European Rowing is steeped in history. The European Rowing Championships was the first international regatta organised by World Rowing and it's one of the oldest pan-continental sporting events.

First staged in Orta, Italy in 1893, it was organised almost annually for the next 80 years. In 2007 the European regatta was reintroduced at the later end of the rowing season. The demand for this event was clear from the beginning. Five years later it was moved to the start of the season, following World Rowing Cup I, where it fitted in well with the international season. It has experienced ongoing popularity and increased participation ever since with on average over 500 athletes competing from more than 30 European countries.

As with all sporting events, 2020 and 2021 was disrupted by the Covid-19 Global Pandemic. Despite this the championships was the only senior-level regatta to take place in 2020 and in 2021 it took place in Varese, Italy with 629 athletes competing from 35 countries.

For 2022 the European Rowing Championships joined with the multi-sport European Championships in Munich with racing taking place at the 1972 Olympic regatta venue in Oberschleissheim. Great Britain finished at the top of the ranking table with ten medals, six of them gold. Romania was second and Italy third.

Great Britain's success included a clean sweep of the 'fours'. They won the men's and women's four as well as the para mixed coxed four. The Netherlands, who finished fourth overall, won both the men's and women's single sculls – Melvin Twellaar and Karolien Florijn respectively. Romania won both the men's and women's pair with Denisa Tilvescu and Ioana Vrinceanu doubling up and also taking gold in the women's eight.

The championship is open to the 46 European national rowing federations, including Israel. The programme consists of the 14 Olympic boat classes, three international boat classes (lightweight single sculls, lightweight pair and lightweight quadruple sculls) and a selection of para rowing boat classes. There are the same number of boat classes for women and men.

The European Rowing Championships is monitored and managed by the European Rowing Management Board (ERMB). Their responsibilities have grown to include the European Rowing Under 19 Championships, European Rowing Under 23 Championships, European Rowing Coastal and Beach Sprint Championships.

This year the small town of Bled, Slovenia is the regatta venue. The regatta course is on beautiful Lake Bled which can boast being one of the most favoured spots to row in the world. Lake Bled has hosted four World Rowing Championships, most recently in 2011 when it doubled as the qualification regatta for the 2012 Olympic Games. Lake Bled again hosted an international event with the 2015 World Rowing Cup I being held there and in 2017 the World Rowing Masters Regatta.

The most medalled Slovenian is a rower. Iztok Cop had a two-decade long international career which included six Olympic Games and four medals. During that time Cop competed in the single, double and pair. Despite rowing having a small membership base, the success of Cop has elevated the sport into the minds of Slovenians. Cop retired following a bronze medal at the 2012 London Olympics in the men's double sculls. He continues to be involved in rowing.

Many of the rowers are also accomplished cross country skiers with skiing used as cross training during the winter months when many of Slovenia's bodies of water, like Lake Bled, are frozen.





**ORIGIN**

The boat was human's most significant mode of transport for centuries and the oar is considered to be the most important invention before the wheel.

The first representation of a rowing boat was discovered in Finland and dates back to 5,800 BC.

The earliest regatta was held in 1274 in Venice, Italy, where regattas developed as challenges between gondoliers and boatmen.

The origin of the sport of rowing as we know it today comes from England, where the Oxford versus Cambridge University Boat Race was first held in 1829 on the River Thames.

**OLYMPIC ROWING REGATTA**

Rowing became an Olympic sport in 1896, at the first Olympic Games of the modern era held in Athens, Greece. Rough seas, however, forced the event to be cancelled. Women's events were added to the Olympic programme in 1976 and lightweight events in 1996.

Para rowing first appeared at the Paralympic Games in 2008.

**WORLD ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The first World Rowing Championships were held in 1962 in Lucerne, Switzerland. It is now the biggest annual World Rowing event. This year it will be held in Belgrade, Serbia in September.

Female boat classes were included on the World Championship programme in 1974. Lightweight categories featured from 1985. In 2018 the championship programme became gender equal. Para rowing was added in 2002, originally over 1000m it is now fully integrated at 2000m.

THE BOATS

Boats, or shells, were traditionally made from wood. Top level boats are now fabricated from composite materials such as carbon fibre and kevlar. There's a small fin fitted beneath the boat for directional stability and a rudder for steering (except some sculling boats).

A white ball (bow ball) is attached to the bow for safety and judging precision of the start and finish of races. Seats are fitted with wheels which roll on runners or tracks.



THE OARS

Oars are hollow to reduce weight, attached to the boat by adjustable outriggers. The size and shape of oars is unrestricted, the average length of a sweep oar is 3.70m and of a scull 2.85m.



MORE ROWING

World Rowing has grown to include indoor rowing or ergometer rowing with the World Rowing Indoor Rowing Championships first being raced in 2018.

The World Rowing Coastal Championships were first held 2007 and is held annually. This is the rough-water version and is raced on the sea or large lakes. The boats are designed to handle rough water and waves. The World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals is the newest event, added in 2019.

About World Rowing

The World Rowing Federation is the governing body of the sport of rowing. It is empowered by its 157-member National Rowing Federations, the National Olympic Committees and the International Olympic Committee, to govern the sport of rowing.

World Rowing was previously called FISA (from the French, Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d’Aviron) with a full name change to World Rowing coming into effect in 2020.

World Rowing sets the rules and regulations for the practice of the sport in all its forms (elite, para rowing, coastal, masters and aspects of indoor). It organises sanctioned World Rowing events including those for under-19 and under-23s. It provides advice and expertise for the organisation of rowing regattas, events, coaching education, rowing development and other matters relating to the sport and its development.

In 2017 World Rowing, as FISA, celebrated its 125th anniversary. It was founded by representatives from Belgium, France, Italy, Switzerland and Adriatica (now a part of Italy) in Turin, Italy on 25 June 1892. It is the oldest international sports federation in the Olympic movement. World Rowing established its first headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1922 and, after moving away, it returned to Lausanne in February 1996. Lausanne is the home of the International Olympic Committee.



WORLD ROWING'S VISION

2023 World Rowing Season Summary

When most on-water rowers were still in the depths of their off-season, the international season was under way with the World Rowing Indoor Rowing Championships taking place in Mississauga, Canada in February. This event is relatively new to the World Rowing calendar, first taking place in 2018. It is now an established feature and for the first time it ran as a hybrid event of remote and in-person. Nearly 1600 athletes took part.

The on-water racing got going in May with World Rowing Cup I taking place in Zagreb, Croatia. This event received massive crowds all there to see the Croatian rowers especially their favourite brothers, Martin and Valent Sinkovic.

The European Rowing Championships will squeeze in between World Cups. Romania regularly excels at the Europeans and their star rowers at present have to be Ancuta Bodnar and Simona Radis. The duo are the Olympic Champions in the double and had an unbeaten 2022 season.

World Rowing Cup II is set to be staged in mid-June in Varese, Italy. This, along with World Rowing Cup III in Lucerne, Switzerland, is bound to get the big numbers. Nations outside of Europe are likely to use these two regattas to test their international strength, making it a European tour. Australia, New Zealand, Canada and potentially the United States will follow this model along with other smaller rowing nations.

Watch out for the clash of single scullers with Oliver Zeidler of Germany knowing he'll have tough competition coming from Olympic Champion Stefanos Ntouskos of Greece and the comeback of Sverri Nielsen of Denmark. Nielsen medalled at World Rowing Cup I and is looking strong for the season. New Zealand's Olympic Champion Emma Twigg will be preparing for her Paris Olympic bid as will Karolien Florijn of the Netherlands.

The para rowers will race at the Europeans and dominating the singles is likely to be Roman Polianskyi (Ukraine) and Birgit Skarstein (Norway). But these two will be constantly looking over their shoulders as the standard continues to grow and new rowers come onto the scene. Keep an eye out too for Great Britain in the mixed four. It will take a lot for any nation to step up and beat them.

The spotlight will then shift to the pinnacle event of the season. The World Rowing Championships will take place in Belgrade, Serbia and as the main Olympic qualification event for Paris 2024, this could see over 1000 athletes taking part from around the world. It opens up the opportunity to see new stars emerge as lesser-known athletes line up to go after Paris positions.

The usual contenders in the men's eight will be giving it their all with the big question-mark around how the formerly dominant German boat will come through. Great Britain are the reigning World Champions and Australia and the Netherlands look to be in the mix. For the women's eight Romania looks to be back at their former best with Canada and the Netherlands in hot pursuit. It's the United States that, like the German men, used to dominate, but now have a question mark around their medal chances.

A must-see is the men's double sculls. Invariably medals are won by split-second margins and this year will be no exception. Keep an eye out for the lightweight men's double sculls. Through 2022 combinations had not really formed and this year will see some stabilisation in the pairings as well as a chance for one crew to rise above the rest.

The season will wrap up with rowing's wild cousin, the World Rowing Coastal Championships & Beach Sprint Finals in Barletta, Italy at the end of September.

ZOE HYDE AND SANITA PUSPURE, Ireland



Women's double sculls



In their first season together – 2022 – Hyde and Puspure proved that the combination of huge experience and new blood works just fine. Puspure, 41, is an Olympian and two-time World Champion in the single with over two decades of international racing. Tokyo was her third Olympic Games and she says the double has given her the impetus to carry on in rowing. For Hyde, 26, last year marked her first year on the Irish national rowing team and together they took bronze at the 2022 World Rowing Championships.

HUGO BEUREY AND FERDINAND LUDWIG, France



Lightweight men's double sculls



Ever since the glory days of Pierre Houin and Jeremie Azou (gold at the 2016 Olympics), France has been looking for that elusive top double combination. Have they found it in Beurey and Ludwig? Both rowers have come through the French rowing system, competing for their country at the under-23 level, albeit at slightly different times. Last year was their first season being paired up and together they won a World Cup medal before finishing out the season with an A-final finish at the World Rowing Championships. This young duo must have a lot to come.

RODRIGO CONDE ROMERO AND ALEIX GARCIA PUJOLAR, Spain



Men's double sculls



When Rodrigo Conde moved from rowing as a lightweight and into the open double with Aleix Garcia the combination sparked. They came together to race internationally in 2021 and last year proved to be their breakout season. Together they medalled at every event they competed in including silver at the World Rowing Championships and a European Championship silver.

Younger of the duo, Garcia has come through from competing for the junior and then under-23 Spanish national team in the four. Sculling and joining with Conde is serving him well. After missing on qualifying for the Tokyo Olympics, the duo is on course to be part of the Paris Olympics.

SVERRI NIELSEN, Denmark



Men's single sculls



Sverri Nielsen is on a cautious comeback to rowing. The 29-year-old finished fourth in the single at the Tokyo Olympics after being regularly on the medals podium through 2019. The limited 2020 season saw Nielsen win the European Rowing Championships and in the lead-up to Tokyo he took silver at the European Championships and gold at World Rowing Cup III. A proud Faroese Islander, Nielsen began rowing in the Faroese wooden rowing boats. He has also made his mark as an indoor rower and has several times broken the Danish indoor rowing record for 2000 metres.

KAROLIEN FLORIJN, Netherlands



Women's single sculls



The 2022 season saw the rise of a new single sculling star. In her first season in the single, Karolien Florijn achieved an unbeaten season which started with a win at World Rowing Cup I, gained a European Champion title and finished as a World Champion when she won over the reigning Olympic Champion, Emma Twigg of New Zealand. Florijn may be new to the single, but she's far from new to rowing. Beginning as a junior national team rower in 2015, Florijn has competed in a number of different team boats before being selected for the Tokyo Olympics in the four. This turned out to be fortuitous with her crew taking silver. Now in the single, has Florijn truly found her boat calling?

MARTIN MACKOVIC AND MILOS VASIC, Serbia



Men's pair



A combination that began in 2019, Martin Mackovic and Milos Vasic got off to an incredible start when they won the first World Rowing Cup that they entered together. The more senior Vasic began rowing internationally as a junior in 2008. Mackovic also came through from the Serbian junior national team, but four years later. Together they competed at the Tokyo Olympics and finished fifth overall. Last year they finished a solid season with a fourth in the final at the World Rowing Championships. This year the goal is Olympic qualification.

JAN SCHAEUBLE AND RAPHAEL AHUMADA IRELAND, Switzerland



Lightweight men's double sculls



Schaeuble and Ireland have been pushing their way into the heavyweights of lightweight rowing ever since they teamed up a year ago. Their first international race together ended in a gold medal (World Rowing Cup I in 2022) and they continued to race in the final at every regatta they entered. At the World Rowing Championships last year Schaeuble and Ireland finished fourth, stressing their talent as a team. This year they have already raced internationally, finishing first at World Rowing Cup I and lining themselves up for what looks likely to be an awesome season.

NATHALIE BENOIT, France



PR1 women's single sculls



It will be hard to get past Norway's Birgit Skarstein in the single, but Nathalie Benoit is giving it her best shot. After finishing with silver at the 2012 London Paralympics, Benoit stepped away from international para rowing. When she came back in 2019 she stepped back to regularly being on the podium and at the Tokyo Olympics Benoit won a bronze medal. The 2022 seasons saw Benoit finish at the World Rowing Championships in silver behind Skarstein. The 42-year-old has multiple sclerosis which puts her into the PR1 para class.

YMKJE CLEVERING AND VERONIQUE MEESTER, the Netherlands



Women's pair



This is a pair to watch out for. Clevering and Meester have a pedigree that goes back to 2016 when they finished third in the four at the World Rowing Under 23 Championships. The duo have been rowing together ever since in various boats and have had remarkable success along the way. There's been medals in the eight and four and at the Tokyo Olympic Games they came away with silver in the four. Last year Clevering and Meester spent the season racing in two events at every regatta they entered. The duo finished off the season with World Championship silver in both the pair and eight.

KATHARINA AND MAGDALENA LOBNIG, Austria



Women's double sculls



The name Magdalena Lobnig is well-known in rowing circles especially after she medalled at the Tokyo Olympics in the single. Magdalena has been racing for Austria, predominantly in the single, since 2006. Unlike her younger sister, Katharina has come and gone from competitive rowing but Katharina has remained Magdalena's training partner and even accompanied her to Tokyo. They started off the 2023 season well with a silver medal at World Rowing Cup I and are looking forward to a successful together.

GIACOMO PERINI, Italy



PR1 men's single sculls



In an event dominated by Ukraine's Roman Polianskyi, Giacomo Perini is a shot of fresh air. The Italian had his first international season in 2022 and, despite only five years of rowing, he took gold at the European Rowing Championships and silver behind Polianskyi at the 2022 World Rowing Championships. Perini has osteosarcoma, a type of bone cancer that was discovered when he was 18 and led to his leg being amputated. Formerly an equestrian athlete, Perini looks to have taken to rowing with a passion and with success.

JOLANTA MAJKA AND MICHAL GADOWSKI, Poland

After finishing sixth at the Tokyo Paralympic Games, Jolanta Majka and Michal Gadowski have seen a huge leap and they stepped up to taking silver at the 2022 World Rowing Championships. This comes with a partnership that is going into its twelfth year together. For para rowing this is huge. Majka began rowing with her husband Piotr Majka and has been to four Paralympic Games as a para rower. She has also competed at the Sydney Paralympics as a swimmer. Gadowski came to international para rowing in 2011 when he teamed up with Majka. Their progression has been steady and consistent.






