## 1. 2025 Ordinary Congress

The World Rowing Ordinary Congress was held on Monday, 29 September 2025, in Shanghai, China, in a hybrid format with 58 Member Federations participating either in person or online.

### **Elections**

Annamarie Phelps of Great Britain was elected as Vice-President for a four-year mandate, succeeding long-serving Tricia Smith, who has been awarded the title of Honorary Council Member, in recognition of her contributions.

Gerritjan Eggenkamp from the Netherlands will continue in his role as Treasurer.

Delegates also voted for the three Council member positions on the Executive Committee in accordance with Article 47. Lenka Dienstbach-Wech from Germany, Eva Szanto from Hungary, and Mathias Binder from Switzerland were recommended by Council and elected for a four-year term.

Mandates will start on 1st January 2026 until 31st December 2029.

Dr Michael Wilkinson of Canada was elected Chair of the World Rowing's Sports Medicine Commission, to complete the mandate of Dr Juergen Steinacker of Germany, who will step down at the end of 2025, having reached the statutory age limit. Mandate will start on 1<sup>st</sup> January until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2027.

#### **Events**

Delegates approved the Council recommendation to stage the 2028 World Rowing Senior, U23 & U19 Championships in Sarasota, United States.

The Congress was presented with updates about the 2025 World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals in Antalya, Türkiye; the 2026 World Rowing Championships in Amsterdam, the Netherlands; the 2026 Youth Olympic Games in Dakar, Senegal; the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games, and the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

#### Governance

Following the decision made at the Quadrennial Congress to grant authority to the 2025 Ordinary Congress to amend Article 47 of the Statutes based on the proposal received by AUS, CAN, NZL and USA, the Council's proposal to enhance geographical diversity at the Executive Committee level was circulated with the Agenda Papers ahead of Congress. The amendment to Article 47, as proposed by Council, was approved by Member Federations with a two-thirds majority, with immediate effect.

The delegates also decided to follow the Executive Committee's recommendation to expel the Bahamas Rowing Federation due to non-compliance with the World Rowing Statutes. World Rowing currently recognises 158 MFs.

### Strategic projects

The afternoon session was dedicated to updates from the different Council members regarding several ongoing strategic projects, including the Strategic Event & Calendar Review and the Teams / Athletes Ranking system, the Shanghai legacy initiatives, the Confederations Collaboration project, and the Healthy Waters Alliance, amongst others.

Following on the success of that ceremony, the 2025 World Rowing Awards will again be staged live, in the Olympic Capital of Lausanne, Switzerland.

The 2025 World Rowing Awards ceremony, set to be held on Saturday, 24 January 2026, will see eight awards be presented. Nominations are now open for all eight awards: Men's Crew of the Year, Women's Crew of the Year, Para Crew of the Year, Coach of the Year, Distinguished Services to International Rowing Award, Thomas Keller Medal, Artistic Contribution to Rowing, Rowing Programme of the Year.
