

**ORIGIN**

The boat was human's most significant mode of transport for centuries and the oar is considered to be the most important invention before the wheel.

The first representation of a rowing boat was discovered in Finland and dates back to 5,800 BC.

The earliest regatta was held in 1274 in Venice, Italy, where regattas developed as challenges between gondoliers and boatmen.

The origin of the sport of rowing as we know it today comes from England, where the Oxford versus Cambridge University Boat Race was first held in 1829 on the River Thames.

**OLYMPIC & PARALYMPIC ROWING**

Rowing became an Olympic sport in 1896, at the first Olympic Games of the modern era held in Athens, Greece. Rough seas, however, forced the event to be cancelled. Women's events were added to the Olympic programme in 1976 and lightweight events in 1996.

Para rowing first appeared at the Paralympic Games in 2008.

**WORLD ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The first World Rowing Championships were held in 1962 in Lucerne, Switzerland. It is now the biggest annual World Rowing event. This year it will be held in Belgrade, Serbia in September.

Female boat classes were included on the World Championship programme in 1974. Lightweight categories featured from 1985. In 2018 the championship programme became gender equal. Para rowing was added in 2002, originally over 1000m it is now fully integrated at 2000m.

THE BOATS

Boats, or shells, were traditionally made from wood. Top level boats are now fabricated from composite materials such as carbon fibre and kevlar. There's a small fin fitted beneath the boat for directional stability and a rudder for steering (except some sculling boats).

A white ball (bow ball) is attached to the bow for safety and judging precision of the start and finish of races. Seats are fitted with wheels which roll on runners or tracks.



THE OARS

Oars are hollow to reduce weight, attached to the boat by adjustable outriggers. The size and shape of oars is unrestricted, the average length of a sweep oar is 3.70m and of a scull 2.85m.



MORE ROWING

World Rowing has grown to include indoor rowing or ergometer rowing with the World Rowing Indoor Rowing Championships first being raced in 2018.

The World Rowing Coastal Championships were first held 2007 and is held annually. This is the rough-water version and is raced on the sea or large lakes. The boats are designed to handle rough water and waves. The World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals is the newest event, added in 2019.

The World Rowing Federation is the governing body of the sport of rowing. It is empowered by its 157-member National Rowing Federations, the National Olympic Committees and the International Olympic Committee, to govern the sport of rowing.

World Rowing was previously called FISA (from the French, Fédération Internationale des Sociétés d’Aviron) with a full name change to World Rowing coming into effect in 2020.

World Rowing sets the rules and regulations for the practice of the sport in all its forms (elite, para rowing, coastal, masters and aspects of indoor). It organises sanctioned World Rowing events including those for under-19 and under-23s. It provides advice and expertise for the organisation of rowing regattas, events, coaching education, rowing development and other matters relating to the sport and its development.

In 2017 World Rowing, as FISA, celebrated its 125th anniversary. It was founded by representatives from Belgium, France, Italy, Switzerland and Adriatica (now a part of Italy) in Turin, Italy on 25 June 1892. It is the oldest international sports federation in the Olympic movement. World Rowing established its first headquarters in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1922 and, after moving away, it returned to Lausanne in February 1996. Lausanne is the home of the International Olympic Committee.

The 2023 season got off to an early start in February when most on-water rowers were still in the depths of their off-season. The World Rowing Indoor Championships took place in Mississauga, Canada and for the first time as a hybrid event with remote and in-person racing. Nearly 1600 athletes took part.

The on-water racing got underway in May with World Rowing Cup I taking place in Zagreb, Croatia. This first World Cup, although small on entries, was big in spirit. Massive crowds came out to see the Croatian rowers and especially their favourite brothers, Martin and Valent Sinkovic. The Sinkovics did their nation proud winning the double and notching up their 50th international medal. Denmark's Sverri Nielsen staged a successful comeback in the single finishing second to World Champion Ollie Zeidler of Germany.

The first gold for Chilean women's rowing went to their four which included their rowing twins Melita and Antonia Abraham. Switzerland finished at the top of the medals table ahead of Spain and the Czech Republic.

The Netherlands posted a devastating performance at the next regatta of the season, The European Rowing Championships. Taking place in Bled, Slovenia this popular rowing venue had over 600 athletes competing and the Dutch walked away with 11 medals. Lennart van Lierop surprised everyone with his win in the men's single finishing ahead of Zeidler and Olympic Champion Ntouskos. Simona Radis of Romania left no doubt in anyone's mind of her talents by first winning the double with Ancuta Bodnar and then switching to sweep to stroke her country's eight to victory.

A very stacked men's double saw Olympic Champions France get pushed into the b-final while the Sinkovic brothers came back out on top. The Sinkovics were pushed hard by Matteo Sartori and Filippo Mondelli of Italy who took second.

The men's eight went to a photo finish with Great Britain just edging out the Dutch by 0.05 of a second. An incredible finishing sprint by Romania earned them the bronze medal.

Varese, Italy hosted World Rowing Cup II and para rowers joined the action with strength and force. There was not one but five World Best Times broken by para boats including our two rowing heroes Birgit Skarstein of Norway and Ukraine's Roman Polianskyi, both in the PR1 single sculls.

The home crowd relished the men's double win by Sartori and Mondelli. Sartori, 21, is the son of three-time Olympic medallist Alessio Sartori and just starting out on his international rowing quest. They finished just ahead of the United States.

The lightweight women's double was all about Emily Craig and Imogen Grant of Great Britain. They had already taken a win at the European Championships, but in Varese they faced very stiff competition from the United States. Craig and Grant pulled off the win and would go on to win again at World Cup III.

Tradition remained with World Rowing Cup III taking place in Lucerne, Switzerland. The Lake of the Gods has become used to this annual pilgrimage that always attracts a large field and aims to place athletes at their best before the final push towards the World Championships.

The lightweight men's double ended in an upset when Hugo Beurey and Ferdinand Ludwig outsprinted the Olympic Champions and great Irish sprinters McCarthy and O'Donovan. A further upset was in store as Miguel Angel Carballo Nieto and Alexis Bladimir Lopez Garcia of Mexico came through just behind Switzerland to record the first a-final position for Mexico in this boat class since 2010.

Australia produced a mighty race to finish ahead of Great Britain in the men's eight. It is not often that the British get beaten, even though it was by a small margin. Also not used to being beaten is the Chinese women's quad, but in Lucerne the Olympic Champions finished in fourth behind the Netherlands, Great Britain and Switzerland.

Ollie Zeidler finished off the World Cup series with a commanding performance in the men's single. He won with open water over Nielsen to complete a World Cup hat-trick. Karolien Florijn of the Netherlands won the women's single beating out Olympic Champion Emma Twigg of New Zealand and Olympic silver medallist Anna Prakaten who finished fifth. Formerly Russian, Prakaten now rows for Uzbekistan.

At the end of the World Cup season Great Britain reigned at the top of the medals table with Australia in second and a new entrant into the top three, Switzerland in third.

The regatta

Races in Olympic, International and para rowing boat classes are contested over 2000m. Depending upon the number of entries in each event, there will be heats, repechages, quarterfinals, semifinals and finals. A and B finals will be contested in all events with eight or more entries. Where 14 or more crews are entered, C, D, E etc. finals will be contested. Each boat is drawn into a first-round race (the heat) with progression to further rounds depending on placings and the number of entries in accordance with the FISA progression system.

Round 1:	Heats – after the initial round of heats, every unsuccessful crew has a second chance to advance in the repechages round.
Round 2:	Repechages – second chance to advance.
Round 3:	Quarterfinals (only if an event has 25 or more boats competing).
Round 4 :	Semifinals (only for events with 13 or more boats competing).
Round 5:	Finals – A, B, C, D... Finals (In principle, there are no more than six boats per final. The top six boats in the qualification rounds compete in the A-final, the following six in the B-final, etc. Only the rowers who finish in the top three places of the A-final win a medal.)

Rowing follows a unique format in that crews have the benefit of a second chance if they are not successful in their first round heat. The repechage is the name for the second round of competition which ensures that every crew has a second chance to advance from the preliminary races to the next round.

Lanes

There are normally eight buoyed lanes, of which six are used at one time for racing. Each lane is 13.5m wide. A draw is conducted before the beginning of racing to determine the allocation of crews to heats and to lane positions within each heat. A seeding panel determines in advance which crews will be seeded. The purpose of seeding is to avoid having all the faster boats in a boat class being drawn into the same heat in the first round.

Competition schedule contingency plan

As for any outdoor sporting event, it is possible that the competition schedule may be disrupted due to adverse weather conditions. The FISA Rules allow for the implementation of certain contingency plans in order to ensure that the competition can be completed within the available days.

FISA has identified a number of contingency plans or options that can be implemented, depending on the severity of the conditions and the threatened disruption to the competition schedule. These include:

- Changing the start times of the races and/or the intervals between races.
- Combining different groups on the same day.
- Combining two rounds in the same day.
- Combining finals on three days, two days or all on one day.
- Time trials.





Dead-heat rules and procedures

If there is a dead-heat between crews, there are several options to resolve it depending on the round of the competition. In many cases, the tie is resolved by having the relevant crews row a 2000m race again in order to find a winner. If, in a final, there is a dead-heat both crews will be given equal placing and the next placing left vacant with no re-row. If the tied placing is for a medal position, additional medals will be awarded.

Crew changes

Up to half of the rowers in all crews entered may be substituted at least one hour before the first heat of the boat class. A crew which has already raced in the heat of its boat class may not make changes in the crew, except in the case of a serious illness or injury. A single sculler who entered and falls ill or is injured may be replaced before their heat. No substitution may be made for a single sculler after their first heat.

Penalties / disqualification rules / exclusion

The Board of the Jury may impose the following penalties: reprimand, yellow card (applying to the next round in which the crew competes), exclusion (from all the rounds of the event in question), relegation where this is specifically provided in the Rules (to last place in its race of that round), disqualification (from all boat classes in the regatta), or any other appropriate measure in order to assure the fairness of the competition. A crew arriving at the start after the start time or causing two false starts will be excluded. A yellow card is equivalent to one false start. Crews interfering with opponents during the race may be excluded by the umpire.

Rowing in Serbia

Serbia's rowing history has been shaped by the politics of the region. It dates back to 1883 when the first rowing club was established in Becej under Austro-Hungarian influence. The sport then took off in the city of Novi Sad before arriving in Belgrade and Smederevo. These four areas remain active rowing regions.

After WWII club rowing grew in Belgrade as part of larger athletic clubs, taking advantage of the River Sava, which is close to Lake Sava - the main rowing location today and home of the national team.

As part of Yugoslavia, Serbians were a major force in the country's rowing elite. The name Nikola Stojic became synonymous first with Yugoslavian rowing and then with Serbian rowing. From Belgrade, Stojic competed for Yugoslavia at the Sydney Olympics. He went on to compete at three more Olympic Games before retiring in 2016 at the age of 41. More recently Milos Vasic has been successful and at the Tokyo Olympics he made the final of the pair along with Martin Mackovic. Tokyo was Vasic's third Olympic Games.

Typically, national team rowers are recruited from clubs throughout Serbia. In recent years there has also been an initiative to talent scout in regions where rowing is not available. This method has worked well with two members of the London Olympic men's four coming via this talent identification programme.

Today there are 17 clubs throughout the country and about 700 registered rowers. This number continues to increase especially among masters and recreational rowers.

Belgrade has hosted a number of World Rowing events, including the World Rowing Cup in 2012, the 2014 European Rowing Championships, the European Rowing Junior Championships in 2020 and World Rowing Cups in 2017, 2018 and 2022.

Olympic and Paralympic Games qualification

Olympic Games qualification

The 2024 Paris Olympic Games gets going at the end of July with rowing starting 27 July. The regatta venue is the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium 30 km outside of Paris.

There is a quota of 502 athlete places in rowing at the Olympic Games thus a qualification system is in place that begins at the 2023 World Rowing Championships. The qualification system continues with continental qualification regattas that are designed to encourage universality in the sport and then wrap up with the Final Olympic Qualification Regatta in May 2024. There is also a spot reserved for the host nation and two spots for universality places.

Paralympic Games qualification

The 2024 Paris Paralympic Games starts at the end of August. The regatta venue is the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium 30 km outside of Paris.

There is a quota of 104 athlete places (not including coxswains) thus a qualification system is in place that begins at the 2023 World Rowing Championships. The qualification spots are for nations not individual athletes. Competing athletes must be internationally classified. The qualification system also has continental qualification regattas and then a final Olympic Qualification regatta in May 2024.

For some it's the love of being completely self-reliant – there's no one else to blame and no one to blame you.

But the single has some new names. Both Tom Mackintosh (NZL) and **Ryuta Arakawa** (JPN) did outstandingly at World Cup III.

We also expect some of the most experienced single scullers of the field, such as **Damir Martin** (CRO) and **Kristian Vasilev** (BUL), to put themselves in a good position. **Kjetil Borch** (NOR) has had an up and down season, but we can expect the Tokyo 2020 silver medallist to be ready when it matters it most.

What about qualification surprises? Maybe **Nikolaj Pimenov** (SRB), or **Tim Brys** (BEL). **Simon van Dorp** (NED) may sneak into the nine.

The direct qualification for Paris seems promised to three scullers: **Karolien Florijn** (NED), who still hasn't lost a race since she stepped in the single after Tokyo, reigning Olympic Champion, **Emma Twigg** (NZL), and bronze medallist at last year's World Championships, **Tara Rigney** (AUS).

Behind the trio, it will be interesting to follow the performances of **Alexandra Foester** (GER), winner of World Cup II and **Kara Kohler** (USA) who has had a podium finish this year. **Desislava Angelova** (BUL) has four fourth place finishes this year and Tokyo silver medallist **Anna Prakaten** (UZB) is an incredible talent.

Then there are the wild cards. **Aurelia-Maxima Janzen** (SUI) was impressive at her first senior European Championships and is the under-23 champion. **Magdalena Lobnig** (AUT) won bronze in Tokyo and looks to be back in the single.

THE DOUBLE SCULLS

The double has featured at the Olympics ever since 1904 and remains one of the most competitive of the boat classes. The World Best Time for the women has remained with Sally Kehoe and Olympia Aldersey of Australia since 2014 when they hit 6:37.31. The men's World Best Time was set at the same regatta by Valent and Martin Sinkovic when they became the first crew to go under six minutes. Their time is 5:59.72.

It took the French duo of **Hugo Boucheron and Matthieu Androdias** until about 200m left to row to get into the lead over **the Netherlands** at the Tokyo Olympics. Their time of 6:00.33 was just a fraction off the World Best Time. This year Boucheron will try to qualify with a new partner while Androdias is recovering from injury.

The world champs introduced some up-and-coming challengers to the French. **Spain** took silver and **Australia** took bronze. Just out of the medals were **Valent and Martin Sinkovic**. The Croatian brothers had switched back to the double after winning gold in the pair at Tokyo. The duo already has Olympic gold in the double from the Rio Olympics.

Winners of World Cup III, the Netherlands will definitely be hot contenders. Olympic silver medallists, **Melvin Twellaar and Stef Broenink** are back in the boat and doing great. There's also the new Irish combination of **Daire Lynch and Philip Doyle** to keep an eye on and Romania is very much in the picture. Watch out too for Italy.

In Tokyo Romania's **Ancuta Bodnar and Simona Radis** raced to gold like true Olympic Champions. They got into the lead and held off every challenge winning in a Olympic Best Time. Bodnar and Radis were both just 22 years old and this can be seen as just a stepping stone in their rowing careers. Behind them **New Zealand** and **the Netherlands** took out the lesser spots.

Bodnar and Radis remained together after the Olympics and went on to win the 2022 World Rowing Championships. The Netherlands was in second and included Roos de Jong who was in the Olympic bronze crew. It looks, though, that the Netherlands are still working out their best mix between the quad and double and crew changes may happen again.

Back in the fold is **Donata Karaliene** of Lithuania. Karaliene is a three-time Olympian and has a bronze medal in the double from Rio. With new partner Dovile Rimkute, the duo finished second at World Rowing Cup III.

China can't be discounted as a medal contender and definite Olympic qualifier. **Shiyu Lu and Shuangmei Shen** finished third at World Cup III.

This is certainly the boat where trust in your partner is paramount. More so than a single, the pair is one tippy boat. Two rowers, only one oar each, every movement of each of the rower's body and oar impacts the other rower. Their movements and power output has to be completely in synch.

Leading up to the Tokyo Olympics **Valent and Martin Sinkovic** had been setting the pace in the pair. Their win at Tokyo was almost expected from the talented brothers. The Sinkovics have moved back into the double and this has in many ways really opened up the field to a clean slate.

Coming through from a silver medal at Tokyo, followed up by gold at the 2022 World Rowing Championships is **Marius Cozmiuc of Romania**. Cozmiuc raced with Ciprian Tudosa in Tokyo and then **Sergiu Bejan** at last year's champs. They have stuck together and finished second at World Cup III.

Ending at the front of the field in World Cup III was the **British duo of Oliver Wynne-Griffith and Tom George**. Wynne-Griffith and George come out of the bronze medal Olympic eight.

Very much in the mix is **Jaime Canalejo Pazos and Javier Garcia Ordenez**. Heading towards being one of Spain's most successful rowing duos, Canalejo and Garcia raced the Olympic final and since then have been either in the medals or in the final. A new combination for 2023, the Swiss has put the experienced **Roman Roeoesli with Andrin Gulich** and they have medalled at all of this season's races.

Olympic Champions New Zealand (Prendegast and Williams) stuck around long enough to win the 2022 World Rowing Championships and then retired. This left a hole at the head of the field as the 2023 season got under way. Grabbing it wholeheartedly was **Jessica Morrison and Annabelle McIntyre of Australia**. The duo had raced to gold in the four at Tokyo and doubled up in the pair only to make the b-final. It looks like this season the pair is their sole focus and it's paying off. They won both World Cup II and III and in a commanding open-water style.

Unless the Australians have peaked too soon, they are making this boat class look like a race for second. Up there in the mix is the new **Romanian combination of Roxana Anghel and Ioana Vranceanu**. They finished second at World Cup III.

The door remains wide open for the rest of the a-finalists. Going by their past strengths expect to see the **United States and Canada**. And there could also be **Spain** with the experience of Aina Cid in the boat. There may also be a **Danish crew** in the mix as they have Rio bronze medallist Hedvig Rasmussen in the boat. Watch out too for **Great Britain and Greece**.

When **the Netherlands** won at the Tokyo Olympics it was their first Olympic medal in this boat class since silver in Sydney 2000. What does this say for their chances in Paris? Dirk Uittenbogaard has retired. Abe Wiersma is sweep rowing and still on the national team. **Tone Wieten and Koen Metsemakers** are back in the quad and this season have notched up a silver at the European Championships and gold at World Rowing Cup III.

This bodes well for the Dutch, not just for qualifying for Paris but also for being medal contenders.

Finishing first at the Europeans was **Poland**. They were fourth in Tokyo and have retained two members of that crew. The Poles have a history of success in the quad. They had a winning streak that went from 2005 to 2009 and took in gold at the Beijing Olympics.

In the qualification mix will be **Great Britain**. Their silver in Tokyo was the best result of any British crew and one of just two medals at the Games. Thomas Barras is leading the charge in this boat that finished second at World Cup III.

Pushing into a boat class that is regularly dominated by European nations is **Australia**. Their qualification prospects are high along with **Italy and Romania**. **Ukraine and Germany** will be knocking on the door.

Women's quad

As the reigning Olympic and World Champions the quad is **China's** oyster and also theirs to lose. The women's quad has been China's most successful Olympic rowing event with gold at both Tokyo and Beijing. Their crew from Tokyo of **Yunxia Chen, Ling Zhang, Yang Lyu and Xiaotong Cui** has remained constant. There has, however, been a chink in their winning armor. At World Rowing Cup III the crew finished fourth with the **Netherlands, Great Britain and Switzerland** all in medal positions.

The results at World Cup III gave an indication that all is not going to be straightforward in this boat class. The Netherlands finished sixth in Tokyo with both Great Britain and Switzerland not featuring at all. If we look back at the 2022 World Champs we see that both the Netherlands and Great Britain medalled with Switzerland not far behind. China looks to have their work cut out for them.

Keep a look out for **Ukraine and Australia**. Both countries have had strong quads over the years with Australia taking bronze at the Tokyo Olympics.

THE FOUR

When you talk about classic boats to row, the four is one of them. Through most rowing careers the four will be in the mix of boats rowed for men and women. For the men it has produced some legendary boats like the Oarsome Foursome. For the women, the four came back on the Olympic programme at Tokyo and its status had noticeably improved internationally. Now the women have been back for a full Olympiad, it is like it's never been away.

An **Australian – British tussle** has been the men's final formula for the last few Olympic Games. But since the gold medal of the "new" Oarsome Foursome of Australia in Tokyo, it looks like **Great Britain has the edge**, having been crowned European and World Champions, and having won every race since the beginning of the Olympiad. This display of dominance was in full effect at the Worlds last year when, rowing with a substitute on board, the British still managed to win the gold medal.

Direct qualification seems to be promised to Great Britain and Australia. And then? The **Netherlands was on the podium** at the last World Championships and will be in contention for a medal. At World Cup III, the **Kiwis grabbed bronze**. Their new combination, containing two gold

medallists from Tokyo, may take a podium place. **The French**, now coached by Juergen Grobler, will be looking for direct qualification. They won bronze at the Europeans and have been regular a-finalists.

The last remaining spots will be a battle between United States, Romania, Ukraine, and Poland. And can Germany, with former stroke of the 'Deutschland-Achter' Hannes Ocik on board, sneak into qualification contention?

Women's Four

Last year **Great Britain was the favourite**, made bigger with the addition of two-time Olympic champion Helen Glover to the crew in 2023. This year, it seems like the gold is up for grabs. Three World Cups saw three different winners – **Chile, United States and Romania**. Australia has a powerful crew, but Olympic Champions Jessica Morrison and Annabelle McIntyre have been so dominant in the pair that seeing them doubling up with the four (as they did in Tokyo) seems unlikely.

Romania won the European Championships and World Cup III this year, so they could be 2023 favourites. Australia and Great Britain were on the podium at both World Cups II and III, and the **Americans were dominant** in winning their gold medal in Varese.

Behind these four crews, it is anyone's guess. **The Irish and the Netherlands** were both on the podium in Tokyo and have made a-finals this year, so they will have a slight advantage ahead of crews such as Denmark, New Zealand or China.

The fastest of the fleet. The blue ribband event. There is a level of romanticism that goes with the eight. It is the boat of the Oxford vs Cambridge Boat Race. It's the boat that every high school rower wants to win in. It's the boat American University rowing (crew) programmes focus on. It's the boat around rowing's most famous book 'The boys in the boat'.

In the final at the Olympics the start line will be the biggest of any rowing boat class. Forty-eight rowers and six coxswains will be sitting there ready to race. What other race starts with that number of athletes?

New Zealand was a late entry into the Tokyo Olympic Games getting a spot through the final Olympic Qualification regatta. They won and haven't boated an eight internationally since the Olympics.

Last season **Great Britain** dominated, winning every race they entered and finishing off the season by becoming World Champions. They kept their crew line-up stable and look to be on the road to continued medals. The British, however, had their winning streak broken by **Australia** at this year's World Rowing Cup III. Australia has been plugging away through the 2022 and 2023 season and their win at World Cup III shows their ever-improving boat speed.

Very much in the mix this season and right on the pace has been **the Netherlands and Romania**. The Dutch have strong eights traditions and although rather up-and-down in their results they have pulled off some extraordinary wins in the past. Romania looks to be building in strength and experience and are serious medal contenders.

The big question is **Germany**. The men's eight has been their flagship crew, but since the Tokyo Olympics they have not found a winning line-up. At last year's World Championships they were out of the a-final. At World Cup III they finished in fifth.

Women's eight

When **Canada** won at the Tokyo Olympics they weren't seen as favourites, especially as they came through to the final from the repechage. But Canada has always been strong in eights which relies on the country having a large rowing base.

Canada remained in the medals through the 2022 season and their second-place finish at World Rowing Cup III this season shows they're on track for a potential top placing at the World Championships. Last year's World Champions, **Romania** have been playing with their line-up and finished fourth at World Cup III.

Great Britain's women keep on improving. They won World Cup III setting themselves up for a great showing at the World Championships.

This field does not have huge depth at present opening up the opportunity for a new country to step up and gain Olympic qualification. Olympic silver medallists New Zealand haven't boated since Tokyo while the **United States** is yet to appear this season. They did, however, finish fourth at last year's World Championships and always have the potential to put a good boat together.

Keep an eye out for the **Netherlands and Australia**. They regularly pull an eight together and often with good results.

The rowers in the lightweight double sculls have an added element of complexity - before any race the crew has to get themselves weighed and must weigh in under a specified amount. For women, the crew average must be 57kg or less and for the men 70kg or less. With all crews being so similar in weight, the competition is heightened and leads to very tight race finishes.

In Tokyo, the duo of **Fintan McCarthy and Paul O'Donovan** won the first-ever Olympic gold medal for Ireland in rowing. The golden combination won again at last year's World Champs and while O'Donovan took some time off rowing to focus on his medical studies this year, they only needed

one regatta this season to show that they are still one of the most dominant crews in the sport. They finished just 0.9 seconds out of another gold medal at World Cup III.

Behind the Irish two crews are on the rise. **Raphael Ahumada Ireland and Jan Schaeuble** of Switzerland had a fantastic start to the season, winning the first two World Cups and the European championship title. But at World Cup III France's **Hugo Beurey and Ferdinand Ludwig** beat both the Swiss and the Irish.

That leaves four spots for direct Olympic qualification at this year's World Championships. Italy should be in the mix, with Olympic medallist **Stefano Oppo** now teamed up with **Gabriel Soares**. **Norway, Greece and Spain** have been sneaking in a-finals this season and don't count out **Mexico**, who had an eye-opening performance at World Cup III.

The Tokyo Olympic final was undoubtedly one of the best races we've ever seen. Five boats sprinted to the line and Great Britain missing out on an Olympic medal by 0.1 seconds. How do you recover from that? **Emily Craig and Imogen Grant** have come back with a vengeance. They've won every international race they competed in since then and set a new World Best Time in the process.

But in lightweight rowing, anything can happen and this year Craig and Grant were almost beaten by the US duo of **Molly Reckford** and Michelle Sechser at World Cup II. Both crews will be fighting for the gold medal at the World Champs (although Sechser with new partner **Mary Jones Nabel**).

The French combination of **Laura Tarantola and Claire Bove**, silver medallists in Tokyo, have been in and out of podium places this season and should also easily be in the top seven at the Worlds.

The very experienced **Ionela Cozmiuc**, and the newcomer **Mariana-Laura Dumitru** of Romania finished right behind the Brits and the young Greek duo of **Dimitra Eleni Kontou and Zoi Fitsou** were also very impressive at World Cup III. The return of former World Champion **Jackie Kiddle** of New Zealand with new partner **Shannon Cox**, was noticeable at World Cup III and don't overlook **Ireland and Canada** with experience combinations.

Keep an eye on Olympic Champions **Federica Cesarini and Valentina Rodini** of Italy. They have had a rough ride lately but may get back on form.

The magic British duo of **Lauren Rowles and Laurence Whiteley** will be seen as one of the **winningest** combinations ever in para rowing, with two Paralympic titles in 2016 and 2021. Whiteley has now retired and Rowles and her new partner, **Gregg Stevenson**, will look to continue the domination of Great Britain. Rowles and Stevenson are off to a great start. They won the Europeans and World Cup II this year.

Behind GB a lot of crews are in contention for the a-final which will equal a direct ticket for Paris next year. In the absence of Great Britain, **Ukraine, Poland and France** were on the podium at the 2022 World Champs. China and the Netherlands medalled in Tokyo and Dutch sculler **Corne de Koning**, a two-time World Champion, will look to qualify for his third straight Paralympic Games. Crews from **Ireland and Uzbekistan** might also sneak into the a-final.

Paris will see the debut of this as a new Paralympic boat class. It provided great racing at the 2022 World Rowing Championships and has all the ingredients for a very successful introduction to the Paralympic Games.

Based on results from the last World Championships we may see **France** winning gold in 2024. The duo of **Laurent Cadot and Elur Alberdi** was crowned World Champion last year and then in the absence of an injured Alberdi, Cadot and new teammate Guylaine Marchand, won the European title in Bled.

The other dominant crew this year was **Australia**. **Jed Altschwager and Nikki Ayers** set a new World Best Time at World Cup II. Behind France and Australia should be Brazil and Ukraine who have both medalled internationally.

Israel, United States and Austria were in the a-final at last year's World Champs and should have a shot at Paralympic Qualification along with Italy.

The gold medal will be down to anyone that can stop the unbelievable winning streak from **Great Britain** – they **haven't lost** a race since 2010. The reigning three-time Paralympic Champions are now going for four in Paris.

This year, the magical British combination saw the return of coxswain **Erin Kennedy**. She had to pull out just four days before their final at the 2022 World Rowing Cup I when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. Kennedy is back holding the reins in 2023.

Behind the British a few crews have been in and out of the podium. **Germany and France** have shared medal honours. **Italy** was in the a-final in Tokyo and will be looking to secure a qualification spot. **Australia and United States** made the World Champs a-final in 2022, but we haven't seen them race at a World Rowing event this year.

When **Birgit Skarstein** of Norway finished fourth at the Rio Paralympic Games it was the end of an era. She accepted her position and must have said "never again". Since that regatta Skarstein has had an unbroken winning streak taking in all of the ensuing World Championships and the Tokyo Paralympic Games where her winning margin was awe-inspiring. Skarstein is a true ambassador for para sport having also competed at the winter Paralympic Games and contested Norway's Dancing with the Stars.

This track record puts Skarstein at the head of the field, but Skarstein does not have it all her own way. Israel's **Moran Samuel** is a para rowing stalwart and at World Rowing Cup II she finished just four seconds down on Skarstein. Also in the mix is **Nathalie Benoit** of France who has the talent and the longevity in the sport.

Depth in this field includes Ukraine's **Anna Sheremet** who is still relatively young and remains a future talent. Keep an eye out too for **Manuela Diening** of Germany who continues to show promise.

The Ukrainian sculler, **Roman Polianskyi** has produced fabulous results despite the many challenges he has faced. He was diagnosed at ten years old with hereditary spastic paraplegia. He then lost his father when he was 18 and his mother not long after. He became an internally displaced person (refugee in his own country) and that was all before the Ukraine war with Russia even began.

Para rowing seems to have been Polianskyi's outlet. He won the Rio Paralympic Games just two years after taking up the sport. He took a while to adjust to the 2000m distance and once he did, the medals kept coming. Polianskyi won his second Paralympic title at the Tokyo Games and most recently he won World Rowing Cup II. But Polianskyi has also taken losses. At this year's European Rowing Championships, the Ukrainian finished second to the young **Giacomo Perini** of Italy.

Also in the men's mix is **Egamberdiev Kholmurod** of Uzbekistan who looks to be heading for the medals podium and **Marcus Klemp** of Germany. We haven't seen much of Australia's **Erik Horrie**. He is a regular medallist but hasn't raced internationally yet this season. And there's Great Britain's **Benjamin Pritchard** who also hasn't yet been seen this season but always makes his mark when he races.
