positive impacts and minimise negative impacts on the environment and surrounding communities.
- **Autonomy & Independence:** World Rowing undertakes to preserve the independence and autonomy of international sport.
- **Integral Part of World Sport:** World Rowing seeks to ensure a leading position for rowing in the world of sport. World Rowing is an integral member of the Olympic and Paralympic movements and other leading world sports organisations.

- The Competitive Commission, chaired by Rosie Mayglothling (Great Britain), is in charge of competition regulation such as the fairness committee and coach support.
- The Sports Medicine Commission, chaired by Juergen Steinacker (Germany), oversees all medical aspects of the competition, including anti-doping.
- World Rowing's Executive Director Vincent Gaillard represents the Executive Committee in overseeing the operation of the event.




