The Continental Qualification Regattas are open only to those NOCs that have not participated, not qualified in any events, or qualified in only one (1) event at the 2023 World Rowing Championships.

There will be four (4) Continental Qualification Regattas:

1. Asia/Oceania: Open to NOCs that are members of the Olympic Council of Asia and the Oceania National Olympic Committees;
2. Africa: Open to NOCs that are members of the Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa;
3. Americas: Open to NOCs that are members of Organización Deportiva Panamericana;
4. Europe: Open to NOCs that are members of the European Olympic Committees.

There will be four (4) events at each Continental Qualification Regatta as listed in the table below.

 - Where an NOC has two (2) or more boats placed with equal ranking at the Continental Qualification Regatta, the NOC may select a maximum of two (2) boats to qualify for the Games.
- **For NOCs having qualified one (1) boat at the 2023 World Rowing Championships:**
 - An NOC may qualify a maximum of one (1) boat through the Continental Qualification Regatta;
 - Except in the case where two (2) or more boats placed first in events at the Continental Qualification Regatta, the NOC shall select the two (2) boats to qualify for the Games.
 - In the case that two or more boats have an equal ranking other than first place, the NOC shall select one of these boats to qualify for the Games.

D.2. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Should the host country not have achieved a man's or a woman's quota place at the various qualification events, it is guaranteed one (1) quota place for men's single sculls and one (1) for women's single sculls.

If not used, these places will be reallocated in accordance with the paragraph **F.1. Reallocation of unused host country places** below.

D.3. UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Four (4) Universality places, two (2) per gender, are made available to eligible NOCs at the Olympic Games Paris 2024: two (2) men's singles (M1x) and two (2) women's singles (W1x).

On 1 October 2023, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Universality Places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2024. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of Universality Places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the sport concerned.



Athlete Lane Selection – Procedure (TEAMS)

1. BEFORE THE DRAW

- At Registration, each Team Manager to confirm to WR the Designated Person (DP) for ALS for each crew.
- Deadline for confirmation is 3hrs before Draw (12:00hrs) – same as for Crew Changes.

2. HEATS – Random Draw (Swiss Timing)

- Results from the heats will be confirmed and published.
- Based on the results of the heats, crews are progressed into their respective next round race (repechage, quarter final, semi final).
- Crews are not assigned a lane.

3. SUBSEQUENT ROUNDS (after Heats) - Athlete Lane Selection

- For the ALS (next round of racing), the highest ranked crew from the previous round would be allowed to select their lane first. The second ranked crew from the previous round would be allowed to select their lane second, and so on...
- Where there is equal ranking from the previous round, the fastest timed crew will be allowed to select their lane first.
- **Timing is Critical!** If a DP (or TM) does not attend Control Commission at the allocated time for ALS, the selection process will move on to the next crew. The missing crew will be allocated the last available lane, or if two or more crews do not attend ALS – a random allocation of lanes would be done by Swiss Timing.
